DECREE OF PATERNITY

This matter was successfully mediated on May 20, 2026.

Petitioner was present with his attorney, Bryce M. Froerer;
Respondent was present with her Licensed Paralegal Practitioner,
Bonnie Morriss; and Christy Carter acted as mediator. The
parties signed a Stipulation that was filed with the Court on
May 21, 2026.

The Court being fully advised in the premises, by virtue of
the law and premises and in accordance with the Facts found and
Conclusions of Law aforesaid, on motion of Bryce M. Froerer, Esq.
and in accordance with the Stipulation and Mediation Agreement of

the parties on file herein, it is hereby **ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED:**

1. Petitioner is the biological father of the minor child, M. Delgado, born July 2010. Respondent is the biological mother of the minor child.

Custody, Parent Time, and Child Support

2. That the parties are hereby awarded the joint legal and joint physical custody of the parties' minor child.

3. That it is hereby ordered that the child shall attend school in Petitioner's school district, currently Bonneville High School, in Weber County.

4. That Respondent is hereby awarded parent-time during the first, second, and last weekends of each month, from Friday at 6 p.m. to Sunday at 7 p.m., provided Respondent is no further away than she is currently.

5. That parent-time exchanges is ordered to occur each Friday evening through Sunday evening, with the parent beginning parent-time responsible for picking up.

6. During the summertime, starting the first full week that school is out, the parties are ordered share custody on a week on/week off schedule with the exchange day being Sunday at 6 p.m. The parent starting their parent time are ordered pick up the child.

7. That the parties are ordered to follow Utah Code Ann. Section 81-9-302 regarding holiday parent-time with the exception of the Thanksgiving and Christmas Day holidays, which will be split equally by the parties as they have historically done in the past. A copy of the holiday schedule is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The Petitioner will be designated as the non-custodial parent for purposes of allocating the holidays; the Respondent will be designated as the custodial parent for allocating the holidays.

8. Further, each party is awarded two weeks of uninterrupted parent-time with the minor child each summer. Petitioner is ordered to select his two-week period first during odd-numbered years, and Respondent

is ordered to select her two-week period first during even-numbered years.

9. That the parties are ordered to equally share any school lunches, school fees, and extracurricular activities that are agreed to in writing.

10. That Respondent is ordered to pay Petitioner child support in the amount of \$175.00 per month beginning June 1, 2026, and continuing until the minor child reaches the age of 18 or graduates from high school with the child's normal graduating class, whichever occurs later.

PARENTING PLAN

11. That the parties are ordered adopt the following Parenting Plan:

a. It is important that the child have a meaningful, loving, caring, nurturing and positive relationship with each parent.

b. Each party will treat the other with respect, and use his or her best efforts to encourage and foster a mutually-loving and bonded relationship between the parent and the child.

c. The parties will respect the child's right to have a meaningful bond with each parent, grandparents and other relatives.

d. As the child's self-esteem is affected by having a positive perception of both parents, the parties will say only positive things about the other parent in the child's presence, emphasizing parental strengths as much as possible, and both parties will refrain from the following and will prevent others from doing so as well: making any disparaging, derogatory, unkind, or demeaning remarks regarding the other in the presence of the child; from vilifying the other parent or saying anything that would cast the other parent in a negative light in the presence of the child; and from doing anything that might impair the parent-child relationship.

e. Both parties are restrained from discussing with the child issues about court, visitation or parent-time, legal issues stemming from the divorce, or from allowing the child to read any

documents pertaining to those issues.

f. The parties will establish and maintain good communication and a cooperative relationship regarding the child and promptly return telephone calls regarding the child.

g. The parties will share information and complaints in a factual and respectful manner.

h. The parties will conduct their communications in a business-like manner without assuming intent, placing blame, or disputing an event that occurred in the past, and should keep their communications productive. If the meetings or communications become heated or overly emotional, the parties will end the discussion and reschedule it for a different time.

i. The parties will not use the child as messengers between them for any purpose whatsoever.

