5. There are no custody, child support, or parent-time cases about **Paige Nicole Fisher** and **Bailey Lynn Fisher**'s minor children in any court or government agency. This includes filed, pending, and completed cases.

6. **Paige Nicole Fisher** and **Bailey Lynn Fisher** have physical custody of our child(ren), and are the only people who have custody, child support, and parent-time rights to our child(ren).

PARENTING PLAN

This Parenting Plan is being filed in good faith.

This parenting plan is agreed to by **Paige Nicole Fisher** and **Bailey Lynn Fisher**.

Children - custody

(Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 9, Part 3)

7. It is in the children's best interest that the parties be awarded Joint Legal and Joint Physical Custody. **Paige Nicole Fisher** is filing this Parenting Plan and verifies the plan is filed in good faith.

8. The children should reside in **Paige Nicole Fisher**'s home **182** overnights each year and in **Bailey Lynn Fisher**'s home **183** overnights each year.

The parents will follow a custom parent-time schedule.

a. **Bailey Lynn Fisher** shall have parenting time with the minor child, **Jude**, each week from Wednesday at 9:00 a.m. until Saturday at 9:00 a.m. At 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, **Bailey Lynn Fisher** shall transport **Jude** to **Lisa Joy Woodyatt's** residence (**Jude's** Grandmother). **Bailey Lynn Fisher** and **Paige Nicole Fisher** shall alternate Saturdays regarding who exercises parenting time. On **Bailey Lynn Fisher's** designated Saturdays, she shall pick **Jude** up from **Lisa Joy Woodyatt's** residence and shall return **Jude** to **Paige Nicole Fisher** on Sunday at 9:00 a.m. **Paige Nicole Fisher's** Parenting Time: **Paige Nicole Fisher** shall have parenting time with minor child **Jude** each week from Sunday at 9:00 a.m. until Wednesday at 9:00 a.m. **Paige Nicole Fisher** and **Bailey Lynn Fisher** shall alternate Saturdays. On **Paige Nicole Fisher's** designated Saturdays, **Paige Nicole Fisher** shall pick **Jude** up from **Lisa Joy Woodyatt's** residence and shall retain parenting time until Wednesday at 9:00 a.m. **Saturday Care at Lisa Joy Woodyatt's (Grandmother's Residence)** On Saturdays, from 9:00 a.m. until approximately 6:00 p.m., **Jude** shall remain in the care of **Lisa Joy Woodyatt**, unless picked up earlier by the parent scheduled for that Saturday.

FOR CHILDREN UNDER 5 MONTHS OF AGE (Utah Code 81-9-304):

Weekly: Three two-hour visits every week in the home of the custodial parent, an

established child-care setting, or other environment familiar to the child, unless the parents agree otherwise.

Holidays: Two hours on each of the noncustodial parent's holidays indicated below in the Special Occasion table in the home of the custodial parent, an established child-care setting, or other environment familiar to the child, unless the parents agree otherwise.

FOR CHILDREN 5 MONTHS TO UNDER 9 MONTHS OF AGE:

Weekly: Three three-hour visits every week in the home of the custodial parent, an established child-care setting, or other environment familiar to the child, unless the parents agree otherwise.

Holidays: Two hours on each of the noncustodial parent's holidays indicated below in the Special Occasion table in the home of the custodial parent, an established child-care setting, or other environment familiar to the child, unless the parents agree otherwise.

FOR CHILDREN 9 MONTHS TO UNDER 12 MONTHS OF AGE:

Weekly: One 8 hour visit every week and one 3 hour visit every week.

Holidays: Eight hours on each of the noncustodial parent's holidays indicated below in the Special Occasion table, and

Electronic Communication: Brief telephone contact and/or virtual parent-time at least two times a week, at reasonable hours and for reasonable duration. Virtual parent time may be exercised if the equipment is reasonably available and the parents reside at least 100 miles apart, provided that if the parties cannot agree on whether the equipment is reasonably available, the court shall decide whether the equipment for virtual parent-time is reasonably available, taking into consideration the best interest of the child, each parent's ability to handle any additional expenses for virtual parent-time; and any other factors the court considers material.

FOR CHILDREN 18 MONTHS TO UNDER 3 YEARS OF AGE:

Midweek: One weekday evening from 5:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. to be specified by the noncustodial parent. However, if the child is being cared for during the day outside the child's regular place of residence, the noncustodial parent may, with advance notice to the custodial parent, pick up the child from the caregiver at an earlier time and return the child to the custodial parent by 8:30 p.m.

Alternate Weekends: Alternative weekends beginning on the first weekend after the entry of the decree from 6:00 p.m. Friday until 7:00 p.m. Sunday.

Holiday Parent-time: Holidays as specified below in the Special Occasion table.

