I say the following:

5. There are no custody, child support, or parent-time cases about **Andrea Michelle Bost** and **Tyler Steven Lee Bost**'s minor children in any court or government agency. This includes filed, pending, and completed cases.

6. **Andrea Michelle Bost** and **Tyler Steven Lee Bost** have physical custody of our child(ren), and are the only people who have custody, child support, and parent-time rights to our child(ren).

PARENTING PLAN

This Parenting Plan is being filed in good faith.

This parenting plan is agreed to by **Andrea Michelle Bost** and **Tyler Steven Lee Bost**.

Children - custody

(Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 9, Part 3)

7. It is in the children's best interest that the parties share legal custody, but that primary physical custody be given to each parent as specified below. The non-custodial parent has the right to parent-time at reasonable times and places. **Andrea Michelle Bost** is

filing this Parenting Plan with the court and verifies that the plan is being filed in good faith.

- a. **Andrea Michelle Bost**, Petitioner, will have primary custody of **Kaladin Roy Bost**.
- b. **Tyler Steven Lee Bost**, Respondent, will have primary custody of **Rozalyn Dawn Bost, Vahn Phoenix Bost**.

8. The parents will follow a custom parent-time schedule:

The children will live with each parent as specified below and the other parent will have parent-time according to a custom parent-time schedule. The parent who the children live with will be the "custodial" parent.

Custody and Parent Time 1. The parents will share joint legal custody of their three minor children. Andrea Michelle Bost is awarded sole physical custody of the the youngest child (Kaladin Bost) and Tyler Steven Lee Bost is awarded sole physical custody of the two oldest children (Vahn Bost and Rozalyn Bost).

a. The parents will exercise parent time as they can agree with the three children being together on holidays and in the summer. The parties will each receive parent time for 1/2 of the summer and each parent may take the children for a 2 week period of uninterrupted parent time during the summer school break.

9. The parents will follow the parent-time schedule in the statute(s).

The children will live with each parent as specified below and the other parent will have parent-time according to the statutory parent-time schedule. The parent who the children live with will be the "custodial" parent.

- a. Andrea Michelle Bost: Kaladin Roy Bost
- b. Tyler Steven Lee Bost: Rozalyn Dawn Bost, Vahn Phoenix Bost

Parent-time for special occasions

10. The parents will follow the schedule for special occasions below. Curbside transfers

12. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers are made.

Decision-making

13. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

Joint decision-making. The parents will share responsibility for making major decisions about the children. If there is a disagreement, the parents will resolve the dispute as provided in the Resolving disputes section below.

Education plan

14. The school the children will attend is based on a specific plan for where the children will attend school: **The parent that has physical custody of them..**

15. Andrea Michelle Bost and Tyler Steven Lee Bost has authority to check the children out of school. Andrea Michelle Bost and Tyler Steven Lee Bost has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Andrea Michelle Bost.

Communication with each other

16. Parents will communicate with each other by any method.

Communication with the children

17. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

18. Parents and children may communicate with each other whenever the children choose.

- By any method

Records and information sharing

19. Both parents will have access to records and the ability to consult with providers regarding education, child care, and health care.

Travel by the children

20. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with

others.

21. If the children will be travelling for more than **two days** days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least **30** days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least **30** days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

Child care

22. A child care provider for our children must be:

A licensed child care provider.

A relative, friend, or neighbor.

Relocation of a parent (Utah Code 81-9-209)

23. If either parent moves more than 149 miles from the other, the moving parent must give the non-moving parent a written Notice of Relocation. The notice must be sent at least 60 days before the planned move.

a. The written Notice of Relocation must include:

- Information about the move;
- A proposed parent-time schedule; and
- A statement that the parents will not interfere with the other parent's parent-time.

b. If the moving parent does not give the non-moving parent a Notice of Relocation, the moving parent will be in contempt of the court's order.

24. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other, or if the parents live a different countries, parent-time will be as the parties agree. If they are unable to agree, the following will be the minimum parent-time for the noncustodial parent:

Relocation Schedule (Utah Code 81-9-209)

a. in years ending in odd number, the minor children will spend the following holidays with the noncustodial parent:

- i. Thanksgiving holiday beginning Wednesday until Sunday; and
- ii. spring break, if applicable, beginning the last day of school before the holiday until the day before school resumes;

b. in years ending in an even number, the minor children will spend the following holidays with the noncustodial parent:

- i. the entire winter school break period; and
- ii. the fall school break beginning the last day of school before the holiday until the day before school resumes; and

c. extended parent-time equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ of the summer or off-track time for consecutive weeks. The children will be returned to the custodial home no later than seven days before school begins. This week will be counted when determining the amount of parent-time to be divided between the parents for the summer or off-track period.

