I say the following:

5. There are no custody, child support, or parent-time cases about **Courtney Marie Jung** and **TaeGyun Jung**'s minor children in any court or government agency. This includes filed, pending, and completed cases.

6. **Courtney Marie Jung** and **TaeGyun Jung** have physical custody of our child(ren), and are the only people who have custody, child support, and parent-time rights to our child(ren).

## **PARENTING PLAN**

This Parenting Plan is being filed in good faith.

This parenting plan is proposed by **Courtney Marie Jung**.

### **Children - custody**

(Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 9, Part 3)

7. It is in the children's best interest that **Courtney Marie Jung** be awarded Sole Legal and Sole Physical custody **TaeGyun Jung** should have parent-time at reasonable times

and places.

The parents will follow a custom parent-time schedule.

a. The minor child, Hanna Jung, will reside full-time with Courtney Jung, who shall have sole legal and sole physical custody of the child. Due to the history of domestic violence, safety concerns, and the international distance between the parties, TaeGyun Jung shall have limited parent-time in the form of digital communication only. Digital parent-time shall occur via Zoom video calls on: Wednesdays and Sundays from 7:00 PM to 8:00 PM Mountain Time, As well as on the child's birthday and major holidays, at 7:00 PM Mountain Time, unless otherwise agreed upon by both parties in writing. All in-person visits with TaeGyun Jung shall be: Supervised at all times, Conducted only within 50 miles of Courtney Jung, And subject to approval by the Court based on the best interest of the child. Digital parent-time shall occur only while Hanna Jung is willing and interested in participating. Neither party shall pressure the child to attend or continue any digital parent-time session. Hanna Jung shall not reside more than 50 miles from Courtney Jung without prior written consent or court approval. This parenting schedule is proposed in the best interests of Hanna Jung, prioritizing her safety, stability, and emotional well-being.

**FOR CHILDREN UNDER 5 MONTHS OF AGE (Utah Code 81-9-304):**

**Weekly:** Three two-hour visits every week in the home of the custodial parent, an established child-care setting, or other environment familiar to the child, unless the parents agree otherwise.

**Holidays:** Two hours on each of the noncustodial parent's holidays indicated below in the Special Occasion table in the home of the custodial parent, an established child-care setting, or other environment familiar to the child, unless the parents agree otherwise.

**FOR CHILDREN 5 MONTHS TO UNDER 9 MONTHS OF AGE:**

**Weekly:** Three three-hour visits every week in the home of the custodial parent, an established child-care setting, or other environment familiar to the child, unless the parents agree otherwise.

**Holidays:** Two hours on each of the noncustodial parent's holidays indicated below in the Special Occasion table in the home of the custodial parent, an established child-care setting, or other environment familiar to the child, unless the parents agree otherwise.

**FOR CHILDREN 9 MONTHS TO UNDER 12 MONTHS OF AGE:**

**Weekly:** One 8 hour visit every week and one 3 hour visit every week.

**Holidays:** Eight hours on each of the noncustodial parent's holidays indicated below in the Special Occasion table, and

**Electronic Communication:** Brief telephone contact and/or virtual parent-time at least two times a week, at reasonable hours and for reasonable duration. Virtual parent time

may be exercised if the equipment is reasonably available and the parents reside at least 100 miles apart, provided that if the parties cannot agree on whether the equipment is reasonably available, the court shall decide whether the equipment for virtual parent-time is reasonably available, taking into consideration the best interest of the child, each parent's ability to handle any additional expenses for virtual parent-time; and any other factors the court considers material.

**FOR CHILDREN 18 MONTHS TO UNDER 3 YEARS OF AGE:**

**Midweek:** One weekday evening from 5:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. to be specified by the noncustodial parent. However, if the child is being cared for during the day outside the child's regular place of residence, the noncustodial parent may, with advance notice to the custodial parent, pick up the child from the caregiver at an earlier time and return the child to the custodial parent by 8:30 p.m.

**Alternate Weekends:** Alternative weekends beginning on the first weekend after the entry of the decree from 6:00 p.m. Friday until 7:00 p.m. Sunday.

