## Children – Other court proceedings

(Utah Rule of Civil Procedure 100; Utah Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act, UCCJEA, Utah Code 81-11-101 et seq.; Utah Uniform Interstate Family support Act, UIFSA, Utah Code 81-8-102 et seq.)

I say the following:

5. There are no custody, child support, or parent-time cases about **Deidra Juengel** and **Joshua Juengel**'s minor children in any court or government agency. This includes filed, pending, and completed cases.
6. **Deidra Juengel** and **Joshua Juengel** have physical custody of our child(ren), and are the only people who have custody, child support, and parent-time rights to our child(ren).

## PARENTING PLAN

This Parenting Plan is being filed in good faith.

This parenting plan is agreed to by **Deidra Juengel** and **Joshua Juengel**.

### Children - custody

(Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 9, Part 3)

7. It is in the children's best interest that **Deidra Juengel** be awarded Sole Legal and Sole Physical custody **Joshua Juengel** should have parent-time at reasonable times and places.

The parents will follow a custom parent-time schedule.

- a. **Deidra Juengel requests to have sole legal and physical custody of all children for safety purposes. Deidra Juengel requests that Joshua Juengel have supervised visitation.**

### Parent-time for special occasions

8. The parents will follow the schedule for special occasions below. If there is more than one child and the children's school schedules vary for purpose of a holiday, at the option of the parent exercising the holiday or the parent's half of the holiday, the children may remain together for the holiday period beginning the first evening that all children's schools are let out for the holiday and ending the evening before any child returns to school. (Utah Code 81-9-302, 303).

### Parent-time transfers

9. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described below:

The parties will make arrangements for pick up, delivery and return of the children prior to each scheduled parent-time.

### Curbside transfers

10. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers are made.

### Decision-making

11. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

### Education plan

12. The school the children will attend is based on **Deidra Juengel's** home residence.

13. Deidra Juengel has authority to check the children out of school. Deidra Juengel has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Deidra Juengel.

### Communication with the children



15. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

16. Parents and children may communicate with each other:

- At any reasonable times:
- Weekends between **08:00 AM and 08:00 PM.**
- Holidays between **08:00 AM and 09:00 PM.**
- School days **02:00 PM and 08:00 PM.**
- School vacation days **08:00 AM and 08:00 PM.**
- By telephone  
Parents will maintain voice mail so the children can leave and receive messages.
- By text

17. Other terms about communication with the children: **In-person communication is accepted but only if Deidra Juengel is present and Joshua Juengel gives prior notice.**

#### Records and information sharing

18. Other terms regarding records and information sharing:

**Deidra Juengel requests that she be the only parent with permission to access said records.**

#### Travel by the children

19. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.

20. If the children will be travelling for more than **2** days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least **14** days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least **5** days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

#### Child care

21. A child care provider for our children must be:

A relative, friend, or neighbor.

#### Relocation of a parent (Utah Code 81-9-209)

22. If either parent moves more than 149 miles from the other, the moving parent must give the non-moving parent a written Notice of Relocation. The notice must be sent at least 60 days before the planned move.

a. The written Notice of Relocation must include:



- Information about the move;
  - A proposed parent-time schedule; and
  - A statement that the parents will not interfere with the other parent's parent-time.
- b. If the moving parent does not give the non-moving parent a Notice of Relocation, the moving parent will be in contempt of the court's order.
23. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other, or if the parents live in different countries, parent-time will be as the parties agree. If they are unable to agree, the following will be the minimum parent-time for the noncustodial parent:

**Relocation Schedule (Utah Code 81-9-209)**

- a. in years ending in odd number, the minor children will spend the following holidays with the noncustodial parent:
  - i. Thanksgiving holiday beginning Wednesday until Sunday; and
  - ii. spring break, if applicable, beginning the last day of school before the holiday until the day before school resumes;
- b. in years ending in an even number, the minor children will spend the following holidays with the noncustodial parent:
  - i. the entire winter school break period; and
  - ii. the fall school break beginning the last day of school before the holiday until the day before school resumes; and
- c. extended parent-time equal to  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the summer or off-track time for consecutive weeks. The children will be returned to the custodial home no later than seven days before school begins. This week will be counted when determining the amount of parent-time to be divided between the parents for the summer or off-track period. The parties will mutually agree on this extended time each year. If they are unable to agree, the noncustodial parent will select the dates for the extended time period.
- d. One weekend per month at the option and expense of the noncustodial parent. The noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement is subject to the following restrictions.
  - i. If the noncustodial parent has not designated a specific weekend for parent-time, the noncustodial parent will receive the last weekend of each month unless a holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on that particular weekend. If a holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on the last weekend of the month, the noncustodial parent will be entitled to the next to the last weekend of the month.
  - ii. If a noncustodial parent's extended parent-time or parent-time over a holiday extends into or through the first weekend of the next month, that weekend will be considered the noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement for that month.
  - iii. If a child is out of school for teacher development days or snow days after the children begin the school year, or other days not included in the list of holidays in Subsection (5) and those days are contiguous with the noncustodial parent's monthly weekend parent-time, those days will be included in the weekend parent-time.
- e. The custodial parent is entitled to all parent-time not specifically allocated to the



noncustodial parent.

24. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other or the parents live in separate countries, costs for the children's travel expenses for parent-time will be paid by **the the parent who moved**.

25. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

26. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

### Changing the plan

This plan remains in effect until changed. A change comes from a modification of a court order.

## END OF PARENTING PLAN

Income: Petitioner (Deidra Juengel) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

27. **Deidra Juengel's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$3857**.

**Deidra Juengel** base child support amount using the **sole** custody calculation is **\$806**.

**Deidra Juengel** receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **Deidra Juengel** is employed at **Utah State Developmental Center**. **Deidra Juengel** earns **\$3857** gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.
- b. **Deidra Juengel** receives **\$753** per month in public benefits from a housing subsidy program, the Job Training Partnership Act, Supplemental Security Income, Social Security Disability Insurance, Medicaid, SNAP, General Assistance, or other similar means-tested welfare benefits. This income does not count for child support purposes, (Utah Code 81-6-203(7)).
- c. **Deidra Juengel** has other children that are not in common to both parties and who are not part of this case. **\$573.00** may be subtracted from their gross monthly income for the child support calculation based on a Child Support Obligation Worksheet - Parent's Home Worksheet.

Income: Respondent (Joshua Juengel) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

28. **Joshua Juengel's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$1257**.

**Joshua Juengel** receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **Joshua Juengel** has no recent work history. The court should consider **Joshua Juengel's** wage to be the federal minimum wage of **\$7.25** an hour. This is a gross monthly income of **\$1257**. (Utah Code 81-6-203(6)(c) and (d))
- b. **Joshua Juengel** receives **\$1510** per month in public benefits from a housing subsidy program, the Job Training Partnership Act, Supplemental Security Income, Social



Security Disability Insurance, Medicaid, SNAP, General Assistance, or other similar means-tested welfare benefits. This income does not count for child support purposes, (Utah Code 81-6-203(7)).

29. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Joshua Juengel** is **\$1257**.

Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)

30. **Deidra Juengel** believes the guideline amount for child support is unjust, inappropriate, or not in the best interest of our children for the following reasons:

**The reason(s) for deviation are Deidra Juengel is the beneficiary for the children's SSDI payment through Joshua Juengel. Deidra Juengel requests to keep this as child support..**

31. It is in the best interest of the children that **Joshua Juengel** be ordered to pay child support to **Deidra Juengel** as follows:

- a. **\$753.00** per month. This deviates from the Utah Uniform Child Support Guidelines.
- b. Unless the Court orders otherwise, support for each child ends when:
  - a child turns 18 or has graduated from high school during the child's normal and expected year of graduation, whichever occurs later, or
  - a child dies, marries, becomes a member of the United States armed forces, or is emancipated (Utah Code 78A-6-801).

32. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.

33. **Deidra Juengel** will give **Joshua Juengel** the information needed to set up direct deposit through **Joshua Juengel's** employer. Once **Joshua Juengel** has the information, **Joshua Juengel** will have **Joshua Juengel's** employer set up direct deposit to an account of **Deidra Juengel's** choice. One half of the child support is due by the 5th of each month, and the other half is due by the 20th of each month.

34. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative action.

35. **Deidra Juengel** and **Joshua Juengel** will each pay half of any ORS fee.

- a. If a fee is withheld from payments to **Deidra Juengel**, **Joshua Juengel** will reimburse **Deidra Juengel** for half the fee.

36. The parties must notify each other within 30 days of any change in their income.

37. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.



## Dependent children for tax purposes

38. **Deidra Juengel** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes.

## Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)

39. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

40. **Deidra Juengel** must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage, such as CHIP or Medicaid.

a. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Deidra Juengel's** insurance will be primary coverage.
- **Joshua Juengel's** insurance will be secondary coverage.

b. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Deidra Juengel's** spouse's insurance will be primary coverage.
- **Joshua Juengel's** spouse's insurance will be secondary coverage.

c. Both parties will equally share the out-of-pocket costs of the insurance premiums.

d. Both parties will equally share all uninsured and unreimbursed medical and dental expenses that are reasonable and necessary. This includes deductibles, co-insurance, and co-payments paid by a party for the dependent children.

e. The party who pays health care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and payment within 30 days.

f. If a party does not follow this order and provide written verification, they may not be able to receive credit for health care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.

g. On or before January 2 of each year, the party ordered to maintain coverage must provide verification of coverage to the other party, and ORS, if they are involved.

h. If there is any change in coverage, within 30 days of the change the party ordered to maintain coverage must notify the other party and ORS, if they are involved.

## Debts

47. Each party will be ordered to assume and pay debts as follows. The party assuming the debt must put the debt in their name and pay it. If they can't put the debt in their name, they must still pay it. If a party pays a debt they are not responsible for, they can recover that amount from the responsible party.

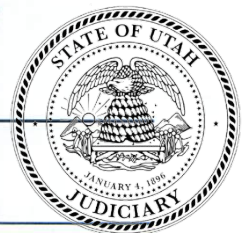


