## 1 Rule 3-306.03. Interpreter credentialing.

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- 3 Intent:

4 To outline the procedure for credentialing of <u>contract</u> interpreters for legal proceedings.

## 5 Applicability:

- 6 This rule shall apply to legal proceedings in the courts of record and not of record. This rule 7 shall apply to interpretation for non-English speaking people and not to interpretation for
- 8 persons with a hearing impairment, which is governed by Utah and federal statutes.

## 9 Statement of the Rule:

- 10 (1) <u>Certification programs.</u> Subject to the availability of funding, and in consultation with the 11 committee, the <u>Aadministrative Oeffice</u><u>of the courts</u> shall establish programs to certify and 12 approve interpreters in English and the non-English languages most frequently needed in the 13 courts.
- 14 (2) Statewide roster. The <u>Aadministrative</u> <u>Oeffice</u> shall publish a roster of certified, approved,

15 and registered <u>contract</u> interpreters-<u>authorized to provide interpreting services for the judiciary</u>.

16 Addition to or removal from the roster is within the sole discretion of the Administrative Office.

- 17 Interpreters may be removed from the roster at any time, with or without cause.
- (3) Applications. To be considered for addition to the court rostercertified, approved or
  registered, an applicant shall:
- 20 (<u>3</u>4)(A) file an application form approved by the administrative office;
- 21 (<u>3</u>4)(B) pay a fee established by the Judicial Council;
- 22 (<u>3</u>4)(C) pass a background check;
- 23 (<u>3</u>4)(D) provide proof that the applicant is a Utah resident;
- 24 (<u>3</u>4)(E) complete training as required by the administrative office;
- (<u>3</u>4)(F) obtain a passing score on the court interpreter's test(s) as required by the
  administrative office;
- 27 (<u>3</u>4)(G) complete 10 hours observing a certified interpreter in a legal proceeding; and
- (1)(H) take and subscribe the following oath or affirmation: "I will make a true and
  impartial interpretation using my best skills and judgment in accordance with the Code of
  Professional Responsibility."
- (42) Federal or out-of-state credentials. A person who is certified in good standing by the
  federal courts or by a state having a certification program that is equivalent to the program
  established under this rule may apply to be a certified contract interpreter without complying
- with paragraphs  $(\underline{34})(\underline{BA})$  through  $(\underline{34})(H)$ , with the exception of paragraph  $(\underline{34})(C)$ , but shall
- pass an ethics examination and otherwise meet the requirements of this rule.
- 36 (<u>5</u>3) **Reporting obligation.** A person credentialed under this rule has an ongoing obligation to
- 37 immediately report to the program coordinator any criminal charges or convictions the
- 38 interpreter has and any Utah State Court cases the interpreter is personally involved in as a
- 39 party.

40 (<u>64</u>) <u>Rare language exemption.</u> When the interpreter speaks a rare language and the courts

- 41 currently lack credentialed interpreters in that language, the Language Access Committee
- 42 <u>Program Manager ("Program Manager")</u> may, for good cause shown, exempt an interpreter
- from meeting one or both of the requirements listed in subparagraph  $(\underline{34})(B)$  and  $(\underline{34})(F)$ . An interpreter seeking an exemption shall make a written request, outlining the reasons for the
- 44 exemption, to the Language Access Program ManagerCoordinator. The Language Access
- 46 Committee shall consider the request at its next meeting following the request, and may require
- 47 the interpreter making the request to appear at the meeting or to provide more information. (5) If
- 48 an exemption is granted, the interpreter shall meet the conditions set by the committee Program
- 49 <u>Manager</u> and shall apply for an extension of the exemption annually, or as otherwise required
- 50 by the committee Program Manager.
- 51 (<u>7</u>6) Background checks and continuing education. No later than December 31 of each
- 52 even-numbered calendar year, certified, approved, and registered <u>contract</u> interpreters shall
- pass the background check for applicants, and certified <u>contract</u> interpreters shall complete at
- 54 least 16 hours of continuing education approved by the administrative office of the courts.
- 55 (87) Independent contractors. With the exception of staff interpreters who are employees of
- 56 the courts, <u>Contract</u> court interpreters, including those listed on the statewide roster, are
- 57 independent contractors.
