### Children – Other court proceedings

I say the following:

5. There are no custody, child support, or parent-time cases about **Jennifer Lynn Leslie** and **Garrett Frederick Leslie**'s minor children in any court or government agency. This includes filed, pending, and completed cases.
6. **Jennifer Lynn Leslie** and **Garrett Frederick Leslie** have physical custody of our child(ren), and are the only people who have custody, child support, and parent-time rights to our child(ren).

## PARENTING PLAN

This Parenting Plan is being filed in good faith.

This parenting plan is agreed to by **Jennifer Lynn Leslie** and **Garrett Frederick Leslie**.

### Children - custody

(Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 9, Part 3)

7. It is in the children's best interest that the parties be awarded Joint Legal Custody and that **Jennifer Lynn Leslie** be awarded Sole Physical custody. **Garrett Frederick Leslie** should have parent-time at reasonable times and places. **Jennifer Lynn Leslie** is filing this Parenting Plan and verifies the plan is filed in good faith.

8. The parents will follow a custom parent-time schedule:
  - a. **Garrett Leslie shall have parent-time with the children each Monday from the time school is dismissed until 8:00 p.m. During the summer months when school is not in session, Garrett Leslie shall have parent-time with the children each Monday from 9:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m., unless otherwise agreed upon by the parties. Garrett Leslie shall have parent-time with the children on Fridays from the time school is dismissed until 10:00 p.m. when Jennifer Lynn Leslie is working. During the summer months when school is not in session, parent-time shall occur on Fridays from 9:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m., unless otherwise agreed upon by the parties. On days when Jennifer Lynn Leslie is scheduled to work, Garrett Leslie may exercise additional parent-time with the children from the time school is dismissed until 6:30 p.m., unless otherwise agreed upon by the parties. Jennifer Lynn Leslie supports Garrett Leslie maintaining a meaningful and continuing relationship with the minor children. Jennifer Lynn**

Leslie believes it is important that the children have a healthy relationship with both parents and has consistently encouraged Garrett Leslie's involvement in the children's lives. However, Jennifer Lynn Leslie believes that, at this time, it is in the children's best interests that she be awarded sole physical custody. Garrett Leslie currently does not have stable and appropriate living arrangements necessary to consistently exercise extended or overnight parent-time. In addition, Garrett Leslie has not consistently exercised parent-time with the children, resulting in Jennifer Lynn Leslie being primarily responsible for their day-to-day care, supervision, and financial support. Jennifer Lynn Leslie further believes that continuing parent-time within the marital residence is no longer feasible or in the best interests of the children. Parent-time should occur outside the residence and be focused primarily on the care, supervision, and emotional well-being of the children. Jennifer Lynn Leslie requests that parent-time arrangements be structured in a manner that provides stability, consistency, and appropriate accommodations for the children while preserving Garrett Leslie's opportunity to maintain and strengthen his relationship with them. Upon Garrett Leslie obtaining appropriate and stable living arrangements, Jennifer Lynn Leslie supports the expansion of parent-time, including overnight and weekend parent-time, as appropriate and in the best interests of the children.

#### Parent-time for special occasions

9. The parents will follow the schedule for special occasions below. If there is more than one child and the children's school schedules vary for purpose of a holiday, at the option of the parent exercising the holiday or the parent's half of the holiday, the children may remain together for the holiday period beginning the first evening that all children's schools are let out for the holiday and ending the evening before any child returns to school. (Utah Code 81-9-302, 303).

### Parent-time transfers

10. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described below:

The parties will make arrangements for pick up, delivery and return of the children prior to each scheduled parent-time.

### Curbside transfers

11. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers are made.

### Decision-making

12. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

**Joint decision-making.** The parents will share responsibility for making major decisions about the children. If there is a disagreement, the parents will resolve the dispute as provided in the Resolving disputes section below.

