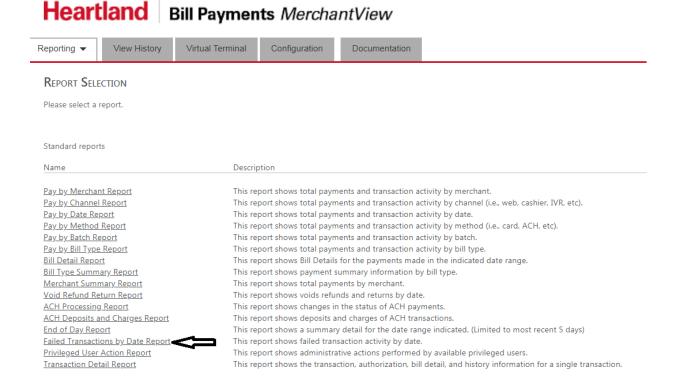
### **How to Decipher Failed Credit Card Attempts**

Run the Failed Transactions by Date Report from the Reporting menu.



Select the site and day and hit submit.

The report shows the number of failed attempts (this could be scheduled to appear in your email daily)

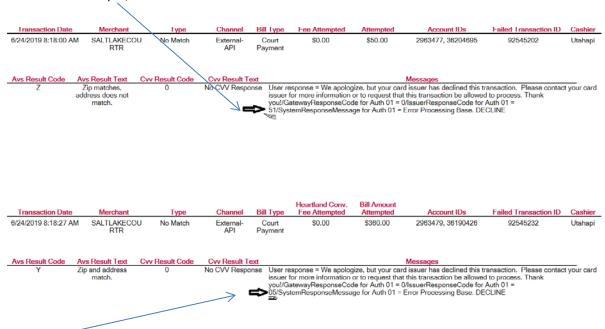

Within the detail section of the report it shows a certain **number code or response code** for why the payment didn't take. **Under Messages, look for:** "IssuerResponse code for auth01= "and then a number. The examples below show 51 and 05. Refer to the document "The Heartland Issuer Response Codes List" for descriptive information.

In this first example, we know that code 51 means Insufficient funds.



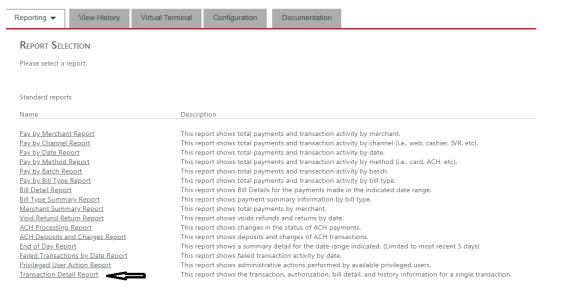
Code 05 mentions the cardholder has exceeded their allowable credit line.

It is important to be careful in how we respond to failed attempts. Be sensitive as to the very 'reason' by just directing them to their bank to first be sure the zip code entered matches what the bank has on file. At times based on how 'insistent' they are, we may need to give the response code and reason.

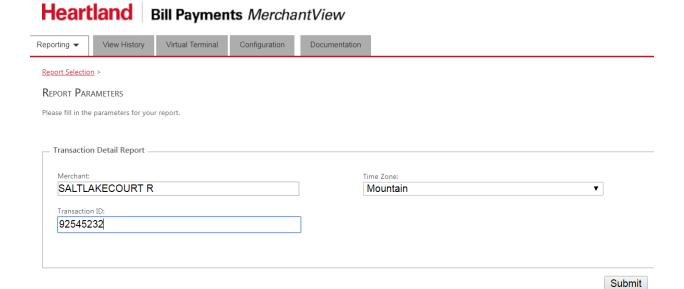
To see more information like the name on the card which this report does not reflect, copy the failed transaction ID in order to insert into Heartland's Transaction Detail Report .

To pull that report, refer back to the Report Selection page and select "Transaction Detail Report"

Because the transaction ID is unique, you don't need to select the specific merchant account, just enter the transaction ID and select Submit.



#### This report may be easier to read and provides information as to the payer's credentials.



One of the reasons the payment may not work is that the payer's bank may not have been set up correctly with regard to the *merchant category code*. The MCC is also referred to as the SIC which is Service Industry Code. According to Heartland, this is assigned by Underwriting based on what the type of products/services that a merchant is processing payments for. The new MCC code is 9211, previously 9399.

Inform companies (Like Attorneys) that failures could be of this nature and have them mention to the bank the new MCC code is 9211.
