FINAL DEFAULT JUDGMENT

Pursuant to Rule 55(b)(1) of the Utah Rules of Civil Procedure, the Court hereby enters Judgment in favor of Plaintiff ODK CAPITAL, LLC, against Defendants HARRIS BUSINESS SOLUTIONS, INC. and LINTON HARRIS, jointly and severally, in the principal amount of \$28,970.27, plus pre-judgment interest at the statutory rate of 10% per annum, pursuant to Utah Code § 15-1-1, from September 30, 2025 through June 11, 2026 in the amount of \$2,016.01, attorneys fees in the amount of \$350.00, pursuant to URCP 73(f)(1), as the underlying agreement between the Parties provides for attorneys' fees in the event of default, and in compliance with Rule of Professional Conduct 5.4, for a total judgment of \$31,336.28, plus post-judgment interest at the legal rate of 5.51% from the date of judgment until paid, based on the following:

1. Defendants HARRIS BUSINESS SOLUTIONS, INC. and LINTON HARRIS have failed to appear or otherwise defend in this case;
2. Defendants have been served pursuant to Rule 4(d)(1).

It is further ordered that this judgment MAY be augmented in the amount of post-judgment interest at the legal rate of 5.51%, and reasonable costs and attorneys' fees expended in collecting said judgment by execution or otherwise as shall be established by affidavit, permitted by ruled and/or the law, and approved by the Court.

Defendants HARRIS BUSINESS SOLUTIONS, INC. and LINTON HARRIS are jointly and severally liable for this judgment.