### Education plan

13. The school the children will attend is based on **Jennifer Lynn Leslie's** home residence.

14. Jennifer Lynn Leslie and Garrett Frederick Leslie has authority to check the children out of school. Jennifer Lynn Leslie and Garrett Frederick Leslie has access to the

children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Jennifer Lynn Leslie.

### Communication with each other

15. Parents will communicate with each other by any method.

### Communication with the children

16. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

17. Parents and children may communicate with each other whenever the children choose.

- By any method

18. Other terms about communication with the children: **Neither parent shall monitor, restrict, or interfere with the children's reasonable communication with the other parent, except as necessary to protect the health, safety, or welfare of the children. Neither parent shall disparage the other parent in the presence or hearing of the children, nor shall either parent use the children to convey messages, gather information, or involve the children in disputes between the parties. Each parent shall encourage a positive relationship between the children and the other parent and shall promptly notify the other parent of any significant illness, injury, emergency, or event affecting the health or welfare of the children.**

### Records and information sharing

19. Both parents will have access to records and the ability to consult with providers regarding education, child care, and health care.

### Travel by the children

20. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.

21. If the children will be travelling for more than **3** days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least **10** days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least **2** days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

### Child care

22. A child care provider for our children must be:

23. Other terms about child care: **Child care must be approved beforehand and**

**must give advance notice that Londyn will be in the care of others.**

### **Relocation of a parent (Utah Code 81-9-209)**

24. If either parent moves 150 miles or more from the other, the moving parent must give the non-moving parent a written Notice of Relocation. The notice must be sent at least 60 days before the planned move.

a. The written Notice of Relocation must include:

- Information about the move;
- A proposed parent-time schedule; and
- A statement that the parents will not interfere with the other parent's parent-time.

b. If the moving parent does not give the non-moving parent a Notice of Relocation, the moving parent will be in contempt of the court's order.

25. If either parent lives 150 miles or more away from the other, or if the parents live a different countries, parent-time will be as the parties agree. If they are unable to agree, the following will be the minimum parent-time for the noncustodial parent:

### **Relocation Schedule (Utah Code 81-9-209)**

a. in years ending in odd number, the minor children will spend the following holidays with the noncustodial parent:

i.

(A) fall break if the minor child's school dismisses for fall break, beginning on the day that school dismisses for fall break and ending on the day before school resumes; or  
(B) Labor Day if the minor child's school does not dismiss for a fall break, beginning on the day that school dismisses for Labor Day and ending on the day before school resumes; and

ii. the entire winter break period beginning on the day that school dismisses for the winter break and ending on the day before school resumes;

b. in years ending in an even number, the minor children will spend the following holidays with the noncustodial parent:

i.

(A) spring break, beginning on the day that school dismisses for the spring break and ending on the day before school resumes; or

(B) Presidents' Day if the minor child's school does not dismiss for a spring break, beginning on the day that school dismisses for Presidents' Day and ending on the day before school resumes; and

ii. Thanksgiving, beginning on the day that school dismisses for Thanksgiving and ending on the day before school resumes.

c. extended parent-time equal to half of the summer or off-track time for consecutive weeks with:

i. the noncustodial parent entitled to the first half of the summer or off-track time in

years ending in an odd number; and

ii. the noncustodial parent entitled to the second half of the summer or off-track time in years ending in an even number; and

iii. the noncustodial parent will return the child to the custodial home no later than seven days before school begins. This week will be counted when determining the amount of parent-time to be divided between the parents for the summer or off-track period. The parties will mutually agree on this extended time each year. If they are unable to agree, the noncustodial parent will select the dates for the extended time period.

d. One weekend per month at the option and expense of the noncustodial parent. The noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement is subject to the following restrictions.

i. If the noncustodial parent has not designated a specific weekend for parent-time, the noncustodial parent will receive the last weekend of each month unless a holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on that particular weekend. If a holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on a weekend on which the non-custodial parent normally exercises parent-time, the non-custodial parent is entitled to the weekend before the holiday.

ii. If a noncustodial parent's extended parent-time or parent-time over a holiday extends into or through the first weekend of the next month, that weekend will be considered the noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement for that month.

