## 1 Rule 1.1. Competence.

2	A licensed paralegal practitioner shall provide competent representation to a client.
3	Competent representation requires the legal knowledge, skill, thoroughness and
4	preparation reasonably necessary to a) perform the contracted services; and b) determine when
5	the matter should be referred to an attorney.

8	
9	Legal Knowledge and Skill
10	
11	[1] In determining whether a licensed paralegal practitioner employs the requisite knowledge
12	and skill in a particular matter, relevant factors include the relative complexity and specialized
13	nature of the matter, the licensed paralegal practitioner's general experience, the licensed
14	paralegal practitioner's training and experience in the field in question, and whether it is
15	appropriate to refer the matter to, or associate with, a lawyer of established competence in the
16	field in question.
17	
18	[2] A newly admitted licensed paralegal practitioner can be as competent as a practitioner
19	with long experience. Perhaps the most fundamental legal skill consists of determining what kind
20	of legal problems a situation may involve, a skill that necessarily transcends any particular
21	specialized knowledge.
22	
23	[3] Reserved.
24	
25	[4] A licensed paralegal practitioner may accept representation in only the fields in which the
26	licensed paralegal practitioner is licensed.
27	
28	Thoroughness and Preparation
29	
30	[5] Competent handling of a particular matter includes inquiry into and analysis of the factual
31	and legal elements of the problem and use of methods and procedures meeting the standards of

continuing education requirements to which the licensed paralegal practitioner is subject.
