The parties proffered a stipulation to resolve the issues raised in Devin Patrick Whitehead's divorce petition.

The court has jurisdiction to enter a final divorce decree.

The court accepts the parties' Stipulation and Declaration of Jurisdiction and Grounds for Divorce and enters its findings of fact:

Residency

1. **Devin Patrick Whitehead and Allison Katie Hart** were residents of **Salt Lake County, Utah** on the date this case was filed. **Devin Patrick Whitehead and Allison Katie Hart** were residents for at least 90 days immediately before filing this case.

Marriage

2. **Devin Patrick Whitehead and Allison Katie Hart** were married on **August 31, 2020** in **Sandy, Salt Lake County, UT**.

Grounds and divorce

3. **Devin Patrick Whitehead** asks for a divorce from **Allison Katie Hart** on the grounds of irreconcilable differences. The irreconcilable differences are:

The marriage is irretrievably broken. Although we have attempted to solve our problems and make the marriage work, we have not been able to do so.

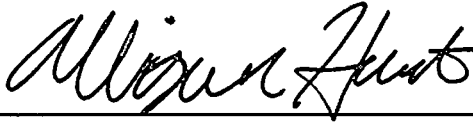