iii. If a child is out of school for teacher development days or snow days after the children begin the school year, or other days not included in the list of holidays in this Relocation Schedule and those days are contiguous with the noncustodial parent's monthly weekend or holiday parent-time, those days will be included in the weekend or holiday parent-time.

e. The custodial parent is entitled to all parent-time not specifically allocated to the noncustodial parent.

f. In addition to the parent-time for which a non-custodial parent is entitled under the statute, the non-custodial parent is entitled to, at least two times a week:

i. brief telephone contact with the minor child at reasonable hours and for a reasonable duration and

ii. virtual parent-time if the equipment is reasonably available at reasonable hours and for a reasonable duration. If the parties cannot agree whether the equipment is reasonably available, the court shall decide, taking into consideration the best interest of the minor child, each parent's ability to handle any additional expense for virtual parent-time, and any other factors the court considers material.

iii. Virtual parent-time supplements, but does not replace the in-person parent-time the noncustodial parent is entitled to.

26. If either parent lives 150 miles or more away from the other or the parents live in separate countries, costs for the children's travel expenses for parent-time will be paid by

**the parent who moved.**

27. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

28. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

**Resolving disputes**

29. If the parents need to resolve a dispute regarding the children, they will discuss the issues in good faith and try to reach an agreement based on what is best for their children. If the parents are unable to agree, they will go to the following before bringing the issue to the court:

**a. Mediation**

**Changing the plan**

This plan remains in effect until changed. A change comes from a modification of a court order.

## **END OF PARENTING PLAN**

Income: Petitioner (Jennifer Lynn Leslie) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

30. **Jennifer Lynn Leslie's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$3894**. **Jennifer Lynn Leslie** base child support amount using the **sole** custody calculation is **\$789**. **Jennifer Lynn Leslie** receives the following gross monthly income:

Income: Respondent (Garrett Frederick Leslie) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

31. **Garrett Frederick Leslie's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$7500**. **Garrett Frederick Leslie's** base child support amount using the **sole** custody calculation is **\$1531**. **Garrett Frederick Leslie** receives the following gross monthly income:

a. **Garrett Frederick Leslie** is employed at **WML Insurance Agency** and grosses **\$3250** per month. **Garrett Frederick Leslie** is voluntarily underemployed and is capable of working at a job which pays more. Based upon **Garrett Frederick Leslie's** work experience, gross monthly income should be attributed to **Garrett Frederick Leslie** in the amount of **\$7500** per month. (Utah Code 81-6-203)

32. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Garrett Frederick Leslie** is **\$7500**.

**Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)**

33. It is in the best interest of the children that **Garrett Frederick Leslie** be ordered to pay child support to **Jennifer Lynn Leslie** as follows:

a. **\$1,531.00** per month base support. This amount complies with the Utah Child Support Act.

34. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.

35. The **sole** custody worksheet was used to calculate child support.

**Jennifer Lynn Leslie's** base child support amount is **\$789** per month.

**Garrett Frederick Leslie's** base child support amount is **\$1531** per month.

If physical custody of a child changes from what the court orders:

- The parent owing support must pay the support amount to whomever has physical custody of the child.
- The parent must pay the support amount without asking the court to modify the child support order.
- This does not apply to temporary parent-time changes. (Utah Code 81-6-104(4) and 81-6-205(8)(a)).

### **Child support reduction for extended parent-time**

36. If a child lives with the non-custodial parent by court order or written agreement of the parties for:

- 25 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 50% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(a)).
- 12 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 25% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(b)).

The custodial parent's normal parent-time and holiday parent-time do not count as an interruption of the consecutive day requirement.

37. If a child receives cash assistance through the T.A.N.F. or F.E.P. programs, any agreement by the parties to reduce child support during extended parent-time must be approved by the Office of Recovery Services.

