This matter comes before the court on Petitioner's motion for entry. Petitioner is represented by counsel, Braden D. Ellis. Having entered the Respondent's Default in this matter, and entered Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the court now enters as follows:

1. Petitioner is awarded a Decree of Divorce from Respondent.
2. The parties have no minor children together, and none are expected.
3. Neither party should be awarded alimony now or hereafter.
4. The parties own no real estate between them.
5. Each party shall be awarded the retirement account in his or her name free of any claim from the other party.
6. Each party should be awarded the property in his or her possession as his or her separate property free of any claim from the other party.
7. Simran shall be awarded the bank accounts held in her sole name as her separate property free of any claim by Ryan.

8. Ryan shall be awarded the bank accounts held in his sole name as his separate property free of any claim by Simran.
9. Each party shall awarded any retirement account in their own respective name free of any claim from the other party.
10. Each party waives his or her claim on any account held by the other party.
11. Each party will maintain all debts that are in his or her name and shall hold the other party harmless on those debts.
12. The parties' insurance shall be divided, with each party being responsible for his or her own insurance once this divorce is finalized.
13. Each party shall be required to execute and deliver any documents necessary to implement the terms of the decree of divorce.
