1	Rule 14-416. Lawyers on active status not practicing law in Utah; Paralegal
2	Practitioners on active status outside of Utah; Lawyers or paralegal practitioners
3	on active status engaged in full-time volunteer work in remote locations.
4	(a) A lawyer on active status who is not engaged in the practice of law in Utah, or a
5	paralegal practitioner on active status who is not engaged in practice in Utah, may[,] file
6	and attach to [his or her] the lawyer's or paralegal practitioner's Utah Certificate of
7	Compliance evidence showing that the lawyer or paralegal practitioner has met the Utah
8	MCLE requirements in Rule 14-404 with CLE courses accredited in the state in which
9	the lawyer or paralegal practitioner resides and practices. This may include CLE
10	transcripts, certificates of compliance, certificates of attendance, or other information
11	indicating the identity of the accrediting jurisdiction.
12	(a)(1)The lawyer or paralegal practitioner must attach to [his or her] the lawyer's or
13	paralegal practitioner's Utah Certificate of Compliance a copy of the [member's
14	Certificate of Compliance with the MCLE requirements from that jurisdiction] lawyer's or
15	paralegal practitioner's CLE transcript from the reciprocal jurisdiction where the lawyer
16	or paralegal practitioner practices, together with evidence that the [member] lawyer or
17	paralegal practitioner has completed a minimum of [three hours of accredited ethics or
18	professional responsibility. One of the three hours of ethics or professional responsibility
19	must be in the area of professionalism and civility.] one hour of Ethics CLE and one
20	hour of Professionalism and Civility CLE.
21	(a)(2) If the lawyer or paralegal practitioner lives in a jurisdiction where there is not a

22 CLE requirement, the lawyer or <u>paralegal practitioner</u> must comply with the Utah CLE

- requirements or place [his or her] the lawyer's or paralegal practitioner's license on
 inactive status.
- (b) Upon application by a lawyer <u>or paralegal practitioner</u> on active status, the Board
- 26 may grant a waiver of the MCLE requirements of Rule 14-404 and issue a certificate of
- 27 exemption if the lawyer or paralegal practitioner:
- (b)(1) resides in a remote location outside of Utah where audio or video presentations or
- 29 computer interactive telephonic programs sufficient to allow the lawyer or paralegal
- 30 <u>practitioner</u> to participate in CLE credit hours are not reasonably available to the lawyer
- 31 or paralegal practitioner; and
- 32 (b)(2) is engaged in full-time volunteer work for a religious or charitable organization.