38. The person ordered to receive child support can request mandatory income withholding (Utah Code 62A-11 parts 4 and 5). If support is past due, the State of Utah may take federal or state tax refunds or rebates and apply the amounts to the child support owed.

a. Withheld income will be sent to the Office of Recovery Services (ORS) until all past-due support is paid. Child support payments will be sent to:

unless ORS gives notice that payments should be sent elsewhere.

39. If ORS begins mandatory income withholding, child support is due on the first day of each month and will be past due on the first day of the next month.

40. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative action.

41. **Garrett Frederick Leslie** will pay any ORS fees. If **Jennifer Lynn Leslie** is the

ORS applicant and the fees are withheld from payments to **Jennifer Lynn Leslie, Garrett Frederick Leslie** will reimburse **Jennifer Lynn Leslie**.

42. The parties must notify each other within 30 days of any change in their income.

43. The parties can ask to change this child support order by motion after three years from the date of its entry if:

- there is a difference of 10% or more between the amount previously ordered and the new amount of child support under the Utah child support guidelines,
- the difference is not temporary, and
- the amount previously ordered was not a deviation from the child support guidelines.

If the children receive TANF funds at the time an adjustment is sought, ORS will review the order and ask the court to adjust the amount if appropriate. (Utah Code 62A-11-306.2).

44. The parties can ask to change this child support order at any time by petition if there has been a substantial change in circumstances because of material changes in:

- custody;
- the relative wealth or assets of the parties;
- income of a parent of 30% or more;
- the employment potential and ability of a parent to earn;
- the medical needs of the child; or
- the legal responsibilities of either parent for the support of others.

(Utah Code 81-6-202 and 81-6-212)

The change must result in a difference of 15% or more between the amount previously ordered and the new amount of child support under the Utah child support guidelines.

The difference may not be temporary.

The court can consider natural or adoptive children born after the entry of the decree other than those in common to both parties as part of a request to modify an existing award subject to limitations in the law. (Utah Code 81-6-202(8))

45. The parties will do the following for child related support or expenses:

a. The parties shall share equally (50/50) the costs of the children's agreed-upon extracurricular activities and child-related expenses. Such expenses shall include, but are not limited to, registration fees, uniforms, equipment, costumes, musical instruments, team fees, participation fees, tournament fees, travel expenses associated with activities, school fees, class fees, school lunches, yearbooks, field trips, graduation expenses, school pictures, driver's education expenses, tutoring, camps, dances, and other mutually agreed-upon educational, recreational, and enrichment expenses. The parties shall also share equally (50/50) the cost of agreed-upon cell phones and service plans for the minor children, if applicable. Garrett Leslie shall be responsible for paying or reimbursing fifty percent (50%) of such expenses within thirty (30) days of receipt of reasonable documentation. Reimbursement and collection of these expenses may be facilitated through the Utah Office of Recovery Services (ORS), if available.

b. Child support shall continue for each child until the child reaches the age of 21, provided the child is residing at home and actively attending school on a full-time basis. This provision is intended to support the children's continued education and transition into independence.

c. Jennifer Lynn Leslie additionally requests that Garrett Leslie maintain life insurance, if available through employment or otherwise reasonably obtainable, in an amount sufficient to secure ongoing alimony and child support obligations, with Jennifer Lynn Leslie and/or the minor children designated as beneficiaries for so long as such obligations remain in effect.

46. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.

### Dependent children for tax purposes

47. **Jennifer Lynn Leslie** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes.

### Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)

48. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

49. Parents must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage, such as CHIP or Medicaid.

a. Responsibility for child medical and dental expenses will be as follows:

b. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Garrett Frederick Leslie's** insurance will be primary coverage.
- **Jennifer Lynn Leslie's** insurance will be secondary coverage.

c. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Garrett Frederick Leslie's** spouse's insurance will be primary coverage.
- **Jennifer Lynn Leslie's** spouse's insurance will be secondary coverage.

d. Both parties will equally share the out-of-pocket costs of the insurance premiums.

e. Both parties will equally share all uninsured and unreimbursed medical and dental

expenses that are reasonable and necessary. This includes deductibles, co-insurance, and co-payments paid by a party for the dependent children.

f. The party who pays health care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and payment within 30 days.

g. If a party does not follow this order and provide written verification, they may not be able to receive credit for health care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.

h. On or before January 2 of each year, the party ordered to maintain coverage must provide verification of coverage to the other party, and ORS, if they are involved.

i. If there is any change in coverage, within 30 days of the change the party ordered to maintain coverage must notify the other party and ORS, if they are involved.