**Holiday Parent-time:** Holidays as specified below in the Special Occasion table.

**Extended Parent-time:** Two one-week periods, separated by at least four weeks, at the option of the noncustodial parent;

- a. one week shall be uninterrupted time for the parent granted the extended parent-time;
- b. the remaining week shall be subject to weekday parent-time for the custodial parent on the same day as the parent exercising the extended parent-time has during the other weeks of the year; and
- c. the custodial parent shall have an identical one-week period of uninterrupted time for vacation.

Notification of extended parent-time or vacation weeks with the child shall be provided at least 30 days in advance to the custodial parent.

**Electronic Communication:** Brief telephone contact and/or virtual parent-time at least two times a week, at reasonable hours and for reasonable duration. Virtual parent time may be exercised if the equipment is reasonably available and the parents reside at least 100 miles apart, provided that if the parties cannot agree on whether the equipment is reasonably available, the court shall decide whether the equipment for virtual parent-time is reasonably available, taking into consideration the best interest of the child, each parent's ability to handle any additional expenses for virtual parent-time; and any other factors the court considers material.

**FOR CHILDREN 3 YEARS TO UNDER 5 YEARS OF AGE (81-9-304):**

**Midweek:** One weekday evening from 5:30 - 8:30 p.m. to be specified by the noncustodial parent. However, if the child is being cared for during the day outside the child's regular place of residence, the noncustodial parent may, with advance notice to the custodial parent, pick up the child from the caregiver at an earlier time and return the child to the custodial parent by 8:30 p.m.

**Alternate Weekends:** Alternative weekends beginning on the first weekend after the

entry of the decree from 6:00 p.m. on Friday until 7:00 p.m. on Sunday continuing.

**Holiday Parent-time:** Holidays as specified below in the Special Occasion table.

**Extended Parent-time:** Two two-week periods, separated by at least four weeks, at the option of the noncustodial parent;

a. one two-week period shall be uninterrupted time for the parent granted the extended parent time;

b. the remaining two-week period shall be subject to an equal amount of weekday parent-time that the parent exercising the extended parent-time has during the other weeks of the year; and

c. the custodial parent shall have an identical two-week period of uninterrupted time for vacation.

A parent shall notify the custodial parent at least 30 days in advance of extended parent-time or vacation weeks.

**Electronic Communication:** Brief telephone contact and/or virtual parent-time at least two times a week, at reasonable hours and for reasonable duration. Virtual parent time may be exercised if the equipment is reasonably available and the parents reside at least 100 miles apart, provided that if the parties cannot agree on whether the equipment is reasonably available, the court shall decide whether the equipment for virtual parent-time is reasonably available, taking into consideration the best interest of the child, each parent's ability to handle any additional expenses for virtual parent-time; and any other factors the court considers material.

### Parent-time for special occasions

8. The parents will follow the schedule for special occasions below. If there is more than one child and the children's school schedules vary for purpose of a holiday, at the option of the parent exercising the holiday or the parent's half of the holiday, the children may remain together for the holiday period beginning the first evening that all children's schools are let out for the holiday and ending the evening before any child returns to school. (Utah Code 81-9-302, 303).

#### **Parent-time transfers**

9. Pick-up and drop-off ("transfers") of the children for parent-time will be as described below:

No arrangements can be made at this time for who will pick up, deliver and return the children for parent-time.

#### **Curbside transfers**

(The parent/person picking up or dropping off the children does not leave the vehicle and the other parent/person does not leave the residence.)

10. There will be curbside transfers. The parent/person dropping-off or picking-up a child will remain in the vehicle and the other parent/person will remain in the residence, building, or other vehicle where that other parent/person has been waiting, so that the two parents/persons are never in each other's physical presence.

#### **Decision-making**

11. Each parent will make day-to-day decisions for the children during the time they are caring for the children. Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the children. A parent who makes an emergency decision must share the decision with the other parent as soon as reasonably possible.

#### **Education plan**

12. The school the children will attend is based on Courtney Marie Jung's home

residence.

13. Courtney Marie Jung has authority to check the children out of school. Courtney Marie Jung has access to the children during school. If the parents cannot agree, education decisions will be made by Courtney Marie Jung.

#### Communication with the children

15. The parents agree they will:

- provide age-appropriate help to the children to communicate with the other parent.
- give the children privacy during their communication with the other parent. The parents will not interfere with or monitor communication between the children and the other parent.

16. Parents and children may communicate with each other:

- At any reasonable times:
- Weekends between 07:00 PM and 08:00 PM.
- Holidays between 07:00 PM and 08:00 PM.
- School days 07:00 PM and 08:00 PM.
- School vacation days 07:00 PM and 08:00 PM.
- By telephone  
Parents will maintain voice mail so the children can leave and receive messages.
- By text
- By letter
- By email
- Other communication method: Zoom

#### Records and information sharing

17. Other terms regarding records and information sharing:

**Due to concerns for the child's safety and a history of domestic violence by TaeGyun Jung, only Courtney Jung shall have access to and authority over records and consultation with providers regarding Hanna Jung's education, childcare, and healthcare. TaeGyun Jung shall not contact or consult with any of Hanna Jung's service providers without a court order. If TaeGyun Jung seeks access to specific records, he may submit a formal request through the Court for review and consideration based on the child's best interests.**

### Travel by the children

18. During their parent-time, the parent may consent for the children to travel with a sports team, religious group, school group, relatives, friends, by themselves, or with others.

19. If the children will be travelling for more than 1 days, the parent arranging the travel will notify the other parent at least 14 days in advance. That parent will give the other parent the travel schedule, locations and phone numbers at least 14 days in advance. In case of emergency, the parent will provide as much notice as possible.

20. Other agreements about travel by the children: **The minor child, Hanna Jung, shall not reside or be relocated more than 50 miles from Courtney Jung without the prior written consent of Courtney Jung or a court order. Due to substantiated safety concerns and risk of international abduction, TaeGyun Jung shall not remove the child more than 50 miles from Courtney Jung under any circumstance. All travel plans involving the child must be fully disclosed to Courtney Jung in advance and shall require her prior written consent. Any attempt to travel with the child in violation of this provision shall constitute a violation of this order.**

### Child care

21. A child care provider for our children must be:

A licensed child care provider.

A relative, friend, or neighbor.

Over the age of 21.

Other qualifications: **Female**

### Relocation of a parent

22. Neither parent may relocate with the minor children more than 1 miles from their current residence without a written agreement signed by the parties or further court order.

23. Other terms about relocating: **The minor child, Hanna Jung, shall not be relocated more than 50 miles from the primary custodial parent, Courtney Jung, without her prior written consent or a court order. Any proposed relocation must serve the child's best interest, and written notice must be provided at least 60 days in advance. Due to the history of domestic violence and the risk of international abduction, the child shall not be removed from the United States by TaeGyun Jung under any circumstance. This provision does not restrict the custodial parent, Courtney Jung, from traveling or relocating internationally with the child.**

24. If either parent lives more than 149 miles away from the other or the parents live in separate countries, costs for the children's travel expenses for parent-time will be paid by the parties as follows: **TaeGyun Jung shall be fully responsible for all travel expenses related to parent-time, if any is approved by the Court.**

25. If a parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all support

obligations, and they do not have primary physical care of the child, they will be responsible for the child's related travel expenses.

26. Reimbursement for the child's travel expenses must be made within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.

### Changing the plan

This plan remains in effect until changed. A change comes from a modification of a court order.

## END OF PARENTING PLAN

**Income: Petitioner (Courtney Marie Jung) (Utah Code 81-6-203)**

27. **Courtney Marie Jung's gross monthly income for child support purposes is \$2947. Courtney Marie Jung base child support amount using the sole custody calculation is \$357. Courtney Marie Jung receives the following gross monthly income:**

- a. **Courtney Marie Jung is employed at Whiteclouds. Courtney Marie Jung earns \$2947 gross (pre-tax) monthly income working a 40-hour a week job or less.**

**Income: Respondent (TaeGyun Jung) (Utah Code 81-6-203)**

28. **TaeGyun Jung's gross monthly income for child support purposes is \$4000. TaeGyun Jung receives the following gross monthly income:**

- a. **TaeGyun Jung is employed at Astro English Academy and grosses \$3250 per month. TaeGyun Jung is voluntarily underemployed and is capable of working at a job which pays more. Based upon TaeGyun Jung's work experience, gross monthly income should be attributed to TaeGyun Jung in the amount of \$4000 per month. (Utah Code 81-6-203)**

29. **The adjusted gross monthly income for TaeGyun Jung is \$4000.**

**Child support (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2)**

30. **It is in the best interest of the children that TaeGyun Jung be ordered to pay child support to Courtney Marie Jung as follows:**

- a. **\$493.00 per month base support. This amount complies with the Utah Child Support Act. All dollar amounts in the Child Support Worksheet are shown in USD**

31. **Once a child is no longer eligible to receive child support, the support amount for the eligible children should be recalculated using the child support worksheet (Utah Code Title 81, Chapter 6, Parts 1 and 2). The parties may not divide the base child support award by the number of children and subtract that amount from the prior child support amount.**

32. **The sole custody worksheet was used to calculate child support. Courtney Marie Jung's base child support amount is \$357 per month. TaeGyun Jung's base child support amount is \$493 per month.**

If physical custody of a child changes from what the court orders:

- The parent owing support must pay the support amount to whomever has physical custody of the child.
- The parent must pay the support amount without asking the court to modify the child support order.
- This does not apply to temporary parent-time changes. (Utah Code 81-6-104(4) and 81-6-205(8)(a)).

#### **Child support reduction for extended parent-time**

33. If a child lives with the non-custodial parent by court order or written agreement of the parties for:

- 25 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 50% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(a)).
- 12 of any 30 consecutive days, base child support will be reduced by 25% for each child who lives with the non-custodial parent during that time. (Utah Code 81-6-211(1)(b)).

The custodial parent's normal parent-time and holiday parent-time do not count as an interruption of the consecutive day requirement.

34. If a child receives cash assistance through the T.A.N.F. or F.E.P. programs, any agreement by the parties to reduce child support during extended parent-time must be approved by the Office of Recovery Services.

35. Child support will be paid as follows:

**TaeGyun Jung shall pay child support directly to Courtney Jung via international bank transfer or PayPal on the 1st day of each month. If he chooses another method, it must be approved in writing by Courtney Jung in advance. All payments must be documented with proof of transfer. Payment shall be made in U.S. Dollars based on the monthly support amount ordered by the Court.**

36. The issue of past-due child support may be decided by future court or administrative action.

37. **TaeGyun Jung will pay any ORS fees. If Courtney Marie Jung is the ORS applicant and the fees are withheld from payments to Courtney Marie Jung, TaeGyun Jung will reimburse Courtney Marie Jung.**

38. The parties must notify each other within 30 days of any change in their income.

39. The parties can ask to change this child support order by motion after three years from the date of its entry if:

- there is a difference of 10% or more between the amount previously ordered and the new amount of child support under the Utah child support guidelines,
- the difference is not temporary, and
- the amount previously ordered was not a deviation from the child support guidelines.

If the children receive TANF funds at the time an adjustment is sought, ORS will review the order and ask the court to adjust the amount if appropriate. (Utah Code 62A-11-306.2).

40. The parties can ask to change this child support order at any time by petition if there has been a substantial change in circumstances because of material changes in:

- custody;
- the relative wealth or assets of the parties;
- income of a parent of 30% or more;
- the employment potential and ability of a parent to earn;
- the medical needs of the child; or
- the legal responsibilities of either parent for the support of others.

(Utah Code 81-6-202 and 81-6-212)

The change must result in a difference of 15% or more between the amount previously ordered and the new amount of child support under the Utah child support guidelines.

