6. **Hillary Dara Grunig** and **Tyler Dennis Grunig** have physical custody of our child(ren), and are the only people who have custody, child support, and parent-time rights to our child(ren).

PARENTING PLAN

This Parenting Plan is being filed in good faith.
This parenting plan is agreed to by **Hillary Dara Grunig** and **Tyler Dennis Grunig**.

Children - custody

(Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 9, Part 3)

7. It is in the children’s best interest that the parties be awarded Joint Legal and Joint Physical Custody. **Hillary Dara Grunig** is filing this Parenting Plan and verifies the plan is filed in good faith.
8. The children should reside in **Hillary Dara Grunig**'s home **183** overnights each year and in **Tyler Dennis Grunig**'s home **182** overnights each year.
9. Parent-time will be equal between the parties. (Utah Code 81-9-305 and 81-6-206(7))

Parent-time transfers

12. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described below:

The parties will make arrangements for pick up, delivery and return of the children prior to each scheduled parent-time.

Curbside transfers

13. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers

are made.

Decision-making

14. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

Joint decision-making. The parents will share responsibility for making major decisions about the children. If there is a disagreement, the parents will resolve the dispute as provided in the Resolving disputes section below.

Education plan

15. The school the children will attend is based on **Hillary Dara Grunig's** home residence.

16. Hillary Dara Grunig and Tyler Dennis Grunig has authority to check the children out of school. Hillary Dara Grunig and Tyler Dennis Grunig has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Hillary Dara Grunig.

Communication with each other

17. Parents will communicate with each other by any method.

Communication with the children

18. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

19. Parents and children may communicate with each other:

- At any reasonable times:
- Weekends between **04:00 PM and 07:00 PM.**
- Holidays between **04:00 PM and 07:00 PM.**
- School days **04:00 PM and 07:00 PM.**
- School vacation days **04:00 PM and 07:00 PM.**
- By telephone

Parents will maintain voice mail so the children can leave and receive messages.

20. Other terms about communication with the children: **Time may vary, if possible for both parties. If child is unable or unwilling to make a call, that will be communicated as soon as possible or in advance to the other parent.**

Records and information sharing

21. Both parents will have access to records and the ability to consult with providers regarding education, child care, and health care.

Travel by the children

22. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.

23. If the children will be travelling for more than **7** days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least **7** days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least **7** days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

Child care

24. A child care provider for our children must be:
A relative, friend, or neighbor.

Relocation of a parent

25. Neither parent may relocate with the minor children more than **60** miles from their current residence without a written agreement signed by the parties or further court order.

26. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other or the parents live in separate countries, costs for the children's travel expenses for parent-time will be paid by **the parent who moved, except one-half of the expenses for the summer or off-track time will be paid by the other parent.**

27. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

28. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

Resolving disputes

29. If the parents need to resolve a dispute regarding the children, they will discuss the issues in good faith and try to reach an agreement based on what is best for their children. If the parents are unable to agree, they will go to the following before bringing the issue to the court:

a. **Counseling**

Changing the plan

30. A joint physical custody arrangement may result in denial of cash assistance under the Employment Support Act, Title 35A, Chapter 3, of the Utah Code.

END OF PARENTING PLAN

Income: Petitioner (Hillary Dara Grunig) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

31. **Hillary Dara Grunig's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$2340**.

Hillary Dara Grunig receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **Hillary Dara Grunig** is employed at **Connexus Solutions**. **Hillary Dara Grunig** earns **\$2340** gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.

Income: Respondent (Tyler Dennis Grunig) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

32. **Tyler Dennis Grunig's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$5250**.

Tyler Dennis Grunig receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **Tyler Dennis Grunig** is employed at **US Synthetic**. **Tyler Dennis Grunig** earns **\$5250** gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.

33. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Tyler Dennis Grunig** is **\$5250**.

Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)

34. **Hillary Dara Grunig** believes the guideline amount for child support is unjust, inappropriate, or not in the best interest of our children for the following reasons:

Agreement by both parties for the best interest of minor child.

