## 1 Rule 14-912. Processing claims.

- 2 (a) Whenever it appears that a claim is not eligible for reimbursement pursuant to these
- rules, the claimant shall must be advised of the reasons why the claim may not be
- 4 eligible for reimbursement, and that unless additional facts to support eligibility are
- submitted to the Committee, the claim file shall will be closed. The chairperson of the
- 6 Fund chair may appoint themselves or any member of the Committee member and/or
- 7 his/herself to determine the eligibility of claims.
- 8 (b) A certified copy of an order disciplining a lawyer for the same dishonest act or
- 9 conduct alleged in the claim, or a final judgment imposing civil or criminal
- 10 liability therefor, shall beis evidence that a lawyer committed such dishonest act or
- 11 conduct.
- 12 (c) The Bar's Office of Professional Conduct Senior Counsel shall must be promptly
- 13 notified of each and every claim.
- 14 (d) The lawyer alleged to have engaged in dishonest conduct shall <u>must</u> be provided a
- copy of the claim and given an opportunity to respond to the Committee in writing
- within 201 days of the receipt thereof to the Committee receiving the claim.
- 17 (e) The Committee may request that testimony be presented. <u>If desired, <del>T</del>t</u>he lawyer or
- 18 lawyer's representative shall must request be given an opportunity to be heard if they
- 19  $\frac{1}{20}$  so request within  $\frac{201}{20}$  days of receiving a notice from the Committee
- 20 will process the claim.
- 21 (f) The Committee may make a finding of dishonest conduct for purposes of
- adjudicating a claim. Such a determination is not a finding of dishonest conduct for the
- purposes of professional discipline and further, represents only a recommendation to
- the Board. A claim may only be considered if the individual lawyer involved has been
- 25 disciplined to a threshold level of a public reprimand or is no longer in practice.
- 26 (g) The claim shall will be determined on the basis of all available evidence, and notice
- 27 <u>shall must</u> be given to the claimant and the lawyer of the final decision by the Board

- after a recommendation has been made by the Committee. The recommendation for
- 29 approval or denial of approving or denying a claim shall requires the affirmative votes
- of at least a majority of the Committee members and a quorum of the voting members
- 31 of the Board members.
- 32 (h) Any proceeding upon a claim shall will not be conducted according to technical
- rules relating to evidence, procedure, and witnesses. Any relevant evidence shall-must
- be admitted if it is the sort of evidence on which responsible persons are accustomed to
- rely on in the conduct of serious affairs, regardless of the existence of any common law
- or statutory rule which that mayight make improper the admission of such evidence
- over objection in court proceedings. The claimant shall have has the duty to supply
- 38 relevant evidence to support the claim.
- 39 (i) The Board shall must determine the order and manner of payment and pay those
- 40 claims it deems meritorious. Ubut unless the Board directs otherwise, no claim should
- 41 will be approved during the pendency of a pending disciplinary proceeding involving
- 42 the same act or conduct as alleged in the claim; specifically, nNo determination and/or
- 43 hearing shall will take place until such time that all disciplinary proceedings have, in
- 44 <u>fact, been completed</u> <u>are complete</u>.
- 45 (j) The Board must advise Both the claimant and the lawyer shall be advised of the
- status of the Board's consideration of the claim and after having received the
- 47 recommendation of the Committee, must also shall be informed of the final
- 48 determination.
- 49 (k) The claimant may request reconsideration within 30-28 days of the denial or
- 50 determination of the amount of the claim.
