17-21-18.5 Fees of county recorder -- Electronic recording of instruments.

(5) Except as otherwise provided, a county recorder shall charge and collect, in addition to any fee that a county recorder is otherwise authorized to charge and collect, an additional fee of \$5 for recording a document, instrument, paper, notice, deed, conveyance, map, chart, survey or any other writing. On or before the fifth day of each month, the county recorder shall pay the amount of fees collected by him or her pursuant to this subsection to the county treasurer. On or before the 15th day of each month, the county treasurer shall remit the money received by him or her pursuant to this subsection in the following amounts for each fee received:

(a) Five dollars to:
(i) the Judicial Council pursuant to 78A-2-112.5
75-5-303
(2(b) Unless the allegedly incapacitated person has counsel of the person's own choice,
the court shall appoint an attorney to represent the person in the proceeding. $\underline{\text{An attorney}}$
appointed pursuant to this subsection shall represent the alleged incapacitated person
until relieved of the duty by court order.
(i) The court shall determine whether the alleged incapacitated person has the
ability to pay the reasonable compensation and expenses of an attorney from his or her
estate. If the alleged incapacitated person:
(A) if the alleged incapacitated person has the ability to pay the reasonable
compensation and expenses of an attorney, the court shall order an attorney to represent
the alleged incapacitated person and require such compensation and expenses of the
attorney to be paid from the estate of the alleged incapacitated person.
(B) if the alleged incapacitated person does not have the ability to pay the reasonable
compensation and expenses of an attorney.
(iii) If the court determines subsection (2)(b)(ii)(B) applies, the court may assign counsel pursuant to 78A-2-112.5.

(a) there are separate conservatorship proceedings still pending before the court subsequent to the appointment of a guardian;

terminate upon the appointment of a guardian, unless:

The legal representation of an allegedly incapacitated person by an attorney shall

- (b) there is a timely filed appeal of the appointment of the guardian or the determination of incapacity; or
- (c) upon an express finding of good cause, the court orders otherwise.
- 78A-2-112.5. Grants to nonprofit legal assistance organizations or members of the private bar.
- (1) Pursuant to 75-5-303(2)(b)(iii) and subject to funds collected in accordance with 17-21-18.5(5(a)(i), the state court administrator shall, in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 6a, Utah Procurement Code, provide for the representation of an alleged incapacitated person by:
- (a) soliciting requests for proposals and award grants to nonprofit legal assistance providers; or
- (b) paying the reasonable compensation and expenses of a private attorney.
