- 1 Rule 14-419. CLE Credit for Pro Bono Legal Services.
- 2 (a) CLE credit for Pro Bono Legal Sservices. A lawyer may be awarded a maximum of
- 3 two CLE credits per Compliance Cycle for providing Pro Bono Legal Services or
- 4 mentoring another lawyer or a law student providing Pro Bono Legal Services.
- 5 (b) **Pro Bono referral source**. To receive Pro Bono Legal Services CLE credit under this
- 6 rule, the services rendered must be referred from a Utah court, the Utah State Bar, or a
- 7 sponsoring entity. The Pro Bono referral must remain under the direction of the Utah
- 8 <u>court, the Utah State bar, or the sponsoring entity that provided the referral.</u>
- 9 (c) Permissible CLE credit. One Elective CLE credit hour will be awarded for the
- 10 <u>following:</u>
- 11 (1) providing the equivalent of five hours of Pro Bono Legal Services; or
- 12 (2) mentoring a lawyer or a law student on an entire Pro Bono matter that is equal
- to at least five hours.
- 14 (d) **Declaration of services form.** A lawyer seeking CLE credit under this section must,
- consistent with Rule 14-414(c), complete a declaration of services form to keep with the
- lawyer's records. Earned credit hours must be reported on an attorney's Certificate of
- 17 Compliance.
- 18 (e) **Time limited rule.** This rule will terminate two years after its effective date unless
- 19 extended by the Utah Supreme Court.