35. It is in the best interest of the children that **Tyler Dennis Grunig** be ordered to pay child support to **Hillary Dara Grunig** as follows:

- a. **\$210.00** per month. This deviates from the Utah Uniform Child Support Guidelines.
- b. Unless the Court orders otherwise, support for each child ends when:
 - a child turns 18 or has graduated from high school during the child's normal and expected year of graduation, whichever occurs later, or
 - a child dies, marries, becomes a member of the United States armed forces, or is emancipated (Utah Code 78A-6-801).

36. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.

37. Child support will be paid as follows:

Payment made thru Venmo or Zelle. Split into two payments (Due by the 15th and last day of every month) If not paid then will be processed thru ORS.

38. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative action.

39. **Tyler Dennis Grunig** will pay any ORS fees. If **Hillary Dara Grunig** is the ORS applicant and the fees are withheld from payments to **Hillary Dara Grunig**, **Tyler Dennis**

Grunig will reimburse **Hillary Dara Grunig**.

40. The parties must notify each other within 30 days of any change in their income.

41. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.

Dependent children for tax purposes

42. The parents may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes as follows:

43. **Hillary Dara Grunig** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in odd numbered years. **Tyler Dennis Grunig** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in even numbered years.

Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)

44. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

45. **n/a** must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage.

This may require applying for public health care coverage, such as CHIP or Medicaid.

a. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Tyler Dennis Grunig's** insurance will be primary coverage.
- **Hillary Dara Grunig's** insurance will be secondary coverage.

b. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Tyler Dennis Grunig's** spouse's insurance will be primary coverage.
- **Hillary Dara Grunig's** spouse's insurance will be secondary coverage.

c. Both parties will equally share the out-of-pocket costs of the insurance premiums.

d. Both parties will equally share all uninsured and unreimbursed medical and dental expenses that are reasonable and necessary. This includes deductibles, co-insurance, and co-payments paid by a party for the dependent children.

e. The party who pays health care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and payment within 30 days.

f. If a party does not follow this order and provide written verification, they may not be able to receive credit for health care expenses or recover the other party's share of the

expenses.

g. On or before January 2 of each year, the party ordered to maintain coverage must provide verification of coverage to the other party, and ORS, if they are involved.

h. If there is any change in coverage, within 30 days of the change the party ordered to maintain coverage must notify the other party and ORS, if they are involved.

Child care expenses (Utah Code 81-6-209)

46. All reasonable work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses will be paid as follows

We will each cover our own child care expenses on our custody weeks if needed.

Public assistance statement – Office of Recovery Services (ORS) (Utah Code 81-6-106(2)-(3))

47. Neither party has received or is receiving public assistance from the State of Utah.

Personal property (Utah Code Title 81, Chapters 1, 4, 6, and 9)

48. All personal property not addressed in the divorce should be divided as the parties have already divided it.

Debts

49. The parties are not aware of any debts from the marriage. If any debts exist, each debt will be the responsibility of the party who incurred the debt.

Real property

50. The parties do not have any real property that is marital property. The parties do not need a court order about real property.

Alimony

51. Neither party will pay alimony.

Retirement money

52. The parties do not need a court order about retirement money.

Additional provisions

53. The parties will adhere to the following additional provisions:

a.

Additional Provision: **All communication should be respectful to each party. Should that change then parents will communicate thru coparenting app TALKING PARENTS. Cost will be covered my parent unable to be respectful. If both parents are unable then cost will be split.**

Duty to sign documents

54. The parties will sign all documents necessary to comply with the divorce decree within 60 days from entry of the decree. If a party fails to sign a document within 60 days, the other party may ask the court to appoint someone to sign the document. (Utah Rule of Civil Procedure 70)

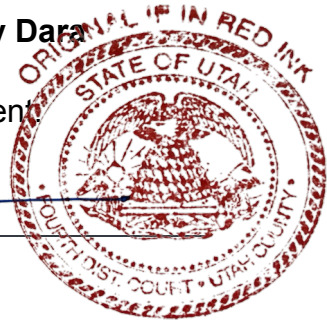

