## 1 Rule 11-510. Ethics and Discipline Committee composition.

(a) **Composition**. The Supreme Court appoints the Ce-Committee members. The 2 CcCommittee consists of a minimum of four to a maximum of eight public members and 3 a minimum of 21 to a maximum of 25 LH awyers who have demonstrated a high standard 4 of professional conduct. All appointments are for a term of three years with no 5 6 CeCommittee member serving more than two consecutive terms unless appointed as a 7 chair or vice--chair of the CeCommittee. The Supreme Court designates one Lawyer member as Committee chair and three to four LH awyer members as CeCommittee vice-8 9 chairs.

(b) Committee chair. <u>The Supreme Court will appoint a lawyer licensed to practice in</u>
<u>Utah to serve as the chair. The chair may not engage in the private practice of law for</u>
payment. The chair is an employee of the Bar and subject to its personnel policies. The
<u>Committee chair serves at the pleasure of the Supreme Court and has the following</u>
<u>responsibilities: supervises the Committee and screening panels. The chair is responsible</u>
for:

## 16 (1) <u>supervise the committee;</u>

- 17 (2) (1) \_maintaining \_an adequate checks on the screening panels' work to ensure that
   18 matters move forward expeditiously;
- (3) (2) <u>ensure determining</u> that screening panels have a uniform basis for the
   judgments rendered;
- (<u>4</u>) (<u>3</u>) provideing the screening panels with information concerning ethics and
   judicial decisions necessary to their activities; and

- 23 (5) (4)-makeing recommendations to the Supreme Court concerning appointments to 24 and removals from the screening panels and reports concerning screening panel 25 activities and the overall work of the  $\underline{c}$ -committee.
- (c) Vice\_chairs. The ccommittee vice\_chairs will act as chair temporarily act if the chair
  is absent or resigns. In such event, a vice chair will become the chair. The chair may call
  upon any vice chair to assist in any of the ccommittee chair's duties.
- (d) Removal. The <u>c</u>-committee chair may recommend removal of a <u>c</u>-committee member
  by notifying the Supreme Court of the recommendation of removal and reasons for the
  recommendation. The removal is effective when the Supreme Court accepts the
  recommendation.
