Overview of the Justice Courts

- 110 Justice Courts
- 76 judges
 - Two vacancies now, four more coming up:
 - Judge Ridge from Utah County
 - Judge Baxter from Salt Lake City
 - Judge Stream from Emery County
 - Judge Bown from Riverton
 - 61 male, 15 female
 - 54 lawyers, 22 non-lawyers
