Parent-time transfers

12. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described below:

The parties will make arrangements for pick up, delivery and return of the children prior to each scheduled parent-time.

Curbside transfers

13. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers are made.

Decision-making

14. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

Joint decision-making. The parents will share responsibility for making major decisions about the children. If there is a disagreement, the parents will resolve the dispute as provided in the Resolving disputes section below.

Education plan

15. The school the children will attend is based on **Tiana Richards's** home residence.

16. Tiana Richards and Derrek Richards has authority to check the children out of school. Tiana Richards and Derrek Richards has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Tiana Richards.

Communication with each other

17. Parents will communicate with each other by any method.

Communication with the children

18. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

19. Parents and children may communicate with each other whenever the children choose.

- By any method

Records and information sharing

20. Both parents will have access to records and the ability to consult with providers regarding education, child care, and health care.

Travel by the children

21. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.

22. If the children will be travelling for more than 3 days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least 14 days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least 14 days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

Child care

23. A child care provider for our children must be:

A relative, friend, or neighbor.

Over the age of 16.

Relocation of a parent

24. Neither parent may relocate with the minor children more than 30 miles from their current residence without a written agreement signed by the parties or further court order.

25. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other or the parents live in separate countries, costs for the children's travel expenses for parent-time will be paid by

the the parent who moved.

26. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

27. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

Resolving disputes

28. If the parents need to resolve a dispute regarding the children, they will discuss the issues in good faith and try to reach an agreement based on what is best for their children. If the parents are unable to agree, they will go to the following before bringing the issue to the court:

a. **Mediation**

29. Other agreements about resolving disputes:

b. **If, after mediation, the parties are unable to reach an agreement, Tiana will have the tie-breaking vote to make the decision, subject to Derrek's right to bring the matter to the court for review of the child's best interest.**

Changing the plan

This plan remains in effect until changed. A change comes from a modification of a court order.

30. A joint physical custody arrangement may result in denial of cash assistance under the Employment Support Act, Title 35A, Chapter 3, of the Utah Code.

END OF PARENTING PLAN

Income: Petitioner (Tiana Richards) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

31. **Tiana Richards's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$1257**. **Tiana Richards** receives the following gross monthly income:

a. **Tiana Richards** has no recent work history. The court should consider **Tiana Richards's** wage to be the federal minimum wage of **\$7.25** an hour. This is a gross monthly income of **\$1257**. (Utah Code 81-6-203(6)(c) and (d))

b. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Tiana Richards** is **\$1257**.

Income: Respondent (Derrek Richards) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

32. **Derrek Richards's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$6000**. **Derrek Richards** receives the following gross monthly income:

a. **Derrek Richards** is voluntarily unemployed. Based on **Derrek Richards's** work experience, **Derrek Richards** is capable of earning **40.38** per hour, or **\$6000** per month. (Utah Code 81-6-203)

33. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Derrek Richards** is **\$6000**.

Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)

34. **Tiana Richards** believes the guideline amount for child support is unjust, inappropriate, or not in the best interest of our children for the following reasons:
The reason(s) for deviation are excessive debts of the marriage and I feel as though I provide more every day essentials such as clothing, school supplies, and groceries..

35. It is in the best interest of the children that **Derrek Richards** be ordered to pay child support to **Tiana Richards** as follows:

- a. **\$300.00** per month. This deviates from the Utah Uniform Child Support Guidelines.
- b. Unless the Court orders otherwise, support for each child ends when:
 - a child turns 18 or has graduated from high school during the child's normal and expected year of graduation, whichever occurs later, or
 - a child dies, marries, becomes a member of the United States armed forces, or is emancipated (Utah Code 78A-6-801).

36. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.

37. Child support will be paid as follows:

Check, Venmo, cash, or direct deposit

38. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative action.

39. **Derrek Richards** will pay any ORS fees. If **Tiana Richards** is the ORS applicant and the fees are withheld from payments to **Tiana Richards**, **Derrek Richards** will reimburse **Tiana Richards**.

40. The parties must notify each other within 30 days of any change in their income.

41. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.

Dependent children for tax purposes

42. The parents may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes as follows:

43. **Tiana Richards** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in odd numbered years. **Derrek Richards** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in even numbered years.

Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)

44. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

45. **Derrek Richards** must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage, such as CHIP or Medicaid.

- a. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:
 - **Derrek Richards's** insurance will be primary coverage.
 - **Tiana Richards's** insurance will be secondary coverage.
- b. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:
 - **Derrek Richards's** spouse's insurance will be primary coverage.
 - **Tiana Richards's** spouse's insurance will be secondary coverage.
- c. Both parties will equally share the out-of-pocket costs of the insurance premiums.
- d. Both parties will equally share all uninsured and unreimbursed medical and dental expenses that are reasonable and necessary. This includes deductibles, co-insurance, and co-payments paid by a party for the dependent children.
- e. The party who pays health care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and payment within 30 days.
- f. If a party does not follow this order and provide written verification, they may not be able to receive credit for health care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.
- g. On or before January 2 of each year, the party ordered to maintain coverage must provide verification of coverage to the other party, and ORS, if they are involved.
- h. If there is any change in coverage, within 30 days of the change the party ordered to maintain coverage must notify the other party and ORS, if they are involved.

Child care expenses (Utah Code 81-6-209)

46. Both parties will equally share all reasonable work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses.

- a. The party who pays child care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and identity of the child care provider. This must be done when a provider is first hired, and any time the other party asks for the information.

The party incurring or paying child care expenses must notify the other party of any change of a child care provider or monthly expense. This must be done within 30 calendar days of the change.

b. The party not directly paying for child care must pay their share of child care expenses as soon as they receive verification of the expenses.

c. If a party does **not** follow the order and provide written verification, they may not receive credit for work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.
