I say the following:

5. There are no custody, child support, or parent-time cases about **Bailey Lynn Harvey** and **Jeremy Robert Harvey's** minor children in any court or government agency. This includes filed, pending, and completed cases.
6. **Bailey Lynn Harvey** and **Jeremy Robert Harvey** have physical custody of our child(ren), and are the only people who have custody, child support, and parent-time rights to our child(ren).

PARENTING PLAN

This Parenting Plan is being filed in good faith.

This parenting plan is agreed to by **Bailey Lynn Harvey** and **Jeremy Robert Harvey**.

Children - custody

(Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 9, Part 3)

7. It is in the children's best interest that the parties be awarded Joint Legal and Joint Physical Custody. **Bailey Lynn Harvey** is filing this Parenting Plan and verifies the plan is filed in good faith.
8. The children should reside in **Bailey Lynn Harvey's** home **183** overnights each year and in **Jeremy Robert Harvey's** home **182** overnights each year.

The parents will follow a custom parent-time schedule.

- a. **Bailey Lynn Harvey** and **Jeremy Robert Harvey** shall share joint physical custody of the minor children with equal parenting time. The minor children shall be with **Bailey Lynn Harvey** from Monday morning until Wednesday morning. The minor children shall then be with **Jeremy Robert Harvey** from Wednesday morning until Friday morning. The minor children shall return to **Bailey Lynn Harvey** from Friday morning until Saturday at 5:00 PM. The minor children shall then be with **Jeremy Robert Harvey** from Saturday at 5:00 PM until Monday morning. On alternating weeks, the minor children shall stay overnight with **Bailey Lynn Harvey** on Sunday. During those weeks, **Bailey Lynn Harvey's** parenting time shall extend from Sunday evening until

**Wednesday morning, after which the regular schedule shall resume.
Exchanges shall occur at 9:00 AM on exchange days unless otherwise specified, with Saturday exchanges occurring at 5:00 PM.**

Parent-time for special occasions

9. The parents will follow the schedule for special occasions below. If there is more than one child and the children's school schedules vary for purpose of a holiday, at the option of the parent exercising the holiday or the parent's half of the holiday, the children may remain together for the holiday period beginning the first evening that all children's schools are let out for the holiday and ending the evening before any child returns to school. (Utah Code 81-9-302, 303).

Parent-time transfers

10. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described below:

The parties will make arrangements for pick up, delivery and return of the children prior to each scheduled parent-time.

Curbside transfers

11. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers are made.

Decision-making

12. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

Joint decision-making. The parents will share responsibility for making major decisions about the children. If there is a disagreement, the parents will resolve the dispute as provided in the Resolving disputes section below.

Education plan

13. The school the children will attend is based on **Bailey Lynn Harvey's** home residence.

14. Bailey Lynn Harvey and Jeremy Robert Harvey has authority to check the children out of school. Bailey Lynn Harvey and Jeremy Robert Harvey has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Bailey Lynn Harvey.

Communication with each other

15. Parents will communicate with each other by any method.

Communication with the children

16. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents

will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

17. Parents and children may communicate with each other whenever the children choose.

- By any method

18. Other terms about communication with the children: **Each parent shall have reasonable communication with the children during the other parent's scheduled time via phone, video call, or other mutually agreed-upon methods, provided it does not interfere with meals, bedtime, or activities. Communication shall occur at least once per day, and the children shall not be used to relay messages between parents. Emergencies may be communicated immediately.**

Records and information sharing

19. Both parents will have access to records and the ability to consult with providers regarding education, child care, and health care.

Travel by the children

20. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.

21. If the children will be travelling for more than 7 days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least 30 days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least 7 days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

22. Other agreements about travel by the children: **Each parent may travel locally with the children during their scheduled parenting time. For travel outside the local area, the traveling parent shall provide the other parent with at least 7 days' notice, including destination, dates, and contact information. International travel requires at least 30 days' written notice with itinerary, accommodations, and emergency contact information. The traveling parent shall be responsible for transportation unless otherwise agreed. Both parents shall immediately notify the other of any emergencies or significant changes affecting the children during travel.**

Child care

23. A child care provider for our children must be:

A licensed child care provider.

