## MEMORANDUM

To: Judicial Council  
From: Nick Stiles  
Date: September 21, 2021  
Re: 2022 Retention Elections and Compliance with Rule 3-101 Performance Standards

JPEC rule [597-3-4\(2\)](#) provides that “No later than October 1st of the year preceding each general election year, the Judicial Council shall certify to the commission whether each judge standing for retention election in the next general election has satisfied its performance standards.”

[Rule 3-101](#) of the Utah Code of Judicial Administration establishes three performance standards:

- a maximum number of cases under advisement;
- a minimum number of continuing education hours; and
- physical and mental competence.

All of the judges standing for election in 2022 have met those standards. One trial court judge had a case under advisement for longer than six months for reasons not beyond the judge’s personal control. The judge previously submitted an explanation to the Judicial Council in January 2018 which is available for the Council’s review upon request.

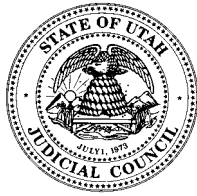

To assess compliance with the performance standards set forth in Rule 3-101 of the Code of Judicial Administration, justice court judges standing for retention in 2022 were asked to complete a self-declaration form. Twenty-nine justice court judges completed the forms, and they have been included in your materials. In reviewing their responses, I noted that several judges indicated in response to Question 8 that they have more than 30 hours of education for the current fiscal year (July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2022).

To confirm that they had read the question correctly, I followed up with each of Judge Doug Whitlock, Judge Jeanne Robison, Judge Lee Edwards, Judge Lyon Hazleton and Judge Matthew Lorz. If they had not, I requested that they provide information responsive to Question 9 by describing their plan to obtain 30 hours in the current year. I asked Judge Clint Gilmore to provide a response to Question 9 as well.

The judges listed above responded to say that they have *not* completed 30 hours of education for the current fiscal year, but each has a plan to obtain 30 hours by June 30, 2022. Like other justice court judges, they intend to participate in the Annual Judicial Conference, the Justice Court Judges' conference in the spring, and other training opportunities offered throughout the year. I will be present in the Council meeting when this item is discussed if you need me to do anything further.
