- 2 (a) **Timeliness of petition**. A petition for a writ of certiorari must be filed with the Clerk
- 3 of the Supreme Court clerk within 30 days after the entry of the final decision by the
- 4 Court of Appeals' final decision is issued, and not from the date the remittitur is issued.
- 5 The docket fee shallmust be paid when at the time of filing the petition is filed.
- 6 (b) Refusal Rejection of petition. The clerk will refuse reject to receive any petition for
