

1 **Rule 11-510. Ethics and Discipline Committee composition.**

2 (a) **Composition.** The Supreme Court appoints the ~~Ce~~Committee members. The
3 ~~Ce~~Committee consists of a minimum of four to a maximum of eight public members and
4 a minimum of 21 to a maximum of 25 ~~LH~~Lawyers who have demonstrated a high standard
5 of professional conduct. All appointments are for a term of three years with no
6 ~~Ce~~Committee member serving more than two consecutive terms unless appointed as a
7 chair or vice-chair of the ~~Ce~~Committee. The Supreme Court designates ~~one Lawyer~~
8 ~~member as Committee chair and~~ three to four ~~LH~~Lawyer members as ~~Ce~~Committee vice-
9 chairs.

10 (b) **Committee chair.** The Supreme Court will appoint a lawyer licensed to practice in
11 Utah to serve as the chair. The chair may not engage in the private practice of law for
12 payment. The chair is an employee of the Bar and subject to its personnel policies. The
13 Committee chair serves at the pleasure of the Supreme Court and has the following
14 responsibilities: supervises the Committee and screening panels. The chair is responsible
15 for:

16 (1) supervise the committee;

17 (2) (1) maintaining an adequate checks on the screening panels' work to ensure that
18 matters move forward expeditiously;

19 (3) (2) ensure determining that screening panels have a uniform basis for the
20 judgments rendered;

21 (4) (3) providing the screening panels with information concerning ethics and
22 judicial decisions necessary to their activities; and

23 ~~(5) (4)~~ ~~makeing~~ recommendations to the Supreme Court concerning appointments to
24 and removals from the screening panels and reports concerning screening panel
25 activities and the overall work of the cCommittee.

26 (c) ~~Vice-chairs~~. The cCommittee vice-chairs will act as chair temporarily ~~act~~ if the chair
27 is absent or resigns. ~~In such event, a vice chair will become the chair.~~ The chair may call
28 upon any vice chair to assist in any of the cCommittee chair's duties.

29 (d) **Removal**. The cCommittee chair may recommend removal of a cCommittee member
30 by notifying the Supreme Court of the recommendation of removal and reasons for the
31 recommendation. The removal is effective when the Supreme Court accepts the
32 recommendation.
