    - Check with your court about local requirements.

		After the judge signs the order, serve it on the respondent's attorney. <u>URCP 5</u> governs service, but the judge might sign the order at the hearing, and the respondent's attorney should be present.

	Complete and file the certificate of service, unless the form is served with the petition.
