I say the following:

5. There are no custody, child support, or parent-time cases about **Paul A Benites Correa** and **Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas**'s minor children in any court or government agency. This includes filed, pending, and completed cases.
6. **Paul A Benites Correa** and **Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas** have physical custody of our child(ren), and are the only people who have custody, child support, and parent-time rights to our child(ren).

## PARENTING PLAN

This Parenting Plan is being filed in good faith.

This parenting plan is agreed to by **Paul A Benites Correa** and **Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas**.

### Children - custody

(Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 9, Part 3)

7. It is in the children's best interest that the parties be awarded Joint Legal and Joint Physical Custody. **Paul A Benites Correa** is filing this Parenting Plan and verifies the plan is filed in good faith.
8. The children should reside in **Paul A Benites Correa**'s home **182** overnights each year and in **Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas**'s home **183** overnights each year.
9. Parent-time will be equal between the parties. (Utah Code 81-9-305 and 81-6-206(7))
10. The chart below shows how this schedule will function.

### **Parent-time transfers**

12. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described below:

The parties will make arrangements for pick up, delivery and return of the children prior to each scheduled parent-time.

### **Curbside transfers**

13. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers are made.

### **Decision-making**

14. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

**Joint decision-making.** The parents will share responsibility for making major decisions about the children. If there is a disagreement, the parents will resolve the dispute as provided in the Resolving disputes section below.

### **Education plan**

15. The school the children will attend is based on **Paul A Benites Correa's** home residence.

16. Paul A Benites Correa and Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas has authority to check the children out of school. Paul A Benites Correa and Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Paul A Benites Correa.

### **Communication with each other**

17. Parents will communicate with each other by any method.

### **Communication with the children**

18. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

19. Parents and children may communicate with each other whenever the children choose.

- By any method

## Records and information sharing

20. Both parents will have access to records and the ability to consult with providers regarding education, child care, and health care.

## Travel by the children

21. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.

22. If the children will be travelling for more than **30** days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least **3** days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least **3** days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

## Child care

23. A child care provider for our children must be:

- A licensed child care provider.
- A relative, friend, or neighbor.

## Relocation of a parent

24. Neither parent may relocate with the minor children more than **20** miles from their current residence without a written agreement signed by the parties or further court order.

25. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

26. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

## Resolving disputes

27. If the parents need to resolve a dispute regarding the children, they will discuss the issues in good faith and try to reach an agreement based on what is best for their children. If the parents are unable to agree, they will go to the following before bringing the issue to the court:

**a. Mediation**

**Changing the plan**

This plan remains in effect until changed. A change comes from a modification of a court order.

28. A joint physical custody arrangement may result in denial of cash assistance under the Employment Support Act, Title 35A, Chapter 3, of the Utah Code.

**END OF PARENTING PLAN**

**Income: Petitioner (Paul A Benites Correa) (Utah Code 81-6-203)**

29. **Paul A Benites Correa's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$7083**. **Paul A Benites Correa** receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **Paul A Benites Correa** is employed at **Pb painting**. **Paul A Benites Correa** earns **\$7083** gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.
- b. **Paul A Benites Correa** is ordered to pay **\$1,000.00** per month in child support for children not part of this case. This amount is subtracted from their gross monthly income for the child support calculation.

**Income: Respondent (Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas) (Utah Code 81-6-203)**

30. **Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$0**. **Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas** receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas** does not have any countable income from any source.
- b. **Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas** is ordered to pay **\$1,000.00** per month in child support for children not part of this case. This amount is subtracted from their gross monthly income for the child support calculation.

31. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas** is **\$0**.

**Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)**

32. It is in the best interest of the children that **Paul A Benites Correa** be ordered to pay child support to **Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas** as follows:

a. **\$662.00** per month base support. This amount complies with the Utah Child Support Act.

33. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.

34. The **joint** custody worksheet was used to calculate child support.

35. The base child support amount using the joint custody calculation is **\$662** per month.

### **Child support reduction for extended parent-time**

36. If a child lives with the non-custodial parent by court order or written agreement of the parties for:

- 25 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 50% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(a)).
- 12 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 25% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(b)).

The custodial parent's normal parent-time and holiday parent-time do not count as an interruption of the consecutive day requirement.

37. If a child receives cash assistance through the T.A.N.F. or F.E.P. programs, any agreement by the parties to reduce child support during extended parent-time must be approved by the Office of Recovery Services.

38. Child support will be paid as follows:

#### **direct deposit cash**

39. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative action.

40. **Paul A Benites Correa** will pay any ORS fees. If **Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas** is the ORS applicant and the fees are withheld from payments to **Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas**, **Paul A Benites Correa** will reimburse **Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas**.

41. The parties must notify each other of any change in their income as follows:

42. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.

### **Dependent children for tax purposes**

43. **Paul A Benites Correa** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes.

### **Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)**

44. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

45. The parent who is able to obtain the most affordable medical, hospital, and dental insurance for the dependent children must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage,

such as CHIP or Medicaid.

- a. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:
  - **Paul A Benites Correa's** insurance will be primary coverage.
  - **Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas's** insurance will be secondary coverage.
- b. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:
  - **Paul A Benites Correa's** spouse's insurance will be primary coverage.
  - **Dayana Lizeth Zuta Arenas's** spouse's insurance will be secondary coverage.
- c. Both parties will equally share the out-of-pocket costs of the insurance premiums.
- d. Both parties will equally share all uninsured and unreimbursed medical and dental expenses that are reasonable and necessary. This includes deductibles, co-insurance, and co-payments paid by a party for the dependent children.
- e. The party who pays health care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and payment within 30 days.
- f. If a party does not follow this order and provide written verification, they may not be able to receive credit for health care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.
- g. On or before January 2 of each year, the party ordered to maintain coverage must provide verification of coverage to the other party, and ORS, if they are involved.
- h. If there is any change in coverage, within 30 days of the change the party ordered to maintain coverage must notify the other party and ORS, if they are involved.

#### Child care expenses (Utah Code 81-6-209)

46. Both parties will equally share all reasonable work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses.

- a. The party who pays child care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and identity of the child care provider. This must be done when a provider is first hired, and any time the other party asks for the information. The party incurring or paying child care expenses must notify the other party of any change of a child care provider or monthly expense. This must be done within 30 calendar days of the change.
- b. The party not directly paying for child care must pay their share of child care expenses as soon as they receive verification of the expenses.
- c. If a party does **not** follow the order and provide written verification, they may not receive credit for work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.



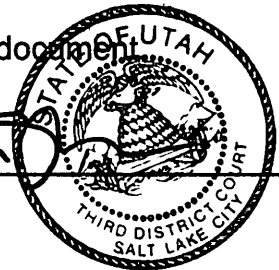
