Feb and May minutes:

Judge Allphin moved to approve the minutes and Alison Satterlee seconded the motion.

Roundtable updates:

- We have seen some OCAP anomalies
- MyCase appears to be growing in popularity and consuming more time for staff at the Law Library
- MyPaperwork (which will eventually replace OCAP) is expected to launch this summer for petitioners in divorce cases and is a major push for the Self-Help Center and the Law Library
- The OFA is with outreach efforts
- The Community Voice in the Courts project is close to wrapping up with the work of reviewing the proposal and formalizing a rule for the Council
- The Access to Justice Summit will be Friday, 10/4/24
 - o It will focus on avoiding burnout and trauma-informed care
- Utah Legal Services is expected to hire a coordinator to help with outreach to help defendants on Judge Parker's immediate occupancy calendar to provide brief advice and connection to social services such as rental assistance and housing
- The appellate pro bono project is up and running but it's unclear how widely used it is
- TLC is busy and hoping to recruit volunteers to help with their document clinic

Update from Legal Deserts Conference:

- The National Center for State Courts hosted a conference on legal deserts for western states
- Legal deserts are areas where there is a deficiency of lawyers (there should bee about 1 lawyer for every 1,000 people) and there is a lack of access to other legal help (such as a lack of internet access)
- Representation in debt collection cases has shown to provide better outcomes the pro se calendar is successful in this regard
- Other states provide financial incentives for lawyers to practice remotely
- GIS data can be used to help understand where legal deserts are and the unique challenges of that community
- \rightarrow would it make sense to hire lawyers to staff some calendars and help out remotely?
- \rightarrow starting at high school and elementary school levels to help young people see pathways to becoming a lawyer could be helpful
 - o There may be a fear of attorneys because of financial concerns and other issues

Update re: SRLN Conference

- Results from session proposals should be out
 - o Reminder the conference will be on 9/19 and 9/20
 - It will be a chance to learn about what other states are doing in this area

Discussion of what kinds of voices we would like to hear from as a committee

• Every month or so we should hear from people in the community who are not lawyers about the legal needs they see their communities facing

• This might happen where one person comes to share their perspective at each meeting

Thinking about scheduling another session about the focus of the committee

- We would like to have Nini Rich come back to present in the early fall for another facilitated discussion
- We should free ourselves to talk about what is and isn't working and ask whether we have made any meaningful change in the past several years
- The group is generally open to having that meeting in-person
