PURSUANT TO paragraph 6 of the *Order of Contempt* and counsel for the Respondent having submitted an *Affidavit of Attorney Fees*, and the Court finding that the fees are reasonable and necessary and that Respondent prevailed, now therefore:

1. Respondent is awarded a judgment against the Petitioner for attorney fees in the amount of \$32,163.00 as a result of the hearing that took place on February 24<sup>th</sup>, 2026, and that resulted in an *Order of Contempt* being entered against Petitioner.
2. Pursuant to U.C.A. § 15-1-4, such judgment shall bear a post-judgment interest rate of 5.51% until such judgment is paid in full.
3. Petitioner's objection to Respondent's fee affidavit is overruled. The court finds

that the fees are properly supported and are reasonable and necessary considering the complexity of the proceedings and the work involved.
