8. There are no custody, child support, or parent-time cases about **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby** and **Matthew Albert Mortenson's** minor children in any court or government agency. This includes filed, pending, and completed cases.

9. **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby** and **Matthew Albert Mortenson** have physical custody of our child(ren), and are the only people who have custody, child support, and parent-time rights to our child(ren).

### **PARENTING PLAN**

This Parenting Plan is being filed in good faith.

This parenting plan is proposed by **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby**.

#### **Children - custody**

(Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 9, Part 3)

10. It is in the children's best interest that **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby** be awarded Sole Legal and Sole Physical custody **Matthew Albert Mortenson** should have parent-time at reasonable times and places.

#### **Parent-time**

The parents will follow a custom parent-time schedule.

- a. **Matthew Mortenson has proven to be inconsistent with parent time given previously. It was given to Matthew Mortenson once every other Saturday to see Nevaeh mortenson. But he made up excuses on why he couldn't attend his once a week visit.**

#### **Parent-time for special occasions**

11. The parents will follow the schedule for special occasions below. If there is more than one child and the children's school schedules vary for purpose of a holiday, at the option of the parent exercising the holiday or the parent's half of the holiday, the children may remain together for the holiday period beginning the first evening that all children's schools are let out for the holiday and ending the evening before any child returns to school. (Utah Code 81-9-302, 303).

#### **Parent-time transfers**

12. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described below:

No arrangements can be made at this time for who will pick up, deliver and return the children for parent-time.

#### **Curbside transfers**

13. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers are made.

#### **Decision-making**

14. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

#### **Education plan**

15. The school the children will attend is based on **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby's** home residence.

16. Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby has authority to check the children out of school. Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby.

### Communication with the children

18. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

19. Parents and children may communicate with each other whenever the children choose.

- In person
- By telephone  
Parents will maintain voice mail so the children can leave and receive messages.
- By text

### Records and information sharing

20. Both parents will have access to records and the ability to consult with providers regarding education, child care, and health care.

### Travel by the children

21. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.

22. If the children will be travelling for more than 2 days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least 7 days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least 2 days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

23. Other agreements about travel by the children: **I, Rebekah Weathersby do not feel comfortable with Nevaeh Mortenson traveling anywhere with Matthew Mortenson outside the state. As he has proven to be inconsistent.**

### Child care

24. A child care provider for our children must be:

25. Other terms about child care: **Nevaeh attends at Tiger Academy due to Rebekah Weathersby being the only sole provider and having to work a full time job. I would like Matthew Mortenson to pay the out of pocket costs due to his inconsistent presence in her life.**

#### **Relocation of a parent (Utah Code 81-9-209)**

26. If either parent moves more than 149 miles from the other, the moving parent must give the non-moving parent a written Notice of Relocation. The notice must be sent at least 60 days before the planned move.

a. The written Notice of Relocation must include:

- Information about the move;
- A proposed parent-time schedule; and
- A statement that the parents will not interfere with the other parent's parent-time.

b. If the moving parent does not give the non-moving parent a Notice of Relocation, the moving parent will be in contempt of the court's order.

27. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other, or if the parents live in different countries, parent-time will be as the parties agree. If they are unable to agree, the following will be the minimum parent-time for the noncustodial parent:

#### **Relocation Schedule (Utah Code 81-9-209)**

a. in years ending in odd number, the minor children will spend the following holidays with the noncustodial parent:

- i. Thanksgiving holiday beginning Wednesday until Sunday; and
- ii. spring break, if applicable, beginning the last day of school before the holiday until the day before school resumes;

b. in years ending in an even number, the minor children will spend the following holidays with the noncustodial parent:

- i. the entire winter school break period; and
- ii. the fall school break beginning the last day of school before the holiday until the day before school resumes; and

c. extended parent-time equal to  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the summer or off-track time for consecutive weeks. The children will be returned to the custodial home no later than seven days before school begins. This week will be counted when determining the amount of parent-time to be divided between the parents for the summer or off-track period.

The parties will mutually agree on this extended time each year. If they are unable to agree, the noncustodial parent will select the dates for the extended time period.

d. One weekend per month at the option and expense of the noncustodial parent. The noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement is subject to the following restrictions.

i. If the noncustodial parent has not designated a specific weekend for parent-time, the noncustodial parent will receive the last weekend of each month unless a

holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on that particular weekend. If a holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on the last weekend of the month, the noncustodial parent will be entitled to the next to the last weekend of the month.

ii. If a noncustodial parent's extended parent-time or parent-time over a holiday extends into or through the first weekend of the next month, that weekend will be considered the noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement for that month.

iii. If a child is out of school for teacher development days or snow days after the children begin the school year, or other days not included in the list of holidays in Subsection (5) and those days are contiguous with the noncustodial parent's monthly weekend parent-time, those days will be included in the weekend parent-time.

e. The custodial parent is entitled to all parent-time not specifically allocated to the noncustodial parent.

28. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

29. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

### Changing the plan

This plan remains in effect until changed. A change comes from a modification of a court order.

