I say the following:

5. There are no custody, child support, or parent-time cases about **Rosabelle Annie Archuleta** and **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.**'s minor children in any court or government agency. This includes filed, pending, and completed cases.
6. **Rosabelle Annie Archuleta** and **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.** have physical custody of our child(ren), and are the only people who have custody, child support, and parent-time rights to our child(ren).

PARENTING PLAN

This Parenting Plan is being filed in good faith.

This parenting plan is agreed to by **Rosabelle Annie Archuleta** and **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.**

Children - custody

(Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 9, Part 3)

7. It is in the children's best interest that the parties share legal custody, but that primary physical custody be given to each parent as specified below. The non-custodial parent has the right to parent-time at reasonable times and places. **Rosabelle Annie Archuleta** is filing this Parenting Plan with the court and verifies that the plan is being filed in good faith.

- a. **Rosabelle Annie Archuleta**, Petitioner, will have primary custody of **Sarai Laina Archuleta**.
- b. **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.**, Respondent, will have primary custody of **Kamari Belle Archuleta**, **Xandri Leigh Archuleta**.

Parent-time

8. The parents will follow a custom parent-time schedule:

The children will live with each parent as specified below and the other parent will have parent-time according to a custom parent-time schedule. The parent who the children live with will be the "custodial" parent.

- a. **Rosabelle and Timothy have agreed to let the children go between both**

homes freely as they choose. As Kamari and Xandri will reside with Timothy Archuleta, they are free to come and go from Rosabelle Archuleta's residence at any time. Same will go for Sarai who will be living with Rosabelle Archuleta primarily, she will also be able to come and go freely from Timothy Archuleta's residence. The children will be allowed to decide where they would like to spend the holidays EXCEPT in the case of Mother's Day, where all 3 children will spend the night before with Rosabelle Archuleta and return to Timothy Archuleta Mother's Day evening. All 3 children will also spend the night before Father's Day together at Timothy Archuleta's home and will return to Rosabelle Archuleta the evening of Father's Day. All 3 children will then spend December 23rd with Rosabelle Archuleta, beginning in the evening and returning to Timothy Archuleta December 24th in the evening. They will all 3 then spend Christmas Day with Timothy Archuleta. All other holidays and school breaks will be decided upon between the children.

Parent-time for special occasions

9. The parents will follow the schedule for special occasions below. If there is more than one child and the children's school schedules vary for purpose of a holiday, at the option of the parent exercising the holiday or the parent's half of the holiday, the children may remain together for the holiday period beginning the first evening that all children's schools are let out for the holiday and ending the evening before any child returns to school. (Utah Code 81-9-302, 303).

Parent-time transfers

10. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described below:

The parties will make arrangements for pick up, delivery and return of the children prior to each scheduled parent-time.

Curbside transfers

11. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers are made.

Decision-making

12. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

Joint decision-making. The parents will share responsibility for making major decisions about the children. If there is a disagreement, the parents will resolve the dispute as provided in the Resolving disputes section below.

Education plan

13. The school the children will attend is based on a specific plan for where the children will attend school: **their current address.**

14. Rosabelle Annie Archuleta and Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr. has authority to check the children out of school. Rosabelle Annie Archuleta and Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr. has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Rosabelle Annie Archuleta.

Communication with each other

15. Parents will communicate with each other by any method.

Communication with the children

16. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

17. Parents and children may communicate with each other whenever the children choose.

- By any method

18. Other terms about communication with the children: **Both parents will refrain from speaking negatively about the other parent in front of, or to the children. Both parents will also ensure outside parties are not speaking negatively about the other parent while the children are present.**

Records and information sharing

19. Both parents will have access to records and the ability to consult with providers regarding education, child care, and health care.

Travel by the children

20. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.

