Divorce

5. There are no custody, child support, or parent-time cases about **Kelli Lynn Oros** and **Federico Daniel Fernandez's** minor children in any court or government agency. This includes filed, pending, and completed cases.

6. **Kelli Lynn Oros** and **Federico Daniel Fernandez** have physical custody of our child(ren), and are the only people who have custody, child support, and parent-time rights to our child(ren).

PARENTING PLAN

This Parenting Plan is being filed in good faith.

This parenting plan is agreed to by **Kelli Lynn Oros** and **Federico Daniel Fernandez**.

Children - custody

(Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 9, Part 3)

7. It is in the children's best interest that the parties be awarded Joint Legal Custody and that **Kelli Lynn Oros** be awarded Sole Physical custody. **Federico Daniel Fernandez** should have parent-time at reasonable times and places. **Kelli Lynn Oros** is filing this Parenting Plan and verifies the plan is filed in good faith.

Parent-time

8. The parents will follow a custom parent-time schedule:

The parents will follow a custom parent-time schedule.

a. For a minor child **Federico Daniel Fernandez** will have the following time: (a) one set weekday evening to be specified by the **Federico Daniel Fernandez**: (i) beginning at 5:30 p.m. and ending at 8:30 p.m.; or (ii) if the minor child is being cared for during the day outside the minor child's regular place of residence and with advance notice to the custodial parent, beginning at the time that the minor child is picked up from the caregiver and ending at 8:30 p.m.; (b) beginning on the first weekend after the entry of the decree, alternating weekends beginning at 6 p.m. on Friday and ending at 7 p.m. on Sunday; (c) each holiday granted to **Federico Daniel Fernandez** in accordance with the holiday schedule described in Subsection (15); (d) Overnight parent-time shall occur only when the parent exercising parent-time can provide appropriate and stable housing for the child. Appropriate housing includes, at a minimum, a safe, sanitary environment with adequate sleeping arrangements (e.g., a bed or suitable sleeping space), access to a bathroom, and reasonable privacy. If overnight visitation cannot occur due to lack of appropriate housing or the child's inability to stay overnight, the child shall return to **Kelli Lynn Oros'** home for the overnight period. This shall not be considered a denial of parent-time, and reasonable daytime parent-time shall still occur.

Parent-time for special occasions

9. The parents will follow the schedule for special occasions below. If there is more than one child and the children's school schedules vary for purpose of a holiday, at the option of the parent exercising the holiday or the parent's half of the holiday, the children may remain together for the holiday period beginning the first evening that all children's schools are let out for the holiday and ending the evening before any child returns to school. (Utah Code 81-9-302, 303).

Parent-time transfers

10. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described below:

The parties will make arrangements for pick up, delivery and return of the children prior to each scheduled parent-time.

Curbside transfers

11. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers are made.

Decision-making

12. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

Sole decision-making.

13. Both Kelli Lynn Oros and Federico Daniel Fernandez will make decisions about education together.

14. Both Kelli Lynn Oros and Federico Daniel Fernandez will make decisions about health care together.

15. Kelli Lynn Oros will make decisions about religion.

Education plan

16. The school the children will attend is based on **Kelli Lynn Oros's** home residence.

17. Kelli Lynn Oros has authority to check the children out of school. Kelli Lynn Oros and Federico Daniel Fernandez has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Kelli Lynn Oros.

Communication with the children

19. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

20. Parents and children may communicate with each other whenever the children choose.

- By any method

21. Other terms about communication with the children: **During bedtime hours, the child will be unavailable unless it is an emergency.**

Records and information sharing

22. Both parents will have access to records and the ability to consult with providers regarding education, child care, and health care.

Travel by the children

23. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.

24. If the children will be travelling for more than **5** days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least **30** days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least **30** days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

25. Other agreements about travel by the children: **Any international travel must first be agreed to by both parents in writing. The minor child will not receive a passport without the approval of both parents. All passports will be stored by Kelli Lynn Oros.**

Child care

26. A child care provider for our children must be:
A licensed child care provider.

A relative, friend, or neighbor.
Over the age of **16**.

Relocation of a parent

27. Neither parent may relocate with the minor children more than **1500** miles from their current residence without a written agreement signed by the parties or further court order.

28. Other terms about relocating: **International relocation is prohibited.**

29. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other or the parents live in separate countries, costs for the children's travel expenses for parent-time will be paid by the parties as follows: **Relocation expenses will be according to the state statute unless the parties agree to a deviation in writing.**

30. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

31. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

Resolving disputes

32. If the parents need to resolve a dispute regarding the children, they will discuss the issues in good faith and try to reach an agreement based on what is best for their children. If the parents are unable to agree, they will go to the following before bringing the issue to the court:

a. **Mediation**

Changing the plan

This plan remains in effect until changed. A change comes from a modification of a court order.

END OF PARENTING PLAN

Income: Petitioner (Kelli Lynn Oros) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

33. **Kelli Lynn Oros's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$1257**. **Kelli Lynn Oros** base child support amount using the **sole** custody calculation is **\$75**. **Kelli Lynn Oros** receives the following gross monthly income:

34. **Federico Daniel Fernandez's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$3567**. **Federico Daniel Fernandez's** base child support amount using the **sole** custody calculation is **\$488**. **Federico Daniel Fernandez** receives the following gross monthly income:

35. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Federico Daniel Fernandez** is **\$3567**.

Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)

36. It is in the best interest of the children that **Federico Daniel Fernandez** be ordered to pay child support to **Kelli Lynn Oros** as follows:

a. **\$488.00** per month base support. This amount complies with the Utah Child Support Act.

37. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.

38. The **sole** custody worksheet was used to calculate child support.

Kelli Lynn Oros's base child support amount is **\$75** per month.

Federico Daniel Fernandez's base child support amount is **\$488** per month.

If physical custody of a child changes from what the court orders:

- The parent owing support must pay the support amount to whomever has physical custody of the child.
- The parent must pay the support amount without asking the court to modify the child support order.
- This does not apply to temporary parent-time changes. (Utah Code 81-6-104(4) and 81-6-205(8)(a)).

Child support reduction for extended parent-time

39. If a child lives with the non-custodial parent by court order or written agreement of the parties for:

- 25 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 50% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(a)).
- 12 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 25% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(b)).

The custodial parent's normal parent-time and holiday parent-time do not count as an interruption of the consecutive day requirement.

40. If a child receives cash assistance through the T.A.N.F. or F.E.P. programs, any agreement by the parties to reduce child support during extended parent-time must be approved by the Office of Recovery Services.

41. The person ordered to receive child support can request mandatory income withholding (Utah Code 62A-11 parts 4 and 5). If support is past due, the State of Utah may take federal or state tax refunds or rebates and apply the amounts to the child support owed.

- a. Withheld income will be sent to the Office of Recovery Services (ORS) until all past-due support is paid. Child support payments will be sent to:
150 East Center Street, Suite 2100 Provo, Utah 84606
unless ORS gives notice that payments should be sent elsewhere.

42. If ORS begins mandatory income withholding, child support is due on the first day of each month and will be past due on the first day of the next month.

43. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative action.

44. **Kelli Lynn Oros** will pay any ORS fees. If **Kelli Lynn Oros** is the ORS applicant and the fees are withheld from payments to **Kelli Lynn Oros, Federico Daniel Fernandez** will reimburse **Kelli Lynn Oros**.

45. The parties must notify each other within 30 days of any change in their income.

46. The parties can ask to change this child support order by motion after three years from the date of its entry if:

- there is a difference of 10% or more between the amount previously ordered and the new amount of child support under the Utah child support guidelines,
- the difference is not temporary, and
- the amount previously ordered was not a deviation from the child support guidelines.

If the children receive TANF funds at the time an adjustment is sought, ORS will review the order and ask the court to adjust the amount if appropriate. (Utah Code 62A-11-306.2).

47. The parties can ask to change this child support order at any time by petition if there has been a substantial change in circumstances because of material changes in:

- custody;
- the relative wealth or assets of the parties;
- income of a parent of 30% or more;
- the employment potential and ability of a parent to earn;
- the medical needs of the child; or
- the legal responsibilities of either parent for the support of others.

(Utah Code 81-6-202 and 81-6-212)

The change must result in a difference of 15% or more between the amount previously ordered and the new amount of child support under the Utah child support guidelines.

The difference may not be temporary.

The court can consider natural or adoptive children born after the entry of the decree other than those in common to both parties as part of a request to modify an existing award subject to limitations in the law. (Utah Code 81-6-202(8))

48. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.

Dependent children for tax purposes

49. **Kelli Lynn Oros** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes.

Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)

50. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

51. The parent who is able to obtain the most affordable medical, hospital, and dental insurance for the dependent children must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage, such as CHIP or Medicaid.

a. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Kelli Lynn Oros's** insurance will be primary coverage.
- **Federico Daniel Fernandez's** insurance will be secondary coverage.

b. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Kelli Lynn Oros's** spouse's insurance will be primary coverage.
- **Federico Daniel Fernandez's** spouse's insurance will be secondary coverage.

c. Both parties will equally share the out-of-pocket costs of the insurance premiums.

d. Both parties will equally share all uninsured and unreimbursed medical and dental expenses that are reasonable and necessary. This includes deductibles, co-insurance, and co-payments paid by a party for the dependent children.

e. The party who pays health care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and payment within 30 days.

f. If a party does not follow this order and provide written verification, they may not be able to receive credit for health care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.

g. On or before January 2 of each year, the party ordered to maintain coverage must provide verification of coverage to the other party, and ORS, if they are involved.

h. If there is any change in coverage, within 30 days of the change the party ordered to maintain coverage must notify the other party and ORS, if they are involved.

Child care expenses (Utah Code 81-6-209)

52. Both parties will equally share all reasonable work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses.

a. The party who pays child care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and identity of the child care provider. This must be done

when a provider is first hired, and any time the other party asks for the information. The party incurring or paying child care expenses must notify the other party of any change of a child care provider or monthly expense. This must be done within 30 calendar days of the change.

b. The party not directly paying for child care must pay their share of child care expenses as soon as they receive verification of the expenses.

c. If a party does **not** follow the order and provide written verification, they may not receive credit for work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.

Public assistance statement – Office of Recovery Services (ORS) (Utah Code 81-6-106(2)-(3))

53. Neither party has received or is receiving public assistance from the State of Utah.

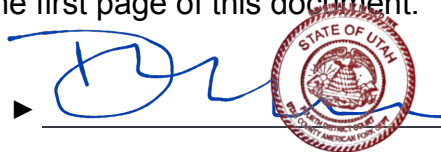
