Children - custody

7. It is in the children's best interest that the parties be awarded Joint Legal and Joint Physical Custody. **Irene Branz** is filing this Parenting Plan and verifies the plan is filed in good faith.

8. The children should reside in **Irene Branz's** home **183** overnights each year and in **Jordon R Branz's** home **182** overnights each year.

Parent-time

9. The parents will follow a custom parent-time schedule:

The parents will follow a custom parent-time schedule.

a. **Parent time will be based on parent's work schedule. Parents have agreed that they will have Ace Branz on Friday, Saturday and Sunday every other weekend. They also agreed the consecutive number of overnights that Ace will spend with each parent will not exceed three nights (Except for vacation time and during the ROFR situations). Parent-time transfers

11. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described below:

The parties will make arrangements for pick up, delivery and return of the children prior to each scheduled parent-time.

Curbside transfers

12. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers are made.

Decision-making

13. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

Joint decision-making. The parents will share responsibility for making major decisions about the children. If there is a disagreement, the parents will resolve the dispute as provided in the Resolving disputes section below.

Education plan

14. The school the children will attend is based on a specific plan for where the children will attend school: **Whatever school both parents decide. Parents agree that Ace Branz will attend an immersion Spanish program at the school he is enrolled in so he can learn how to speak, write and read in Spanish. Irene Branz and Jordon Branz (parents) will pick up Ace Branz from school unless neither of both parents are able to pick up Ace Branz. Parent A will give the option to parent B to pick up Ace Branz from school if they are not able to at the time. The Right of First Refusal will also apply in this situations. Irene Branz and Jordon Branz also agree that both parents will be allowed to attend any sport activity, school activity or extra curricular activity that Ace Branz is enrolled in, regardless of which parent has Ace Branz during that overnight. .**

15. Irene Branz and Jordon R Branz has authority to check the children out of school. Irene Branz and Jordon R Branz has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Irene Branz.

Communication with each other

16. Parents will communicate with each other by any method.

Communication with the children

17. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

18. Parents and children may communicate with each other whenever the children choose.

- By any method

19. Other terms about communication with the children: **Both parents can communicate with the child at any time they need to. If the child asks to communicate with either parent at any time they will be allowed to do so by the parent they are with at the time.**

Records and information sharing

20. Both parents will have access to records and the ability to consult with providers regarding education, child care, and health care.

Travel by the children

21. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.
22. If the children will be travelling for more than 5 days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least 30 days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least 5 days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.
23. Other agreements about travel by the children: **Ace Branz has a passport. Irene Branz is originally from Spain and travels to Spain at least once a year to see her family. Jordon Branz will agree to renew Ace Branz's passport whenever necessary and he will agree to sign the travel permit for Ace Branz. Jordon Branz also agrees for Irene Branz to take Ace Branz to Spain, with short notice, in the event there is an emergency in Spain regarding Irene Branz and Ace Branz's family in Spain. Jordon Branz also agrees to assist with Ace Branz obtaining his Spanish citizenship. Irene Branz also agrees to allow Jordon Branz to travel outside of the country with Ace Branz. Irene Branz agrees to assist with renewing Ace Branz's passport and signing the travel form.**

Child care

24. A child care provider for our children must be:
- A licensed child care provider.
 - A relative, friend, or neighbor.

Relocation of a parent (Utah Code 81-9-209)

25. If either parent moves more than 149 miles from the other, the moving parent must give the non-moving parent a written Notice of Relocation. The notice must be sent at least 60 days before the planned move.
- a. The written Notice of Relocation must include:
 - Information about the move;
 - A proposed parent-time schedule; and
 - A statement that the parents will not interfere with the other parent's parent-time.
 - b. If the moving parent does not give the non-moving parent a Notice of Relocation, the moving parent will be in contempt of the court's order.
26. ~~If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other, or if the parents live~~ a different countries, parent-time will be as the parties agree. If they are unable to agree, the following will be the minimum parent-time for the noncustodial parent:

Relocation Schedule (Utah Code 81-9-209)

- a. in years ending in odd number, the minor children will spend the following holidays with the noncustodial parent:

- i. Thanksgiving holiday beginning Wednesday until Sunday; and
- ii. spring break, if applicable, beginning the last day of school before the holiday until the day before school resumes;
- b. in years ending in an even number, the minor children will spend the following holidays with the noncustodial parent:
 - i. the entire winter school break period; and
 - ii. the fall school break beginning the last day of school before the holiday until the day before school resumes; and
- c. extended parent-time equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ of the summer or off-track time for consecutive weeks. The children will be returned to the custodial home no later than seven days before school begins. This week will be counted when determining the amount of parent-time to be divided between the parents for the summer or off-track period. The parties will mutually agree on this extended time each year. If they are unable to agree, the noncustodial parent will select the dates for the extended time period.
- d. One weekend per month at the option and expense of the noncustodial parent. The noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement is subject to the following restrictions.
 - i. If the noncustodial parent has not designated a specific weekend for parent-time, the noncustodial parent will receive the last weekend of each month unless a holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on that particular weekend. If a holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on the last weekend of the month, the noncustodial parent will be entitled to the next to the last weekend of the month.
 - ii. If a noncustodial parent's extended parent-time or parent-time over a holiday extends into or through the first weekend of the next month, that weekend will be considered the noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement for that month.
 - iii. If a child is out of school for teacher development days or snow days after the children begin the school year, or other days not included in the list of holidays in Subsection (5) and those days are contiguous with the noncustodial parent's monthly weekend parent-time, those days will be included in the weekend parent-time.
- e. The custodial parent is entitled to all parent-time not specifically allocated to the noncustodial parent.

27. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other or the parents live in separate countries, costs for the children's travel expenses for parent-time will be paid by **the parent who moved.**

28. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

29. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

Resolving disputes

30. If the parents need to resolve a dispute regarding the children, they will discuss the issues in good faith and try to reach an agreement based on what is best for their children. If the parents are unable to agree, they will go to the following before bringing the issue to the court:

a. **Mediation**

Changing the plan

This plan remains in effect until changed. A change comes from a modification of a court order.

31. A joint physical custody arrangement may result in denial of cash assistance under the Employment Support Act, Title 35A, Chapter 3, of the Utah Code.

END OF PARENTING PLAN

32. **Irene Branz's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$7358**. **Irene Branz** receives the following gross monthly income:

33. **Jordon R Branz's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$7270**. **Jordon R Branz** receives the following gross monthly income:

34. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Jordon R Branz** is **\$7270**.

Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)

35. **Irene Branz** believes the guideline amount for child support is unjust, inappropriate, or not in the best interest of our children for the following reasons:

The reason(s) for deviation are Both Irene Branz and Jordon Branz are in Law Enforcement and they get paid relatively the same. We agreed to keep our own salaries and retirement..

36. It is in the best interest of the parties' children that neither party be ordered to pay child support to the other. This deviates from the Utah Uniform Child Support Guidelines.

a. Unless the Court orders otherwise, support for each child ends when:

- a child turns 18 or has graduated from high school during the child's normal and expected year of graduation, whichever occurs later, or
- a child dies, marries, becomes a member of the United States armed forces, or is emancipated (Utah Code 78A-6-801).

37. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.

38. Child support will be paid as follows:

The payment amount of \$12/month is negligible. The amount would be consumed in processing fees from the banks. Therefore, Jordon Branz does not need to pay the amount of \$12/monthly to Irene Branz.

39. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative action.

40. **Irene Branz and Jordon R Branz** will each pay half of any ORS fee.

a. If a fee is withheld from payments to **Irene Branz, Jordon R Branz** will reimburse **Irene Branz** for half the fee.

41. The parties must notify each other within 30 days of any change in their income.

42. The parties will do the following for child related support or expenses:

a. The payment in the amount of \$12/month for child support is negligible. The amount would be consumed in processing fees from the banks. Therefore, Jordon Branz does not need to pay the amount of \$12/month in child support to Irene Branz.

43. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.

Dependent children for tax purposes

44. The parents may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes as follows:

45. **Jordon R Branz** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in odd numbered years. **Irene Branz** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in even numbered years.

Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)

46. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

47. Both parents must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage, such as CHIP or Medicaid.

a. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Irene Branz's** insurance will be primary coverage.

 - h. If there is any change in coverage, within 30 days of the change the party ordered to maintain coverage must notify the other party and ORS, if they are involved.

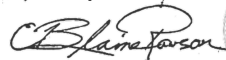

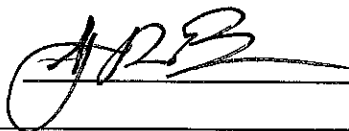

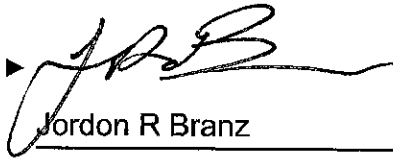