## END OF PARENTING PLAN

Income: Petitioner (Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

30. **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$5343**. **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby** base child support amount using the sole custody calculation is **\$698**. **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby** receives the following gross monthly income:

a. **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby** is employed at **Keller Management**. **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby** earns **\$3953** gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.

b. **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby** has the following income from any of these sources:  
**Source: Rental income, Monthly amount: \$1,390.00**

Income: Respondent (Matthew Albert Mortenson) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

31. **Matthew Albert Mortenson's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$173**. **Matthew Albert Mortenson** receives the following gross monthly income:

a. **Matthew Albert Mortenson** is employed at **Construction**. **Matthew Albert Mortenson** earns **\$173** gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.



32. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Matthew Albert Mortenson** is **\$173**.

Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)

33. **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby** believes the guideline amount for child support is unjust, inappropriate, or not in the best interest of our children for the following reasons: **The reason(s) for deviation are absence of need of the parent to receive child support and He chooses to be an absent party in Nevaehs life he has been since she was a year old. And has not been involved with her like he should he has not been held financially accountable for her and has been incapable of handling his parent time appropriately.**

34. It is in the best interest of the children that **Matthew Albert Mortenson** be ordered to pay child support to **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby** as follows:

- a. **\$1,000.00** per month. This deviates from the Utah Uniform Child Support Guidelines.
- b. Unless the Court orders otherwise, support for each child ends when:
  - a child turns 18 or has graduated from high school during the child's normal and expected year of graduation, whichever occurs later, or
  - a child dies, marries, becomes a member of the United States armed forces, or is emancipated (Utah Code 78A-6-801).

35. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.

36. The person ordered to receive child support can request mandatory income withholding (Utah Code 62A-11 parts 4 and 5). If support is past due, the State of Utah may take federal or state tax refunds or rebates and apply the amounts to the child support owed.

- a. Withheld income will be sent to the Office of Recovery Services (ORS) until all past-due support is paid. Child support payments will be sent to:  
2540 Washington Blvd., 7th Floor Ogden, Utah 84401  
unless ORS gives notice that payments should be sent elsewhere.

37. If ORS begins mandatory income withholding, child support is due on the first day of each month and will be past due on the first day of the next month.

38. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative action.

39. **Matthew Albert Mortenson** will pay any ORS fees. If **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby** is the ORS applicant and the fees are withheld from payments to **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby**, **Matthew Albert Mortenson** will reimburse **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby**.

40. The parties must notify each other within 30 days of any change in their income.

41. The parties will do the following for child related support or expenses:
- a. Matthew Mortenson should have to help also pay daycare fee \$85 each month.

**Dependent children for tax purposes**

42. **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes.
- a. **Since Rebekah Weathersby has been the sole provider of Neveah Rose Mortenson and the present party of the child Neveah Mortenson I think it's only fair for me to be the sole tax beneficiary**

**Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)**

43. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),
44. Parents must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage, such as CHIP or Medicaid.
- a. Responsibility for child medical and dental expenses will be as follows:
  - b. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:
    - **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby's** insurance will be primary coverage.
    - **Matthew Albert Mortenson's** insurance will be secondary coverage.
  - c. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:
    - **Rebekah Anyssa Weathersby's** spouse's insurance will be primary coverage.
    - **Matthew Albert Mortenson's** spouse's insurance will be secondary coverage.
  - d. Both parties will equally share the out-of-pocket costs of the insurance premiums.
  - e. Both parties will equally share all uninsured and unreimbursed medical and dental expenses that are reasonable and necessary. This includes deductibles, co-insurance, and co-payments paid by a party for the dependent children.
  - f. The party who pays health care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and payment within 30 days.
  - g. If a party does not follow this order and provide written verification, they may not be able to receive credit for health care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.
  - h. On or before January 2 of each year, the party ordered to maintain coverage must



provide verification of coverage to the other party, and ORS, if they are involved.

i. If there is any change in coverage, within 30 days of the change the party ordered to maintain coverage must notify the other party and ORS, if they are involved.

#### Child care expenses (Utah Code 81-6-209)

45. All reasonable work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses will be paid as follows

Since Matthew Mortenson has not been present parent in Neveah Mortensons life. And I have been the sole provider of all expenses. I think it would only be fair for him to have to do child support, and pay the daycare fee each month and provide that support he's been choosing and knowingly not doing.

#### Public assistance statement – Office of Recovery Services (ORS) (Utah Code 81-6-106(2)-(3))

46. Neither party has received or is receiving public assistance from the State of Utah.

#### Additional provisions

47. The parties will adhere to the following additional provisions:

a.

**Additional Provision: If Matthew Mortenson chooses and knowingly continues to be an absent father I would like all Daycare, child support and all filling fees, court fees paid by Matthew Mortenson as he has chosen to be an absent father to our child and held financially accountable for his daughter**

#### Duty to sign documents

48. The parties will sign all documents necessary to comply with the parentage decree within 60 days from entry of the decree. If a party fails to sign a document within 60 days, the other party may ask the court to appoint someone to sign the document. (Utah Rule of Civil Procedure 70)
