## 1 Rule 44. Transfer of improperly pursued appeals.

2 If a notice of appeal, a petition for permission to appeal from an interlocutory order, or a petition

- 3 for review is filed in a timely manner but is pursued in an appellate court that does not have
- 4 jurisdiction in the case, the appellate court, either on its own motion or on motion of any party,
- 5 shall will transfer the case, including the record on appeal, all motions and other orders, and a
- 6 copy of the docket entries, to the court with appellate jurisdiction in the case. The clerk of the
- 7 transferring court shall will give notice to all parties and to the clerk of the trial court of the order
- 8 transferring the case. The time for filing all papers in a transferred case shall will be calculated
- 9 according to the time schedule of the receiving court.

## 10 Advisory Committee Note

- 11 Rule 44 permits the transfer of an appeal that is timely but improperly filed between the Supreme
- 12 Court and the Court of Appeals. It also permits the transfer of improperly filed petitions for
- 13 review of informal adjudicative proceedings of administrative agencies from an appellate court
- 14 to a district court that has jurisdiction to review those proceedings.