### Child care expenses (Utah Code 81-6-209)

50. Both parties will equally share all reasonable work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses.

a. The party who pays child care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and identity of the child care provider. This must be done when a provider is first hired, and any time the other party asks for the information. The party incurring or paying child care expenses must notify the other party of any change of a child care provider or monthly expense. This must be done within 30 calendar days of the change.

b. The party not directly paying for child care must pay their share of child care expenses as soon as they receive verification of the expenses.

c. If a party does **not** follow the order and provide written verification, they may not receive credit for work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.

69. **Garrett Frederick Leslie** and **Jennifer Lynn Leslie** have been married for **20** years and **8** months.

70. The value of real property during the marriage is **\$537,200.00**

71. The value of personal property during the marriage is **\$12,500.00**.

72. The court should also consider these other factors: **\*\*Alimony Findings and Agreement\*\*** **Jennifer Lynn Leslie and Garrett Leslie have made good-faith efforts to resolve the issue of alimony without further litigation. The parties acknowledge that Jennifer Lynn Leslie's reasonable financial need exceeds the agreed amount. Garrett Leslie was previously employed in a position earning approximately \$100,000.00 annually, or approximately \$7,500.00 per month gross. Garrett Leslie possesses the education, work experience, and earning capacity to earn at least that amount. Garrett Leslie is currently employed on a part-time basis at the family business and supplements his income by providing rideshare services through Uber. The parties acknowledge that Garrett Leslie is voluntarily underemployed and capable of obtaining full-time employment and earning additional income. After considering the parties' respective incomes, expenses, financial circumstances, and Garrett Leslie's earning capacity, the parties have agreed that Garrett Leslie shall pay alimony to Jennifer Lynn Leslie in the amount of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) per month. The agreed-upon amount**

represents a compromise reached by the parties in an effort to address the Court's concerns regarding ability to pay, avoid further litigation, and bring finality to this matter. Alimony payments shall be collected through the Utah Office of Recovery Services (ORS), and Garrett Leslie shall be responsible for any fees associated with such collection. **\*\*Summary of Revisions\*\*** Jennifer Lynn Leslie and Garrett Leslie have made good-faith efforts to address the concerns previously identified by the Court. The omission of Garrett Leslie's current child support obligation from his monthly expenses in the original documents was inadvertent and resulted from limitations within the MyCase forms. The available field allowed entry only for child support obligations from a previous case and did not provide a field for the child support obligation being established in this action. To address the Court's concerns, the parties have revised the proposed documents to include Garrett Leslie's current child support obligation of \$1,531.00 per month as part of his monthly expenses. This amount is reflected in Garrett Leslie's current reasonable monthly expenses in the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and corresponding Decree of Divorce. The parties have also revised the proposed alimony provisions and income information to accurately reflect Garrett Leslie's earning capacity and supplemental income. These revisions have been made in good faith and in an effort to comply with the Court's prior instructions and bring this matter to a final resolution without further litigation.

#### **Alimony Payment**

73. **Garrett Frederick Leslie will pay Jennifer Lynn Leslie \$1,500.00 in alimony each month.**