Extended Parent-time: Two one-week periods, separated by at least four weeks, at the option of the noncustodial parent;

- a. one week shall be uninterrupted time for the parent granted the extended parent-time;
- b. the remaining week shall be subject to weekday parent-time for the custodial parent on the same day as the parent exercising the extended parent-time has during the other weeks of the year; and

c. the custodial parent shall have an identical one-week period of uninterrupted time for vacation.

Notification of extended parent-time or vacation weeks with the child shall be provided at least 30 days in advance to the custodial parent.

Electronic Communication: Brief telephone contact and/or virtual parent-time at least two times a week, at reasonable hours and for reasonable duration. Virtual parent time may be exercised if the equipment is reasonably available and the parents reside at least 100 miles apart, provided that if the parties cannot agree on whether the equipment is reasonably available, the court shall decide whether the equipment for virtual parent-time is reasonably available, taking into consideration the best interest of the child, each parent's ability to handle any additional expenses for virtual parent-time; and any other factors the court considers material.

FOR CHILDREN 3 YEARS TO UNDER 5 YEARS OF AGE (81-9-304):

Midweek: One weekday evening from 5:30 - 8:30 p.m. to be specified by the noncustodial parent. However, if the child is being cared for during the day outside the child's regular place of residence, the noncustodial parent may, with advance notice to the custodial parent, pick up the child from the caregiver at an earlier time and return the child to the custodial parent by 8:30 p.m.

Alternate Weekends: Alternative weekends beginning on the first weekend after the entry of the decree from 6:00 p.m. on Friday until 7:00 p.m. on Sunday continuing.

Holiday Parent-time: Holidays as specified below in the Special Occasion table.

Extended Parent-time: Two two-week periods, separated by at least four weeks, at the option of the noncustodial parent;

a. one two-week period shall be uninterrupted time for the parent granted the extended parent time;

b. the remaining two-week period shall be subject to an equal amount of weekday parent-time that the parent exercising the extended parent-time has during the other weeks of the year; and

c. the custodial parent shall have an identical two-week period of uninterrupted time for vacation.

A parent shall notify the custodial parent at least 30 days in advance of extended parent-time or vacation weeks.

Electronic Communication: Brief telephone contact and/or virtual parent-time at least two times a week, at reasonable hours and for reasonable duration. Virtual parent time may be exercised if the equipment is reasonably available and the parents reside at least 100 miles apart, provided that if the parties cannot agree on whether the equipment is reasonably available, the court shall decide whether the equipment for virtual parent-time is reasonably available, taking into consideration the best interest of the child, each parent's ability to handle any additional expenses for virtual parent-time; and any other factors the court considers material.

Parent-time for special occasions

9. The parents will follow the schedule for special occasions below. If there is more than one child and the children's school schedules vary for purpose of a holiday, at the option of the parent exercising the holiday or the parent's half of the holiday, the children may remain together for the holiday period beginning the first evening that all children's schools are let out for the holiday and ending the evening before any child returns to school. (Utah Code 81-9-302, 303).

Parent-time transfers

10. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described

below:

The parties will make arrangements for pick up, delivery and return of the children prior to each scheduled parent-time.

Curbside transfers

11. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers are made.

Decision-making

12. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

Joint decision-making. The parents will share responsibility for making major decisions about the children. If there is a disagreement, the parents will resolve the dispute as provided in the Resolving disputes section below.

Education plan

13. The school the children will attend is based on a specific plan for where the children will attend school: **Jude shall be enrolled in a school that provides a safe, appropriate, and academically suitable environment, located in reasonable proximity to the parent with whom he primarily resides during the school week. The specific school shall be selected by mutual agreement of both parents. In the event the parents are unable to reach an agreement, the matter shall be submitted to mediation, and if still unresolved, either parent may petition the court for a final determination...**

14. Paige Nicole Fisher and Bailey Lynn Fisher has authority to check the children out of school. Paige Nicole Fisher and Bailey Lynn Fisher has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Paige Nicole Fisher.

Communication with each other

15. Parents will communicate with each other by any method.

Communication with the children

16. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

17. Parents and children may communicate with each other whenever the children choose.

- By any method

Records and information sharing

18. Both parents will have access to records and the ability to consult with providers regarding education, child care, and health care.

Travel by the children

19. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.

20. If the children will be travelling for more than 2 days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least 10 days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least 10 days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

21. Other agreements about travel by the children: **Bailey Lynn Fisher frequently visits her mother in Nevada. Paige does not need to be notified of these visits unless they interfere with her custody days.**

Child care

22. A child care provider for our children must be:

23. Other terms about child care: **Paige Nicole Fisher and Bailey Lynn Fisher will decide together who they are comfortable watching Jude if he needs to be in childcare. As of right now he is not in child care but if we do have to do that at some point we will discuss it and decide together. Both parents need to agree to who watches him, if one does not agree then we will seek other options until we come to an agreement. "If either parent is unable to personally care for Jude during their scheduled parenting time for a period exceeding two (2) hours, that parent shall offer the other parent the right of first refusal before arranging any alternative childcare. The parent receiving the offer shall respond within a reasonable time. If the other parent declines or does not respond within the agreed-upon timeframe, the parent exercising parenting time may secure appropriate childcare. All exchanges under this provision shall be conducted in a manner that prioritizes Jude's safety and best interests.**

Relocation of a parent

24. Neither parent may relocate with the minor children more than 30 miles from their current residence without a written agreement signed by the parties or further court order.

25. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other or the parents live in separate countries, costs for the children's travel expenses for parent-time will be paid by

the **the parent who moved**.

26. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

27. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

Resolving disputes

28. If the parents need to resolve a dispute regarding the children, they will discuss the issues in good faith and try to reach an agreement based on what is best for their children. If the parents are unable to agree, they will go to the following before bringing the issue to the court:

a. **Mediation**

Changing the plan

This plan remains in effect until changed. A change comes from a modification of a court order.

29. A joint physical custody arrangement may result in denial of cash assistance under the Employment Support Act, Title 35A, Chapter 3, of the Utah Code.

END OF PARENTING PLAN

Income: Petitioner (Paige Nicole Fisher) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

30. **Paige Nicole Fisher's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$2333**.

Paige Nicole Fisher receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **Paige Nicole Fisher** is employed at **Iconic Barbershop**. **Paige Nicole Fisher** earns **\$2333** gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.

Income: Respondent (Bailey Lynn Fisher) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

31. **Bailey Lynn Fisher's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$5030**.

Bailey Lynn Fisher receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **Bailey Lynn Fisher** is employed at **Sport Clips**. **Bailey Lynn Fisher** earns **\$5030** gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.

32. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Bailey Lynn Fisher** is **\$5030**.

Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)

33. It is in the best interest of the children that **Bailey Lynn Fisher** be ordered to pay child support to **Paige Nicole Fisher** as follows:

- a. **\$150.00** per month base support. This amount complies with the Utah Child Support Act.

34. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the

eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.

35. The **joint** custody worksheet was used to calculate child support.

36. The base child support amount using the joint custody calculation is **\$150** per month.

Child support reduction for extended parent-time

37. If a child lives with the non-custodial parent by court order or written agreement of the parties for:

- 25 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 50% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(a)).
- 12 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 25% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(b)).

The custodial parent's normal parent-time and holiday parent-time do not count as an interruption of the consecutive day requirement.

38. If a child receives cash assistance through the T.A.N.F. or F.E.P. programs, any agreement by the parties to reduce child support during extended parent-time must be approved by the Office of Recovery Services.

39. Child support will be paid as follows:

Bailey Lynn Fisher will give cash to Paige Nicole Fisher each month

40. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative action.

41. **Paige Nicole Fisher** and **Bailey Lynn Fisher** will each pay half of any ORS fee.

- a. If a fee is withheld from payments to **Paige Nicole Fisher**, **Bailey Lynn Fisher** will reimburse **Paige Nicole Fisher** for half the fee.

42. The parties must notify each other within 30 days of any change in their income.

43. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.

Dependent children for tax purposes

44. The parents may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes as follows:

45. **Paige Nicole Fisher** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in odd numbered years. **Bailey Lynn Fisher** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in even numbered years.

Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)

46. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

47. **Paige Nicole Fisher** must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage, such as CHIP or Medicaid.

a. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Bailey Lynn Fisher's** insurance will be primary coverage.
- **Paige Nicole Fisher's** insurance will be secondary coverage.

b. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Bailey Lynn Fisher's** spouse's insurance will be primary coverage.
- **Paige Nicole Fisher's** spouse's insurance will be secondary coverage.

c. Both parties will equally share the out-of-pocket costs of the insurance premiums.

d. Both parties will equally share all uninsured and unreimbursed medical and dental expenses that are reasonable and necessary. This includes deductibles, co-insurance, and co-payments paid by a party for the dependent children.

e. The party who pays health care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and payment within 30 days.

f. If a party does not follow this order and provide written verification, they may not be able to receive credit for health care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.

g. On or before January 2 of each year, the party ordered to maintain coverage must provide verification of coverage to the other party, and ORS, if they are involved.

h. If there is any change in coverage, within 30 days of the change the party ordered to maintain coverage must notify the other party and ORS, if they are involved.

Child care expenses (Utah Code 81-6-209)

48. Both parties will equally share all reasonable work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses.

a. The party who pays child care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and identity of the child care provider. This must be done when a provider is first hired, and any time the other party asks for the information. The party incurring or paying child care expenses must notify the other party of any change of a child care provider or monthly expense. This must be done within 30

calendar days of the change.

b. The party not directly paying for child care must pay their share of child care expenses as soon as they receive verification of the expenses.

c. If a party does **not** follow the order and provide written verification, they may not receive credit for work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.

Public assistance statement – Office of Recovery Services (ORS) (Utah Code 81-6-106(2)-(3))


