Notification of Dishonored Payment

Re: Case # 150902931

Dear Attorney Zane Froerer,

The filing fee associated with the Complaint filed in Case # 150902931 on May 7, 2015] has not been paid; your payment was dishonored. When a filing fee payment is dishonored, the filer “shall pay the fee by cash or cashier’s check within 10 days after notification by the court.” Utah R. Civ. P. 3. Failure to pay the filing fee within 10 days will result in dismissal. On May 7, 2015 I spoke with an employee at your office and was informed that the filing fee would be paid online. Further attempts to contact your office have been unsuccessful.

Filing fees may be waived if a party cannot afford them. To be considered for a fee waiver, a party must file a Motion and Affidavit to Waive Fees and a Proposed Order on Motion to Waive Fees. Forms and information regarding fee waivers are available on the Court’s [website](#).

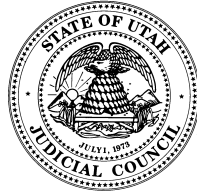

Common causes of dishonored payment:

- Account information entered incorrectly (card number, expiration date, CVV, account holder name).
- Insufficient funds available in the card-associated account.
- The credit card is expired.
- Cardholder exceeded daily spending limit or number of daily transactions allowed by card issuer.
- The court does not accept American Express or Discover cards. Only MasterCard and Visa cards are accepted.