21. If the children will be travelling for more than 2 days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least 7 days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least 7 days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

22. Other agreements about travel by the children: **If traveling more than 2 days with the children, all plans need to be given to the other parent at the time of planning.**

Child care

23. A child care provider for our children must be:

- A relative, friend, or neighbor.
- Over the age of 18.

Relocation of a parent

24. Neither parent may relocate with the minor children more than 50 miles from their current residence without a written agreement signed by the parties or further court order.

25. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other or the parents live in

separate countries, costs for the children's travel expenses for parent-time will be shared equally.

26. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

27. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

Resolving disputes

28. If the parents need to resolve a dispute regarding the children, they will discuss the issues in good faith and try to reach an agreement based on what is best for their children. If the parents are unable to agree, they will go to the following before bringing the issue to the court:

a. **Mediation**

Changing the plan

This plan remains in effect until changed. A change comes from a modification of a court order.

29. **Rosabelle Annie Archuleta's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$5503**. **Rosabelle Annie Archuleta** receives the following gross monthly income:

30. **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.'s** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$9759**. **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.** receives the following gross monthly income:

31. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.** is **\$0**.

Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)

32. It is in the best interest of the children that be ordered to pay child support to **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.** as follows:

a. **\$0.00** per month base support. This amount complies with the Utah Child Support Act.

33. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support

amount.

34. The **split** custody worksheet was used to calculate child support.

Child support reduction for extended parent-time

35. If a child lives with the non-custodial parent by court order or written agreement of the parties for:

- 25 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 50% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(a)).
- 12 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 25% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(b)).

The custodial parent's normal parent-time and holiday parent-time do not count as an interruption of the consecutive day requirement.

36. If a child receives cash assistance through the T.A.N.F. or F.E.P. programs, any agreement by the parties to reduce child support during extended parent-time must be approved by the Office of Recovery Services.

37. Child support will be paid as follows:

38. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative action.

39. **Rosabelle Annie Archuleta** and **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.** will each pay half of any ORS fee.

- a. If a fee is withheld from payments to **Rosabelle Annie Archuleta**, **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.** will reimburse **Rosabelle Annie Archuleta** for half the fee.
- b. If a fee is withheld from payments to **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.**, **Rosabelle Annie Archuleta** will reimburse **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.** for half the fee.

40. The parties must notify each other of any change in their income as follows:

41. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.

Dependent children for tax purposes

42. As long as **Rosabelle Annie Archuleta** is current on all child support and other court-ordered financial obligations, **Rosabelle Annie Archuleta** may claim the following children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes as allowed by law:

- a. **Sarai Archuleta**

43. As long as **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.** is current on all child support and other court-ordered financial obligations, **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.** may claim the following children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes as allowed by law:

- b. **Kamari and Xandri Archuleta**

44. When there is only one child that can be claimed, the parties will alternate claiming

this child every other year.

Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)

45. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

46. The parent who is able to obtain the most affordable medical, hospital, and dental insurance for the dependent children must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage, such as CHIP or Medicaid.

a. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.'s** insurance will be primary coverage.
- **Rosabelle Annie Archuleta's** insurance will be secondary coverage.

b. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Timothy Levi Archuleta Jr.'s** spouse's insurance will be primary coverage.
- **Rosabelle Annie Archuleta's** spouse's insurance will be secondary coverage.

c. Both parties will equally share the out-of-pocket costs of the insurance premiums.

d. Both parties will equally share all uninsured and unreimbursed medical and dental expenses that are reasonable and necessary. This includes deductibles, co-insurance, and co-payments paid by a party for the dependent children.

e. The party who pays health care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and payment within 30 days.

f. If a party does not follow this order and provide written verification, they may not be able to receive credit for health care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.

g. On or before January 2 of each year, the party ordered to maintain coverage must provide verification of coverage to the other party, and ORS, if they are involved.

h. If there is any change in coverage, within 30 days of the change the party ordered to maintain coverage must notify the other party and ORS, if they are involved.

Child care expenses (Utah Code 81-6-209)