A relative, friend, or neighbor.

Relocation of a parent

24. Neither parent may relocate with the minor children more than 50 miles from their current residence without a written agreement signed by the parties or further court

order.

25. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other or the parents live in separate countries, costs for the children's travel expenses for parent-time will be paid by **the the parent who moved**.

26. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

27. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

Resolving disputes

28. If the parents need to resolve a dispute regarding the children, they will discuss the issues in good faith and try to reach an agreement based on what is best for their children. If the parents are unable to agree, they will go to the following before bringing the issue to the court:

a. **Mediation**

29. Other agreements about resolving disputes:

b. **The parents shall first communicate directly with each other to resolve any issues regarding the children. If the dispute is not resolved, the parents shall participate in private mediation before involving the court. Lawyers may be present if necessary, but the parents shall make every effort to work together for the best interests of the children.**

Changing the plan

This plan remains in effect until changed. A change comes from a modification of a court order.

30. A joint physical custody arrangement may result in denial of cash assistance under the Employment Support Act, Title 35A, Chapter 3, of the Utah Code.

END OF PARENTING PLAN

Income: Petitioner (Bailey Lynn Harvey) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

31. **Bailey Lynn Harvey's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$5667**.

Bailey Lynn Harvey receives the following gross monthly income:

a. **Bailey Lynn Harvey** is employed at **Ogden School District**. **Bailey Lynn Harvey** earns **\$5667** gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.

Income: Respondent (Jeremy Robert Harvey) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

32. **Jeremy Robert Harvey's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is

\$10458. **Jeremy Robert Harvey** receives the following gross monthly income:

a. **Jeremy Robert Harvey** is employed at **Sam's Club**. **Jeremy Robert Harvey** earns

\$10458 gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.

33. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Jeremy Robert Harvey** is **\$10458**.

Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)

34. It is in the best interest of the children that **Jeremy Robert Harvey** be ordered to pay child support to **Bailey Lynn Harvey** as follows:

a. **\$405.00** per month base support. This amount complies with the Utah Child Support Act.

35. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.

36. The **joint** custody worksheet was used to calculate child support.

37. The base child support amount using the joint custody calculation is **\$405** per month.

Child support reduction for extended parent-time

38. If a child lives with the non-custodial parent by court order or written agreement of the parties for:

- 25 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 50% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(a)).
- 12 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 25% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(b)).

The custodial parent's normal parent-time and holiday parent-time do not count as an interruption of the consecutive day requirement.

39. If a child receives cash assistance through the T.A.N.F. or F.E.P. programs, any agreement by the parties to reduce child support during extended parent-time must be approved by the Office of Recovery Services.

40. Child support will be paid as follows:

Jeremy Robert Harvey shall pay child support directly to Bailey Lynn Harvey. The parties shall work together in good faith to determine the method of payment. Any changes or adjustments to child support shall be mutually agreed upon or determined in accordance with applicable law.

41. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative action.

42. **Bailey Lynn Harvey** and **Jeremy Robert Harvey** will each pay half of any ORS fee.

a. If a fee is withheld from payments to **Bailey Lynn Harvey**, **Jeremy Robert Harvey** will reimburse **Bailey Lynn Harvey** for half the fee.