The parties will mutually agree on this extended time each year. If they are unable to agree, the noncustodial parent will select the dates for the extended time period.

d. One weekend per month at the option and expense of the noncustodial parent. The noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement is subject to the following restrictions.

i. If the noncustodial parent has not designated a specific weekend for parent-time, the noncustodial parent will receive the last weekend of each month unless a holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on that particular weekend. If a holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on the last weekend of the month, the noncustodial parent will be entitled to the next to the last weekend of the month.

ii. If a noncustodial parent's extended parent-time or parent-time over a holiday extends into or through the first weekend of the next month, that weekend will be considered the noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement for that month.

iii. If a child is out of school for teacher development days or snow days after the children begin the school year, or other days not included in the list of holidays in Subsection (5) and those days are contiguous with the noncustodial parent's monthly weekend parent-time, those days will be included in the weekend parent-time.

e. The custodial parent is entitled to all parent-time not specifically allocated to the noncustodial parent.

25. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other or the parents live in separate countries, costs for the children's travel expenses for parent-time will be paid by **the parent who moved**.

26. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

27. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

Resolving disputes

28. If the parents need to resolve a dispute regarding the children, they will discuss the issues in good faith and try to reach an agreement based on what is best for their children. If the parents are unable to agree, they will go to the following before bringing the issue to the court:

a. **Mediation**

Changing the plan

This plan remains in effect until changed. A change comes from a modification of a court order.

END OF PARENTING PLAN

Income: Petitioner (Andrea Michelle Bost) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

29. **Andrea Michelle Bost's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$1664**.

Andrea Michelle Bost receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **Andrea Michelle Bost** is employed at **The Beaumont Assisted Living**. **Andrea Michelle Bost** earns **\$1664** gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.

Income: Respondent (Tyler Steven Lee Bost) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

30. **Tyler Steven Lee Bost's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$10417**. **Tyler Steven Lee Bost** receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **Tyler Steven Lee Bost** is employed at **Mango Voice**. **Tyler Steven Lee Bost** earns **\$10417** gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.

31. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Tyler Steven Lee Bost** is **\$10417**.

Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)

32. **Andrea Michelle Bost** believes the guideline amount for child support is unjust, inappropriate, or not in the best interest of our children for the following reasons:

The reason(s) for deviation are Child support in this case is calculated on the split custody calculator with Tyler earning \$10,416.00 gross monthly with 2 children and Andrea earning \$1,306.00 gross monthly with 1 child. Child support is calculated as Tyler paying Andrea \$416.00 each month and the parties have agreed he will pay her \$500.00 each month in child support..

33. It is in the best interest of the children that **Tyler Steven Lee Bost** be ordered to pay child support to **Andrea Michelle Bost** as follows:

- a. **\$500.00** per month. This deviates from the Utah Uniform Child Support Guidelines.
- b. Unless the Court orders otherwise, support for each child ends when:
 - a child turns 18 or has graduated from high school during the child's normal and expected year of graduation, whichever occurs later, or
 - a child dies, marries, becomes a member of the United States armed forces, or is emancipated (Utah Code 78A-6-801).

34. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.

35. **Andrea Michelle Bost** will give **Tyler Steven Lee Bost** the information needed to set up direct deposit through **Tyler Steven Lee Bost's** employer. Once **Tyler Steven Lee Bost** has the information, **Tyler Steven Lee Bost** will have **Tyler Steven Lee Bost's** employer set up direct deposit to an account of **Andrea Michelle Bost's** choice.

One half of the child support is due by the 5th of each month, and the other half is due by the 20th of each month.

36. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative

action.

37. **Andrea Michelle Bost** and **Tyler Steven Lee Bost** will each pay half of any ORS fee.

a. If a fee is withheld from payments to **Andrea Michelle Bost**, **Tyler Steven Lee Bost** will reimburse **Andrea Michelle Bost** for half the fee.

b. If a fee is withheld from payments to **Tyler Steven Lee Bost**, **Andrea Michelle Bost** will reimburse **Tyler Steven Lee Bost** for half the fee.

38. The parties must notify each other within 30 days of any change in their income.

39. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.

Dependent children for tax purposes

40. As long as **Andrea Michelle Bost** is current on all child support and other court-ordered financial obligations, **Andrea Michelle Bost** may claim the following children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes as allowed by law:

a. **Kaladin Roy Bost for the 2026 Tax year and every year after while applicable**

41. As long as **Tyler Steven Lee Bost** is current on all child support and other court-ordered financial obligations, **Tyler Steven Lee Bost** may claim the following children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes as allowed by law:

b. **Rozalyn Dawn Bost and Vahn Phoenix Bost for the 2026 Tax year and every year after while applicable**

42. When there is only one child that can be claimed, the parties will alternate claiming this child every other year.

Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)

43. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

44. Parents must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage, such as CHIP or Medicaid.

a. Responsibility for child medical and dental expenses will be as follows:

b. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Tyler Steven Lee Bost's** insurance will be primary coverage.
 - **Andrea Michelle Bost's** insurance will be secondary coverage.
- c. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:
