PARENTING PLAN

This Parenting Plan is being filed in good faith.

This parenting plan is proposed by **Jazmin Marisol De Leon**.

Children - custody

(Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 9, Part 3)

7. It is in the children's best interest that the parties be awarded Joint Legal and Joint Physical Custody. **Jazmin Marisol De Leon** is filing this Parenting Plan and verifies the plan is filed in good faith.
8. The children should reside in **Jazmin Marisol De Leon**'s home **220** overnights each year and in **Favion Marco Cardenas**'s home **145** overnights each year.
9. The parents will follow the parent-time schedule in the statute(s).

Children 5-18 (expanded schedule) (Utah Code 81-9-303)

Weekday parent-time will be **Friday**. (81-9-303)

On school days: Parent-time begins when school is regularly dismissed and ends the following day upon delivering the child to school, or at 8:30 p.m. the following day if there is no school. (Utah Code 81-9-303)

On days when school is not in session: Parent-time begins at 5:30 p.m. and ends the following day upon delivering the child to school, or at 8:30 p.m. if there is no school. (Utah Code 81-9-303)

Parent-time for special occasions

Parent-time transfers

11. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described below:

The parties will make arrangements for pick up, delivery and return of the children prior to each scheduled parent-time.

Curbside transfers

12. There will not be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a

child may accompany the children to the other parent/person when parent-time transfers are made.

Decision-making

13. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

Sole decision-making.

14. Jazmin Marisol De Leon will make decisions about education.

15. Jazmin Marisol De Leon will make decisions about health care.

16. Jazmin Marisol De Leon will make decisions about religion.

17. Jazmin Marisol De Leon will make decisions about **Appearance of children, haircuts, clothing etc.**

Education plan

18. The school the children will attend is based on **Jazmin Marisol De Leon's** home residence.

19. Jazmin Marisol De Leon and Favion Marco Cardenas has authority to check the children out of school. Jazmin Marisol De Leon and Favion Marco Cardenas has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Jazmin Marisol De Leon.

Communication with each other

20. Parents will communicate with each other by any method.

Communication with the children

21. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

22. Parents and children may communicate with each other whenever the children choose.

- By any method

Records and information sharing

23. Both parents will have access to records and the ability to consult with providers regarding education, child care, and health care.

Travel by the children

24. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.
25. If the children will be travelling for more than **1** days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least **5** days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least **3** days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

Child care

26. A child care provider for our children must be:
- A licensed child care provider.
 - A relative, friend, or neighbor.
 - Over the age of **18**.

Relocation of a parent

27. Neither parent may relocate with the minor children more than **100** miles from their current residence without a written agreement signed by the parties or further court order.
28. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other or the parents live in separate countries, costs for the children's travel expenses for parent-time will be paid by the **the parent who moved**.
29. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.
30. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

Resolving disputes

31. If the parents need to resolve a dispute regarding the children, they will discuss the issues in good faith and try to reach an agreement based on what is best for their children. If the parents are unable to agree, they will go to the following before bringing the issue to the court:
- a. **Mediation**

Changing the plan

32. A joint physical custody arrangement may result in denial of cash assistance under the Employment Support Act, Title 35A, Chapter 3, of the Utah Code.

END OF PARENTING PLAN

Income: Petitioner (Jazmin Marisol De Leon) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

33. **Jazmin Marisol De Leon's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$2769**. **Jazmin Marisol De Leon** receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **Jazmin Marisol De Leon** is employed at **Bridgehouse health llc**. **Jazmin Marisol De Leon** earns **\$2769** gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.

Income: Respondent (Favion Marco Cardenas) (Utah Code 81-6-203)

34. **Favion Marco Cardenas's** gross monthly income for child support purposes is **\$1257**. **Favion Marco Cardenas** receives the following gross monthly income:

- a. **Favion Marco Cardenas** does not have any countable income from any source.
- b. **Favion Marco Cardenas** has no recent work history. The court should consider **Favion Marco Cardenas's** wage to be the federal minimum wage of **\$7.25** an hour. This is a gross monthly income of **\$1257**. (Utah Code 81-6-203(6)(c) and (d))

35. The adjusted gross monthly income for **Favion Marco Cardenas** is **\$1257**.

Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)

36. **Jazmin Marisol De Leon** believes the guideline amount for child support is unjust, inappropriate, or not in the best interest of our children for the following reasons:

I do not know about Favion's current work or his work history but I do know he is currently employed

37. It is in the best interest of the children that **Favion Marco Cardenas** be ordered to pay child support to **Jazmin Marisol De Leon** as follows:

- a. **\$400.00** per month. This deviates from the Utah Uniform Child Support Guidelines.
- b. Unless the Court orders otherwise, support for each child ends when:
 - a child turns 18 or has graduated from high school during the child's normal and expected year of graduation, whichever occurs later, or
 - a child dies, marries, becomes a member of the United States armed forces, or is emancipated (Utah Code 78A-6-801).

38. Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.

39. **Jazmin Marisol De Leon** will give **Favion Marco Cardenas** the information needed to set up direct deposit through **Favion Marco Cardenas's** employer. Once **Favion Marco Cardenas** has the information, **Favion Marco Cardenas** will have **Favion Marco Cardenas's** employer set up direct deposit to an account of **Jazmin Marisol De Leon's** choice. One half of the child support is due by the 5th of each month, and the other half is due by the 20th of each month.

40. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative

action.

41. **Favion Marco Cardenas** will pay any ORS fees. If **Jazmin Marisol De Leon** is the ORS applicant and the fees are withheld from payments to **Jazmin Marisol De Leon**, **Favion Marco Cardenas** will reimburse **Jazmin Marisol De Leon**.

42. The parties must notify each other within 30 days of any change in their income.

43. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.

Dependent children for tax purposes

44. **Jazmin Marisol De Leon** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes.

Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)

45. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

46. Both parents must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage, such as CHIP or Medicaid.

a. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Jazmin Marisol De Leon's** insurance will be primary coverage.
- **Favion Marco Cardenas's** insurance will be secondary coverage.

b. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:

- **Jazmin Marisol De Leon's** spouse's insurance will be primary coverage.
- **Favion Marco Cardenas's** spouse's insurance will be secondary coverage.

c. Both parties will equally share the out-of-pocket costs of the insurance premiums.

d. Both parties will equally share all uninsured and unreimbursed medical and dental expenses that are reasonable and necessary. This includes deductibles, co-insurance, and co-payments paid by a party for the dependent children.

e. The party who pays health care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and payment within 30 days.

f. If a party does not follow this order and provide written verification, they may not be

able to receive credit for health care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.

g. On or before January 2 of each year, the party ordered to maintain coverage must provide verification of coverage to the other party, and ORS, if they are involved.

h. If there is any change in coverage, within 30 days of the change the party ordered to maintain coverage must notify the other party and ORS, if they are involved.

Child care expenses (Utah Code 81-6-209)

47. Both parties will equally share all reasonable work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses.

a. The party who pays child care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and identity of the child care provider. This must be done when a provider is first hired, and any time the other party asks for the information. The party incurring or paying child care expenses must notify the other party of any change of a child care provider or monthly expense. This must be done within 30 calendar days of the change.

b. The party not directly paying for child care must pay their share of child care expenses as soon as they receive verification of the expenses.

c. If a party does **not** follow the order and provide written verification, they may not receive credit for work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.

Public assistance statement – Office of Recovery Services (ORS) (Utah Code 81-6-106(2)-(3))

48. Neither party has received or is receiving public assistance from the State of Utah.

Personal property (Utah Code Title 81, Chapters 1, 4, 6, and 9)
