I say the following:

5. There are no custody, child support, or parent-time cases about **Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez** and **Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo**'s minor children in any court or government agency. This includes filed, pending, and completed cases.

6. **Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez** and **Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo** have physical custody of our child(ren), and are the only people who have custody, child support, and parent-time rights to our child(ren).

PARENTING PLAN

This Parenting Plan is being filed in good faith.

This parenting plan is agreed to by **Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez** and **Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo**.

Children - custody

(Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 9, Part 3)

7. It is in the children's best interest that the parties be awarded Joint Legal and Joint Physical Custody. **Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez** is filing this Parenting Plan and verifies the plan is filed in good faith.

8. The children should reside in **Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez's** home **182** overnights each year and in **Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo's** home **183** overnights each year.

Parent-time

9. Parent-time will be equal between the parties. (Utah Code 81-9-305 and 81-6-206(7))

10. The chart below shows how this schedule will function.

11. The parents will follow the schedule for special occasions below. Parent-time transfers

12. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described below:

The parties will make arrangements for pick up, delivery and return of the children prior to each scheduled parent-time.

Curbside transfers

13. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers are made.

Decision-making

14. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

Joint decision-making. The parents will share responsibility for making major decisions about the children. If there is a disagreement, the parents will resolve the dispute as provided in the Resolving disputes section below.

Education plan

15. The school the children will attend is based on **Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo's** home residence.

16. Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez and Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo has authority to check the children out of school. Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez and Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo.

Communication with each other

17. Parents will communicate with each other by any method.

Communication with the children

18. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

19. Parents and children may communicate with each other whenever the children choose.

- By any method

Records and information sharing

20. Both parents will have access to records and the ability to consult with providers regarding education, child care, and health care.

Travel by the children

21. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.

22. If the children will be travelling for more than 2 days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least 7 days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least 7 days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

Child care

23. A child care provider for our children must be:
A relative, friend, or neighbor.

Relocation of a parent (Utah Code 81-9-209)

24. If either parent moves more than 149 miles from the other, the moving parent must give the non-moving parent a written Notice of Relocation. The notice must be sent at least 60 days before the planned move.

a. The written Notice of Relocation must include:

- Information about the move;
- A proposed parent-time schedule; and
- A statement that the parents will not interfere with the other parent's parent-time.

b. If the moving parent does not give the non-moving parent a Notice of Relocation, the moving parent will be in contempt of the court's order.

25. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other, or if the parents live in different countries, parent-time will be as the parties agree. If they are unable to agree, the following will be the minimum parent-time for the noncustodial parent:

Relocation Schedule (Utah Code 81-9-209)

a. in years ending in odd number, the minor children will spend the following holidays with the noncustodial parent:

- i. Thanksgiving holiday beginning Wednesday until Sunday; and
- ii. spring break, if applicable, beginning the last day of school before the holiday until the day before school resumes;

b. in years ending in an even number, the minor children will spend the following holidays with the noncustodial parent:

- i. the entire winter school break period; and

ii. the fall school break beginning the last day of school before the holiday until the day before school resumes; and

c. extended parent-time equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ of the summer or off-track time for consecutive weeks. The children will be returned to the custodial home no later than seven days before school begins. This week will be counted when determining the amount of parent-time to be divided between the parents for the summer or off-track period.

The parties will mutually agree on this extended time each year. If they are unable to agree, the noncustodial parent will select the dates for the extended time period.

d. One weekend per month at the option and expense of the noncustodial parent. The noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement is subject to the following restrictions.

i. If the noncustodial parent has not designated a specific weekend for parent-time, the noncustodial parent will receive the last weekend of each month unless a holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on that particular weekend. If a holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on the last weekend of the month, the noncustodial parent will be entitled to the next to the last weekend of the month.

ii. If a noncustodial parent's extended parent-time or parent-time over a holiday extends into or through the first weekend of the next month, that weekend will be considered the noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement for that month.

iii. If a child is out of school for teacher development days or snow days after the children begin the school year, or other days not included in the list of holidays in Subsection (5) and those days are contiguous with the noncustodial parent's monthly weekend parent-time, those days will be included in the weekend parent-time.

e. The custodial parent is entitled to all parent-time not specifically allocated to the noncustodial parent.

26. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

27. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

Resolving disputes

28. If the parents need to resolve a dispute regarding the children, they will discuss the issues in good faith and try to reach an agreement based on what is best for their children. If the parents are unable to agree, they will go to the following before bringing the issue to the court:

a. **Mediation**

Changing the plan

This plan remains in effect until changed. A change comes from a modification of a court order.

29. A joint physical custody arrangement may result in denial of cash assistance under the Employment Support Act, Title 35A, Chapter 3, of the Utah Code.

END OF PARENTING PLAN

Income: Petitioner (Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

30. **Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$5500**. **Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez** receives the following gross monthly income:

Income: Respondent (Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

31. **Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$1209**. **Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo** receives the following gross monthly income:

32. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo** is **\$0**.

Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)

33. **Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez** believes the guideline amount for child support is unjust, inappropriate, or not in the best interest of our children for the following reasons:

The reason(s) for deviation are excessive debts of the marriage.

34. It is in the best interest of the children that be ordered to pay child support to **Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo** as follows:

- a. **\$1,000.00** per month. This deviates from the Utah Uniform Child Support Guidelines.
- b. Unless the Court orders otherwise, support for each child ends when:
 - a child turns 18 or has graduated from high school during the child's normal and expected year of graduation, whichever occurs later, or
 - a child dies, marries, becomes a member of the United States armed forces, or is emancipated (Utah Code 78A-6-801).

35. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.

36. Child support will be paid as follows:

Zelle

37. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative action.

38. **Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez** will pay any ORS fees. If **Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo** is the ORS applicant and the fees are withheld from payments to

Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo, will reimburse **Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo**.

39. The parties must notify each other within 30 days of any change in their income.

40. The parties will do the following for child related support or expenses:

a. Francisco Munoz will pay the rent for the house or apartment for Elizabeth and their children as well as the child support.

41. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.

Dependent children for tax purposes

42. The parents may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes as follows:

43. **Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in odd numbered years. **Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in even numbered years.

Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)

44. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

45. **Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez** must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage, such as CHIP or Medicaid.

a. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez's** insurance will be primary coverage.
- **Elizabeth Andrea Martinez Olmedo's** insurance will be secondary coverage.

b. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Francisco Miguel Munoz Nunez's** spouse's insurance will be primary coverage.