j. The parties will use their best efforts to communicate and share information regarding the

child and keep the other apprised of the events of the child's life.

k. Each party will timely inform the other, within not more than 24 hours of receiving notice, of all community, school, athletic, church activities, or other community functions in which the child is or may be participating, or will be honored, so as to allow both parents the opportunity to attend and participate fully.

l. Both parents are entitled to reasonably participate as a parent in the lives of the child.

m. The parties will advise and exchange information with each other concerning social, religious training, education, health, welfare and medical treatment of the child and, where possible, consult with and consider the other parent's input.

n. Both parties will advise and reasonably consult with each other about non-emergency medical decisions, major or significant decisions that affect the welfare, social, religious

training, and education of the child and reasonably consider the other parent's input.

o. Either parent may make emergency medical decisions regarding the safety of the child.

p. Each party will notify the other party immediately of any health care emergency regarding the child.

q. Day-to-day decisions regarding the care, control, and discipline of the child will be made by the parent with whom the child are with at the time.

r. Both parents will have direct access to the child's school records, and medical/dental/vision records.

s. Each parent will provide the other with their current address, telephone number, e-mail address, and any other virtual parent-time access information within 24 hours of any change.

t. Each parent will permit and encourage the child to have liberal and uncensored communication with the other parent during reasonable hours and

for reasonable durations in the form of telephone, mail, and e-mail.

u. The parties will cooperate regarding special family functions including funerals, weddings, family reunions, religious holidays and activities and other significant events in the child's lives or the life of the parent.

v. The parties will have the child ready for parent time exchanges and will be on time. If a party is going to be late either to pick up or deliver the child, he or she will make contact with the other party to advise of the same.

w. Both parties will protect the child from exposure to inappropriate sexual material, illegal drugs, alcohol and tobacco as such influences are not in the child's best interests.

x. The parents will discuss the child's grades, attendance and discipline problems and reach a consensus whenever possible on parenting strategies as consistent patterns of discipline and reward will allow the child to feel more

secure with both parents.

y. The parties will be courteous and respectful during parent-time exchanges; the parties will not discuss any financial issue or other significant issue during parent-time exchanges.

z. The parties will each have the responsibility during their own parenting times to ensure the child's hygiene and cleanliness, including going to and from exchanges in clean clothing.

aa. For emergency purposes, whenever the child travel with either party, all of the following will be provided to the other party: an itinerary of travel dates; destinations; places where the child can be reached; and the name and telephone number of an available third person who would be knowledgeable of the child's location.

bb. If a dispute arises regarding the minor child or any issue addressed in this Parenting Plan, the parties shall first discuss the issue with one another. If the parties are unable to reach an agreement, they shall consult with an appropriate

professional in the relevant field. If the parties still cannot reach a mutual agreement, they will attend one session of mediation. If they are still unable to reach an agreement, either party may seek court intervention with the Court having the authority to award attorneys fees to the prevailing party. Neither party shall have final decision-making authority.

cc. If either party fails to comply with a provision of this parenting plan, the other parent's obligations hereunder are not affected.

dd. The parties agree to utilize the "Our Family Wizard" App for their communications, calendaring, expenses summary for the minor child. The Petitioner will cover the cost of the App for both parties for the first year. Thereafter, they will each pay their own cost for the App if, by agreement, they determine that it is best to continue its use.

Medical, Dental and Vision Expenses

12. That Petitioner is ordered to cover the minor

child on his plan for medical, dental and vision insurance; Respondent will contribute ½ of the premiums and ½ for any uncovered costs, including premiums in additional payment to the child support amount. Respondent may choose to opt to double cover the minor child, and if she chooses to do so, both parties will pay their own premiums. If there are any out of pocket expenses, the parties will share those expenses equally.

Taxes

13. That Petitioner is awarded the right to claim the minor child as a dependent for income tax purposes in the 2027 and 2028 tax year.

14. That Respondent is awarded the right to claim the minor child as a dependent for income tax purposes in 2026 tax year.

Attorney's Fees

15. That each party pays their own attorney fees associated with this matter.
