1 Rule 14-402. Definitions.

2 As used in this article:

(a) "<u>aActive</u> emeritus" or "active emeritus lawyer" means a lawyer who has been a
member of the Bar for 50 years or who is 75 years of age as of July 1 of the current
year and who qualifies for active emeritus status as defined under the Bar's rules,
regulations and policies;

(b) "<u>aActive</u> status" or "active status lawyer" means a lawyer who has elected to be
on active status as defined under the Bar's rules, regulations and policies; <u>state judges;</u>
<u>federal judges and magistrates;</u>, court commissioners, active senior judges and active
justice court judges, both full and part time, meet CLE requirements through the
Administrative office of the Courts.

(c) "<u>aA</u>dmission on motion applicant or lawyer" means a lawyer who has applied for
 reciprocal admission as defined under Rule 14-705 or has been admitted as such;

(d) "aApproved law school" means an ABA approved law school as defined under
Rule 14-701;

16 (e) "Bar" means the Utah State Bar;

17 (f) "Bar Examination" means the Bar Examination as defined in Rules 14-710 and

18 <u>14-711 and includes the UBE, regardless of where the UBE was taken;</u>

(f)(g) "Board" means the Utah State Board of Mandatory Continuing Legal Education
as set forth in Rule 14-403;

- 21 (g)(h) "Board of Bar Commissioners" means the governing board of the Bar;
- (h)(i) "<u>eC</u>ertificate of eCompliance" means a written report evidencing a lawyer's
 completion of accredited CLE as required and defined under Rule 14-414;
- 24 (i)(j) "CLE" means continuing legal education;
- 25 (j)(1) "Live CLE" means a CLE program presented in a classroom setting where the
- 26 lawyer is in the same room as the presenter.
- 27 (j)(2) "Live Attendance" means in person attendance at a Utah state courthouse
- 28 where a course is streamed by live audio-visual communication from another Utah state
- 29 courthouse or from the Law and Justice Center;
- 30 (i)(3) "Self-Study CLE Program" means a program presented in a suitable setting
- 31 where the lawyer can view approved self-study activities;
- 32 (k)"Comity Certificate" is a Certificate that is filed to show MCLE compliance with a
 33 reciprocal jurisdiction;
- 34 (I) "Compliance Cycle"- means the period of 2 years beginning July 1 through June
 35 <u>30;</u>
- (m) "Ethics" means standards set by the Utah Rules of Professional Conduct with
 which a lawyer must comply to remain authorized to practice law in Utah and remain in
 good standing;
- 39 (j)(n) "f<u>F</u>ull exam" means all components of the Bar Examination as defined under
 40 Rule 14-710;

41	(o) "House Counsel" means a lawyer admitted with a restricted House Counsel
42	license as defined in Rule 14-719, which is required and limits his or her practice of law
43	to the business of his or her employer;
44	(k)(p) "ilnactive status" or "inactive status lawyer" means a lawyer who has elected
45	to be on inactive status as defined under the Bar's rules, regulations and policies;
46 47	(I)(q) "MCLE" means mandatory continuing legal education as defined under this article;
48	(r) "Multi-State Compliance Reciprocity" means Utah has established that MCLE
49	compliance in certain states (Idaho, Oregon, Washington) may be used as MCLE
50	compliance in Utah by an active lawyer whose principal practice is in one of the
51	established reciprocal states;
52	(m)(s)"nNew admittee" means a lawyer newly admitted to the Utah State Bar;
53	(n)(t) "NLTP" means the New Lawyer Training Program as set forth in Rule 14-404
54	and Rule 14-808;
55	(o)(u) "pPresumptively approved sponsor" means those CLE sponsors or providers
56	who qualify under the standards set forth in Rule 14-412;
57	(p)(v) "pPresumptive CLE accreditation" means those CLE courses or activities that
58	qualify under the standards set forth in Rule 14-412;
59	(w)"Professionalism and Civility" means conduct consistent with the tenets of the
60	legal profession by which a lawyer demonstrates civility, honesty, integrity, character,

- 61 fariness, competence, ethical conduct, public service, and respect for the rules of law,
- 62 the courts, clients, other lawyers, witnesses and unrepresented parties;
- 63 (q)(x) "OPC" means the Bar's Office of Professional Conduct;
- 64 (r)(y) "OPC ethics school" means the OPC <u>biannual seminar on the Utah Rules of</u>
- 65 Professional Conduct which provides six CLE or NLCLE credit hours; and
- 66 (s)(z) "Supreme Court" means the Utah Supreme Court-; and
- 67 (aa) <u>"UBE Transfers" means applicants who gain admission by transferring a</u>
- 68 <u>uniform bar exam score.</u>
