Based upon the evidence and this Court's Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Court now makes and enters its Decree of Divorce as follows:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED as follows:

1. The Parties are hereby awarded a Decree of Divorce based upon the grounds of irreconcilable differences.

2. There has been born as issue of this marriage three minor children to wit: EZRAH JAMES HAYWARD, a male child, born June, 1, 2022, AURORA CAMILLA HAYWARD, a female child, born June 1, 2022, and AIVUH SOPHIA ALEJANDRA HAYWARD, a female child born August 26, 2015.

3. The parties should be awarded joint legal and physical custody of their minor children, to include extended summer parent-time, and holidays as follows:

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4. Pursuant to Utah Code Ann. § 30-3-10.2 et seq. the parties should adopt the attached Parenting Plan attached hereto as Attachment A.

5. Petitioner is employed at Insulet and earns \$5,832.34 per month. Respondent is self-employed and earns \$3,611.12 per month. The sum of \$200.00 per month should be awarded to the Respondent for the care and maintenance of the parties' minor children in accordance with the Utah Child Support Guidelines commencing upon the entry of a Decree of Divorce. The income, withholding, and other provisions of Utah Code Ann. § 62A-11-401, should apply. Said support should continue until the parties' minor children reaches the age of majority or graduates from high school, whichever is later, and the Court should retain jurisdiction over the issue of child support, with the ability to continue child support until the parties' children reaches the age of twenty-one (21), in the event that the parties' children have special needs which require the continuation of child support.

6. The parties should be obligated to provide medical and dental insurance for the parties' minor children if said insurance is available at a reasonable cost with each party being obligated to pay one-half of said insurance premiums. The Respondent should also provide healthcare coverage. In the event said insurance is not

available or certain expenses are uncompensated, the parties should share equally any uncompensated medical and dental expenses incurred on behalf of the parties' minor children, to include deductibles and co-payments. The Respondent should make available to the other, an insurance card for the minor children. Each party who incurs medical or dental expenses while in custody of the minor children, should provide written verification of the costs and payment of said expenses to the other party within 30 days of payment. The recipient party should then have 30 days to make payment in full for his/her share of the expenses. Failure to comply with these provisions may result in that parent's preclusion from receiving credit for the expenses or recovering the other parent's share of the expenses.

7. The parties should comply with the provisions of Utah Code Ann. § 78B-12-214 and equally share the reasonable work or educational related child care expenses of each party. A parent who incurs child care expenses should provide written verification of the cost of a child care provider within 15 days of incurring the cost. The other party should then have 15 days to pay his or her half of the child care expense.

8. The parties should alternate claiming the minor children as (an) exemption(s) for state and federal tax purposes. Petitioner should be entitled to claim the minor children ren in even years, and Respondent should be entitled to claim the minor children ren in odd years.

9. Both parties are capable of their own support. Therefore, no alimony should be awarded to either party.

10. Personal property which the parties have accumulated during the course of their marriage should be distributed between them as follows:

PETITIONER:

- a. 2014 Mazda CX5, subject to any indebtedness thereon;
- b. 2007 Harley Davidson Sportster, subject to any indebtedness thereon;
- c. PayPal account;
- d. His personal belongings and effects.

RESPONDENT:

- a. Mountain America Credit Union;
- b. Her personal belongings and effects.

11. The debts and obligations which the parties have individually accumulated during the marriage should remain that party's obligation.

12. Each of the parties should be obligated to indemnify and hold the other party harmless from those debts which have been assigned to them above, and should notify their respective creditors of the assignment of debts herein.

13. Each party should pay their own attorney's fees and costs incurred in this action.

14. The Court should order the parties to execute any and all documents of conveyance to effectuate the orders of this Court.