74. These are the reasons for this amount: **\*\*Alimony Findings and Payment\*\*** Jennifer Lynn Leslie and Garrett Leslie have made good-faith efforts to resolve the issue of alimony without further litigation. The parties acknowledge that Jennifer Lynn Leslie's reasonable financial need exceeds the agreed amount. Garrett Leslie was previously employed in a position earning approximately \$100,000.00 annually. Garrett Leslie possesses the education, work experience, and earning capacity to earn at least that amount. Rather than pursue full-time employment with stable income and benefits, Garrett Leslie currently works on a part-time basis at the family business and supplements his income through rideshare services provided through Uber. The parties acknowledge that Garrett Leslie is voluntarily underemployed and capable of obtaining additional employment and earning additional income. After considering the parties' respective incomes, expenses, financial circumstances, and Garrett Leslie's earning capacity, the parties have agreed that Garrett Leslie shall pay alimony to Jennifer Lynn Leslie in the amount of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) per month. The agreed-upon amount represents a compromise reached by the parties in an effort to address the Court's concerns regarding ability to pay, avoid further litigation, and bring finality to this matter. Alimony payments shall be collected through the

Utah Office of Recovery Services (ORS), and Garrett Leslie shall be responsible for all fees associated with such collection. **\*\*Summary of Revisions\*\*** Jennifer Lynn Leslie and Garrett Leslie have made good-faith efforts to address the concerns previously identified by the Court. In the original submission, Garrett Leslie's current child support obligation was not reflected as part of his monthly expenses. The omission was inadvertent and resulted from the structure of the MyCase forms. The child support obligation established in this action was listed in the "Other" category rather than under a separate child support expense category, and therefore was not included in the original monthly expense calculations. To address the Court's concerns, the parties have revised the proposed documents to include Garrett Leslie's current child support obligation of \$1,296.00 per month as part of his current reasonable monthly expenses. This amount is now specifically identified within the "Other" category in Garrett Leslie's monthly expense section in the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and the corresponding Decree of Divorce. The parties have also revised the proposed documents to accurately reflect Garrett Leslie's income, earning capacity, and financial obligations. These revisions have been made in good faith and in an effort to comply with the Court's prior instructions and bring this matter to a final resolution without further litigation.

75. Alimony will start the month immediately following entry of the divorce decree.

76. The payment schedule will be:

- one half by the 5th day of each month, and
- the other half by the 20th day of each month.

77. Alimony not paid by the 5th day of the month is past due on the 6th day of the month. Alimony not paid by the 20th day of the month is past due on the 21st day of the month. If the Office of Recovery Services is used to collect child support then ORS may also collect alimony and their payment schedule will be followed.

78. **Garrett Frederick Leslie's** alimony obligation will end the earliest of the following:

- **20** years and **8** months.
- If **Jennifer Lynn Leslie** remarries.

### Retirement money

79. The parties do not need a court order about retirement money.

### Additional provisions

80. The parties will adhere to the following additional provisions:

a.

Additional Provision: **Jennifer Lynn Leslie requests an equitable division of all marital retirement accounts accumulated during the marriage. Jennifer Lynn Leslie specifically requests one-half of the marital portion of Garrett Leslie's 401(k), including any contributions, employer matches, gains, and increases**

accrued during the marriage, together with any associated gains or losses thereon until the date of distribution. Jennifer Lynn Leslie requests that the division of the 401(k) be completed through a Qualified Domestic Relations Order (QDRO), if necessary, to ensure proper distribution of the marital retirement funds.

b.

Additional Provision: **The parties agree that the parties' foreign currency holdings shall be awarded solely to Jennifer Lynn Leslie for the purpose of preserving and protecting the future financial interests and stability of the minor children, including future educational, living, and related expenses. Jennifer Lynn Leslie shall have sole possession and control of such holdings following entry of the Decree of Divorce.**

### Duty to sign documents

81. The parties will sign all documents necessary to comply with the divorce decree within 60 days from entry of the decree. If a party fails to sign a document within 60 days, the other party may ask the court to appoint someone to sign the document. (Utah Rule of Civil Procedure 70)

### Name after divorce

82. **Jennifer Lynn Leslie** changed **her** name when the parties married. **Jennifer Lynn Leslie's** name will be **Jennifer Lynn Wight** after the divorce.

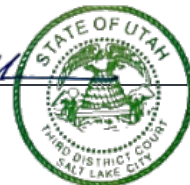