The difference may not be temporary.

The court can consider natural or adoptive children born after the entry of the decree other than those in common to both parties as part of a request to modify an existing award subject to limitations in the law. (Utah Code 81-6-202(8))

41. The parties will do the following for child related support or expenses:

- a. If TaeGyun Jung fails to pay court-ordered child support for more than 30 days, Courtney Jung may seek enforcement through the Utah Office of Recovery Services (ORS), the Hague Convention, or any other lawful means available. TaeGyun Jung shall immediately notify Courtney Jung and the Court in writing of any change in income, employment status, or address. All child support obligations shall remain enforceable regardless of international residence or relocation.

42. The Office of Recovery Services (<https://ors.utah.gov/>) provides services to individuals who are seeking assistance in the collection or enforcement of child support orders.

### **Dependent children for tax purposes**

43. **Courtney Marie Jung** may claim the parties' children as dependents/exemptions for tax purposes.

### **Child health care (Utah Code 81-6-208)**

44. The parties must provide health care coverage for the medical expenses of the dependent children. Health care coverage means coverage under which medical services are provided to a dependent child through: fee for service, a health maintenance organization, a preferred provider organization, any other type of private health insurance, or public health care coverage. Utah Code 81-6-101(14),

45. Parents must maintain medical, hospital, and dental care insurance for the dependent children if it is available at reasonable cost. If medical insurance is not available at reasonable cost then both parents must ensure the children have health care coverage. This may require applying for public health care coverage, such as CHIP or

**Medicaid.**

- a. Responsibility for child medical and dental expenses will be as follows:
- b. If, at any time, a dependent child is covered by the medical, hospital, or dental insurance plans of both parents, the coverage will be as follows:
  - **Courtney Marie Jung's** insurance will be primary coverage.
  - **TaeGyun Jung's** insurance will be secondary coverage.
- c. If a parent remarries and that parent's dependent child is not covered by that parent's health, hospital, or dental insurance plan but is covered by a step-parent's plan, the coverage will be as follows:
  - **Courtney Marie Jung's** spouse's insurance will be primary coverage.
  - **TaeGyun Jung's** spouse's insurance will be secondary coverage.
- d. Both parties will equally share the out-of-pocket costs of the insurance premiums.
- e. Both parties will equally share all uninsured and unreimbursed medical and dental expenses that are reasonable and necessary. This includes deductibles, co-insurance, and co-payments paid by a party for the dependent children.
- f. The party who pays health care expenses must provide the other party written verification of the cost and payment within 30 days.
- g. If a party does not follow this order and provide written verification, they may not be able to receive credit for health care expenses or recover the other party's share of the expenses.
- h. On or before January 2 of each year, the party ordered to maintain coverage must provide verification of coverage to the other party, and ORS, if they are involved.
- i. If there is any change in coverage, within 30 days of the change the party ordered to maintain coverage must notify the other party and ORS, if they are involved.

**Child care expenses (Utah Code 81-6-209)**

46. All reasonable work, career, or occupational training-related child care expenses will be paid as follows

Courtney Jung currently receives state-assisted childcare, and the out-of-pocket expense is approximately \$104 per month. Until that amount increases or the state assistance ends, Courtney Jung will cover the childcare costs. If the assistance is reduced or terminated in the future, the parties shall reassess the cost and TaeGyun Jung shall contribute a reasonable percentage of the out-of-pocket expenses based on the Court's child support guidelines at that time.

**Public assistance statement – Office of Recovery Services (ORS) (Utah Code 81-6-106(2)-(3))**

47. Neither party has received or is receiving public assistance from the State of Utah.

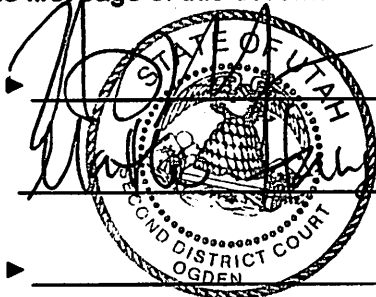
