In addition, the criminal code provides in Section 76-6-505, Utah Code Annotated, that any person who issues or passes a check knowing it will not be paid by the drawee and payment is refused by the drawee, is guilty of issuing a bad check.

The civil action referred to in this notice does not preclude the right to prosecute under the criminal code of the state of Utah.

Your failure to pay debts owed the State may result in the State taking your State income tax refund or vendor payment and applying it against the debt owed.
