6. It is in the children's best interest that the parties be awarded Joint Legal and Joint Physical Custody. **jesus omar arriaga** is filing this Parenting Plan and verifies the plan is filed in good faith.

7. The children should reside in **jesus omar arriaga's** home **183** overnights each year and in **chantelle valentina arriaga's** home **182** overnights each year.

8. Parent-time will be equal between the parties. (Utah Code 81-9-305 and 81-6-206(7))

### **Parent-time transfers**

11. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described below:

The parties will make arrangements for pick up, delivery and return of the children prior to each scheduled parent-time.

### **Curbside transfers**

12. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers are made.

### **Decision-making**

13. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are

caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

**Sole decision-making.**

14. Both Jesus Omar Arriaga and Chantelle Valentina Arriaga will make decisions about education together.

15. Both Jesus Omar Arriaga and Chantelle Valentina Arriaga will make decisions about health care together.

16. Both Jesus Omar Arriaga and Chantelle Valentina Arriaga will make decisions about religion together.

**Education plan**

17. The school the children will attend is based on a specific plan for where the children will attend school: **find a school that meets both homes in the middle .**

18. Jesus Omar Arriaga and Chantelle Valentina Arriaga has authority to check the children out of school. Jesus Omar Arriaga and Chantelle Valentina Arriaga has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Jesus Omar Arriaga.

**Communication with each other**

19. Parents will communicate with each other by:

**Communication with the children**

20. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

21. Parents and children may communicate with each other whenever the children choose.

- By telephone

Parents will maintain voice mail so the children can leave and receive messages.

- By text

**Records and information sharing**

22. Both parents will have access to records and the ability to consult with providers regarding education, child care, and health care.

## Travel by the children

23. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.

24. If the children will be travelling for more than 3 days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least 15 days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least 15 days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

## Child care

25. A child care provider for our children must be:

A licensed child care provider.

A relative, friend, or neighbor.

Over the age of 15.

## Relocation of a parent (Utah Code 81-9-209)

26. If either parent moves more than 149 miles from the other, the moving parent must give the non-moving parent a written Notice of Relocation. The notice must be sent at least 60 days before the planned move.

a. The written Notice of Relocation must include:

- Information about the move;
- A proposed parent-time schedule; and
- A statement that the parents will not interfere with the other parent's parent-time.

b. If the moving parent does not give the non-moving parent a Notice of Relocation, the moving parent will be in contempt of the court's order.

27. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other, or if the parents live a different countries, parent-time will be as the parties agree. If they are unable to agree, the following will be the minimum parent-time for the noncustodial parent:

## Relocation Schedule (Utah Code 81-9-209)

a. in years ending in odd number, the minor children will spend the following holidays with the noncustodial parent:

i. Thanksgiving holiday beginning Wednesday until Sunday; and

ii. spring break, if applicable, beginning the last day of school before the holiday until the day before school resumes;

b. in years ending in an even number, the minor children will spend the following holidays with the noncustodial parent:

i. the entire winter school break period; and

ii. the fall school break beginning the last day of school before the holiday until the day before school resumes; and

c. extended parent-time equal to ½ of the summer or off-track time for consecutive

weeks. The children will be returned to the custodial home no later than seven days before school begins. This week will be counted when determining the amount of parent-time to be divided between the parents for the summer or off-track period.

The parties will mutually agree on this extended time each year. If they are unable to agree, the noncustodial parent will select the dates for the extended time period.

d. One weekend per month at the option and expense of the noncustodial parent. The noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement is subject to the following restrictions.

i. If the noncustodial parent has not designated a specific weekend for parent-time, the noncustodial parent will receive the last weekend of each month unless a holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on that particular weekend. If a holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on the last weekend of the month, the noncustodial parent will be entitled to the next to the last weekend of the month.

ii. If a noncustodial parent's extended parent-time or parent-time over a holiday extends into or through the first weekend of the next month, that weekend will be considered the noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement for that month.

iii. If a child is out of school for teacher development days or snow days after the children begin the school year, or other days not included in the list of holidays in Subsection (5) and those days are contiguous with the noncustodial parent's monthly weekend parent-time, those days will be included in the weekend parent-time.

e. The custodial parent is entitled to all parent-time not specifically allocated to the noncustodial parent.

28. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other or the parents live in separate countries, costs for the children's travel expenses for parent-time will be paid by **the the parent who moved**.

29. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

30. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

## **Resolving disputes**

31. If the parents need to resolve a dispute regarding the children, they will discuss the issues in good faith and try to reach an agreement based on what is best for their children. If the parents are unable to agree, they will go to the following before bringing the issue to the court:

### **a. Mediation**

## **Changing the plan**

This plan remains in effect until changed. A change comes from a modification of a court order.

32. A joint physical custody arrangement may result in denial of cash assistance under the Employment Support Act, Title 35A, Chapter 3, of the Utah Code.

## END OF PARENTING PLAN

Income: Petitioner (jesus omar arriaga) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

33. **jesus omar arriaga's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$0**. **jesus omar arriaga** receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **jesus omar arriaga** does not have any countable income from any source.

Income: Respondent (chantelle valentina arriaga) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

34. **chantelle valentina arriaga's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$7300**. **chantelle valentina arriaga** receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **chantelle valentina arriaga** is employed at **only fans**. **chantelle valentina arriaga** earns **\$3000** gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.
- b. **chantelle valentina arriaga** has other children that are not in common to both parties and who are not part of this case. **\$876.00** may be subtracted from their gross monthly income for the child support calculation based on a Child Support Obligation Worksheet - Parent's Home Worksheet.

35. The adjusted gross monthly income for **chantelle valentina arriaga** is **\$6424**.

Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)

36. It is in the best interest of the children that **chantelle valentina arriaga** be ordered to pay child support to **jesus omar arriaga** as follows:

- a. **\$394.00** per month base support. This amount complies with the Utah Child Support Act.

37. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.

38. The **joint** custody worksheet was used to calculate child support.

39. The base child support amount using the joint custody calculation is **\$394** per month.

### Child support reduction for extended parent-time

40. If a child lives with the non-custodial parent by court order or written agreement of the parties for:

- 25 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 50% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(a)).
- 12 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 25% for each child

who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(b)). The custodial parent's normal parent-time and holiday parent-time do not count as an interruption of the consecutive day requirement.

41. If a child receives cash assistance through the T.A.N.F. or F.E.P. programs, any agreement by the parties to reduce child support during extended parent-time must be approved by the Office of Recovery Services.

42. Child support will be paid as follows:

**cash, check or bank transfer I am not asking for any payments**

43. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative action.

44. **jesus omar arriaga** and **chantelle valentina arriaga** will each pay half of any ORS fee.

a. If a fee is withheld from payments to **jesus omar arriaga**, **chantelle valentina arriaga** will reimburse **jesus omar arriaga** for half the fee.

45. The parties must notify each other within 30 days of any change in their income.

46. The parties will do the following for child related support or expenses:

a. i do not wish to receive child support from chantelle.

47. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.

## Dependent children for tax purposes

48. The parents may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes as follows:

49. **chantelle valentina arriaga** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in odd numbered years. **jesus omar arriaga** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in even numbered years.

## Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)

50. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

51. The parent who is able to obtain the most affordable medical, hospital, and dental insurance for the dependent children must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage,

such as CHIP or Medicaid.

- a. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:
  - **chantelle valentina arriaga's** insurance will be primary coverage.
  - **jesus omar arriaga's** insurance will be secondary coverage.
- b. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:
  - **chantelle valentina arriaga's** spouse's insurance will be primary coverage.
  - **jesus omar arriaga's** spouse's insurance will be secondary coverage.
- c. Both parties will equally share the out-of-pocket costs of the insurance premiums.
- d. Both parties will equally share all uninsured and unreimbursed medical and dental expenses that are reasonable and necessary. This includes deductibles, co-insurance, and co-payments paid by a party for the dependent children.
- e. The party who pays health care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and payment within 30 days.
- f. If a party does not follow this order and provide written verification, they may not be able to receive credit for health care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.
- g. On or before January 2 of each year, the party ordered to maintain coverage must provide verification of coverage to the other party, and ORS, if they are involved.
- h. If there is any change in coverage, within 30 days of the change the party ordered to maintain coverage must notify the other party and ORS, if they are involved.

55. The parties are not aware of any debts from the marriage. If any debts exist, each debt will be the responsibility of the party who incurred the debt.

59. The parties will sign all documents necessary to comply with the divorce decree within 60 days from entry of the decree. If a party fails to sign a document within 60 days, the other party may ask the court to appoint someone to sign the document. (Utah Rule of Civil Procedure 70)