43. The parties must notify each other within 30 days of any change in their income.

44. The parties will do the following for child related support or expenses:

- a. Shared Child Expenses: Both parents will work together to share reasonable child-related expenses such as school supplies, extracurricular activities, clothing, and other necessary costs, discussing major expenses beforehand when possible.
- b. Medical and Insurance Costs: Both parents will cooperate to ensure the children have the best and most affordable health and dental insurance available, and they will fairly share any medical expenses not covered by insurance.
- c. Communication About Financial Needs: Both parents agree to communicate openly and respectfully about the children's financial needs, especially when larger expenses arise.
- d. Review of Support Agreement: The child support arrangement may be reviewed periodically to ensure it continues to meet the children's needs and remains fair to both parents.
- e. Priority of Children's Needs: Both parents agree that the children's well-being and financial stability are the top priority and will work together to support them.
- f. New Expenses as Children Grow: As the children get older, both parents agree to discuss and fairly share new expenses such as school trips, technology for school, sports equipment, or other necessary costs.

45. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.

Dependent children for tax purposes

46. The parents may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes as follows:

47. **Bailey Lynn Harvey** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in odd numbered years. **Jeremy Robert Harvey** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes in even numbered years.

Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)

48. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

49. Parents must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage, such as CHIP or Medicaid.

- a. Responsibility for child medical and dental expenses will be as follows:

- b. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:
- **Jeremy Robert Harvey's** insurance will be primary coverage.
 - **Bailey Lynn Harvey's** insurance will be secondary coverage.
- c. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:
- **Jeremy Robert Harvey's** spouse's insurance will be primary coverage.
 - **Bailey Lynn Harvey's** spouse's insurance will be secondary coverage.
- d. Both parties will equally share the out-of-pocket costs of the insurance premiums.
- e. Both parties will equally share all uninsured and unreimbursed medical and dental expenses that are reasonable and necessary. This includes deductibles, co-insurance, and co-payments paid by a party for the dependent children.
- f. The party who pays health care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and payment within 30 days.
- g. If a party does not follow this order and provide written verification, they may not be able to receive credit for health care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.
- h. On or before January 2 of each year, the party ordered to maintain coverage must provide verification of coverage to the other party, and ORS, if they are involved.
- i. If there is any change in coverage, within 30 days of the change the party ordered to maintain coverage must notify the other party and ORS, if they are involved.

Child care expenses (Utah Code 81-6-209)

50. All reasonable work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses will be paid as follows

If childcare is going to be used, both parents must mutually agree with the cost of childcare and split equally. If one parent disagrees with the childcare, that parent has the right to refuse payment and payment will only be covered by the parent who wants the childcare.

Public assistance statement – Office of Recovery Services (ORS) (Utah Code 81-6-106(2)-(3))

51. Neither party has received or is receiving public assistance from the State of Utah.

Personal property (Utah Code Title 81, Chapters 1, 4, 6, and 9)

52. All personal property not addressed in the divorce should be divided as the parties have already divided it.

Debts

53. The parties are not aware of any debts from the marriage. If any debts exist, each

debt will be the responsibility of the party who incurred the debt.

Real property

54. The parties do not have any real property that is marital property. The parties do not need a court order about real property.

Alimony

55. Neither party will pay alimony.

Retirement money

56. The parties do not need a court order about retirement money.

Additional provisions

57. The parties will adhere to the following additional provisions:

a.

Additional Provision: Both parents agree to support the children's participation in sports and extracurricular activities. Any related costs, such as registration fees, uniforms, equipment, and travel, will be discussed in advance and shared fairly. Both parents will communicate before enrolling the children in activities that require financial or time commitments and will make reasonable efforts to ensure the children attend practices and games during their parenting time while maintaining a respectful and supportive environment.

b.

Additional Provision: If either parent is unable to care for the children during their scheduled parenting time for four (4) hours or more, that parent will first offer the other parent the opportunity to care for the children before arranging for a babysitter, family member, or other childcare provider. Both parents agree to communicate as soon as reasonably possible and make reasonable efforts to accommodate this opportunity.

Duty to sign documents

58. The parties will sign all documents necessary to comply with the divorce decree within 60 days from entry of the decree. If a party fails to sign a document within 60 days, the other party may ask the court to appoint someone to sign the document. (Utah Rule of Civil Procedure 70)
