- 9 [1] Many forms of improper influence upon a tribunal are proscribed by criminal law. Others are
- specified in the Utah Code of Judicial Conduct, with which an advocate should be familiar. A
- 11 <u>licensed paralegal practitioner is required to avoid contributing to a violation of such provisions.</u>
- 12 [2] During a proceeding a licensed paralegal practitioner may not communicate ex parte with
- persons serving in an official capacity in the proceeding, such as judges unless authorized to do
- so by law, rule or court order.
