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THE ABOVE ENTITLED MATTER came before the Court on the Plaintiff's Motion for Summary Judgment. Defendant opposes summary judgment under Rule 56 (c)(2) of the Utah Rule of Civil Procedure, stating that Plaintiff's evidence supporting the motion could not be admissible in evidence. Defendant does not, however, provide an affidavit, declaration, or any evidence that would support his position that the evidence submitted in support of the motion was disputed and inadmissible. The Court finds that the evidence supporting the motion for summary judgment to be admissible and appropriate. It is the responsibility of the party opposing summary judgment to submit admissible evidence or

personal testimony through an affidavit or declaration to demonstrate that there is a genuine issue of material fact. Defendant's response does not provide anything upon which the Court can base a finding that the material facts are disputed. He simply alleges that the evidence provided is confusing or unclear. This argument alone does not create disputed facts.

Therefore, based on the briefing of the parties, the Court finds that there are no genuine issues of material fact and that the Plaintiff is entitled to judgment as a matter of law.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED as follows:

Summary Judgment therefore enters in Plaintiff's favor, against the Defendant, in the principal amount of \$5216.37, collection fee of \$1098.83, interest of \$894.64, court costs of \$230.00 and a reasonable attorney fee of \$350.00 for a judgment total of \$7789.84. Judgment will accrue interest at 13.51% until paid (15-1-4 U.C.A.).
