I say the following:

5. There are no custody, child support, or parent-time cases about **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias** and **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena**'s minor children in any court or government agency. This includes filed, pending, and completed cases.
6. **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias** and **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena** have physical custody of our child(ren), and are the only people who have custody, child support, and parent-time rights to our child(ren).

PARENTING PLAN

This Parenting Plan is being filed in good faith.

This parenting plan is agreed to by **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias** and **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena**.

Children - custody

(Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 9, Part 3)

7. It is in the children's best interest that the parties be awarded Joint Legal and Joint Physical Custody. **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias** is filing this Parenting Plan and verifies the plan is filed in good faith.

8. The children should reside in **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias**'s home **145** overnights each year and in **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena**'s home **220** overnights each year.

9. The parents will follow the parent-time schedule in the statute(s).

Children 5-18 (expanded schedule) (Utah Code 81-9-303)

Weekday parent-time will be Tuesday. (81-9-303)

On school days: Parent-time begins when school is regularly dismissed and ends the following day upon delivering the child to school, or at 8:30 p.m. the following day if there is no school. (Utah Code 81-9-303)

On days when school is not in session: Parent-time begins at 5:30 p.m. and ends the following day upon delivering the child to school, or at 8:30 p.m. if there is no school. (Utah Code 81-9-303)

Parent-time for special occasions

10. The parents will follow the schedule for special occasions below. If there is more than one child and the children's school schedules vary for purpose of a holiday, at the option of the parent exercising the holiday or the parent's half of the holiday, the children may remain together for the holiday period beginning the first evening that all children's schools are let out for the holiday and ending the evening before any child returns to school. Parent-time transfers

11. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described below:

The parties will make arrangements for pick up, delivery and return of the children prior to each scheduled parent-time.

Curbside transfers

12. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers are made.

Decision-making

13. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

Joint decision-making. The parents will share responsibility for making major decisions about the children. If there is a disagreement, the parents will resolve the dispute as provided in the Resolving disputes section below.

Education plan

14. The school the children will attend is based on **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena's** home residence.

15. Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias and Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena has authority to check the children out of school. Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias and Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena.

Communication with each other

16. Parents will communicate with each other by any method.

Communication with the children

17. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

18. Parents and children may communicate with each other whenever the children choose.

- By any method

Records and information sharing

19. Both parents will have access to records and the ability to consult with providers regarding education, child care, and health care.

Travel by the children

20. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.

21. If the children will be travelling for more than **30 days** days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least **7 days** days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least **7 days** days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

Child care

22. A child care provider for our children must be:

A relative, friend, or neighbor.

Over the age of **18**.

Relocation of a parent

23. Neither parent may relocate with the minor children more than **30** miles from their current residence without a written agreement signed by the parties or further court order.

24. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other or the parents live in separate countries, costs for the children's travel expenses for parent-time will be paid by **the the parent who moved, except one-half of the expenses for the summer or off-track time will be paid by the other parent.**

25. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

26. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

Resolving disputes

27. If the parents need to resolve a dispute regarding the children, they will discuss the issues in good faith and try to reach an agreement based on what is best for their children. If the parents are unable to agree, they will go to the following before bringing the issue to the court:

a. **Mediation**

Changing the plan

This plan remains in effect until changed. A change comes from a modification of a court order.

28. A joint physical custody arrangement may result in denial of cash assistance under the Employment Support Act, Title 35A, Chapter 3, of the Utah Code.

END OF PARENTING PLAN

Income: Petitioner (Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

29. **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$4247**. **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias** receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias** is employed at **Intermountain Health Care**. **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias** earns **\$4247** gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.

Income: Respondent (Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

30. **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$3727**. **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena** receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena** is employed at **Intermountain Healthcare**. **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena** earns **\$3727** gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.

31. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena** is **\$3727**.

Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)

32. It is in the best interest of the children that **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias** be ordered to pay child support to **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena** as follows:

- a. **\$320.00** per month base support. This amount complies with the Utah Child Support

Act.

33. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.

34. The **joint** custody worksheet was used to calculate child support.

35. The base child support amount using the joint custody calculation is **\$320** per month.

Child support reduction for extended parent-time

36. If a child lives with the non-custodial parent by court order or written agreement of the parties for:

- 25 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 50% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(a)).
- 12 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 25% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(b)).

The custodial parent's normal parent-time and holiday parent-time do not count as an interruption of the consecutive day requirement.

37. If a child receives cash assistance through the T.A.N.F. or F.E.P. programs, any agreement by the parties to reduce child support during extended parent-time must be approved by the Office of Recovery Services.

38. Child support will be paid as follows:

Child support will be paid every other Monday Zelle transaction

39. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative action.

40. **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias and Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena** will each pay half of any ORS fee.

- a. If a fee is withheld from payments to **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena**, **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias** will reimburse **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena** for half the fee.

41. The parties must notify each other within 30 days of any change in their income.

42. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.

Dependent children for tax purposes

43. The parents may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes as follows:

44. **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias** may claim the parties' children as

dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in odd numbered years. **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in even numbered years.

Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)

45. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

46. **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias** must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage, such as CHIP or Medicaid.

- a. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:
 - **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias's** insurance will be primary coverage.
 - **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena's** insurance will be secondary coverage.
- b. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:
 - **Jesse Eric Catalan Covarrubias's** spouse's insurance will be primary coverage.
 - **Danielys Del valle Martinez Marchena's** spouse's insurance will be secondary coverage.
- c. Both parties will equally share the out-of-pocket costs of the insurance premiums.
- d. Both parties will equally share all uninsured and unreimbursed medical and dental expenses that are reasonable and necessary. This includes deductibles, co-insurance, and co-payments paid by a party for the dependent children.
- e. The party who pays health care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and payment within 30 days.
- f. If a party does not follow this order and provide written verification, they may not be able to receive credit for health care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.
- g. On or before January 2 of each year, the party ordered to maintain coverage must provide verification of coverage to the other party, and ORS, if they are involved.
- h. If there is any change in coverage, within 30 days of the change the party ordered to maintain coverage must notify the other party and ORS, if they are involved.

Child care expenses (Utah Code 81-6-209)

47. Both parties will equally share all reasonable work, career, or occupational training-

related child care expenses.

- a. The party who pays child care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and identity of the child care provider. This must be done when a provider is first hired, and any time the other party asks for the information.
