

1 **Rule 14-413. MCLE credit for qualified audio and video presentations, webcasts,**
2 **computer interactive telephonic programs, writing, lecturing, teaching, public**
3 **service, pro bono service, live attendance.**

4 (a) Credit will be allowed for self-study with Board accredited audio and video
5 presentations, webcasts or computer interactive telephonic programs, writing, lecturing,
6 teaching, public service and pro bono service in accordance with the following.

7
8 (a)(1) One hour of self-study credit will be allowed for viewing and/or listening to 60
9 minutes of audio or video presentations, webcasts or computer interactive telephonic
10 programs in accordance with Rule 14-408(a).

11
12 (a)(2) No more than 12 hours of credit may be obtained through self-study with audio or
13 video presentations, webcasts or computer interactive telephonic programs. Upon
14 application to the Board, the Board may grant a waiver, permitting a lawyer on active
15 status to obtain all required hours of credit through self-study, if the lawyer:

16
17 (a)(2)(A) does not reside in Utah; and

18
19 (a)(2)(B) is engaged in full-time volunteer work for a religious or charitable organization.

21 (b) Credit will be allowed for writing and publishing an article in a legal periodical in
22 accordance with the following.

23
24 (b)(1) To be eligible for any credit, an article must:

25
26 (b)(1)(A) be written to address a lawyer audience;

27
28 (b)(1)(B) be at least 3,000 words in length;

29
30 (b)(1)(C) be published by a recognized publisher of legal material; and

31 (b)(1)(D) not be used in conjunction with a seminar.

33 (b)(2) Three credit hours will be allowed for each 3,000 words in the article. An
34 application for accreditation of the article must be submitted at least 60 days prior to
35 reporting the activity for credit. Two or more authors may share credit obtained pursuant
36 to this paragraph in proportion to their contribution to the article. No more than 12 hours
37 of credit may be obtained through writing and publishing an article or articles.

38 (c) Credit will be allowed for lecturing in an accredited CLE program, part-time teaching
39 by a lawyer in an approved law school, or delivering a paper or speech on a
40 professional subject at a meeting primarily attended by lawyers, legal assistants or law
41 students in accordance with the following.

42 (c)(1) Lecturers in an accredited CLE program and part-time teachers may receive three
43 self-study hours of credit for each hour spent in lecturing or teaching as provided in Rule
44 14-409(a)(1); however, no lecturing or teaching credit is available for participation in
45 panel discussions.

46 (c)(2) Lecturers in a community outreach capacity may receive one hour of self-study
47 credit for each hour spent in lecturing or teaching as provided in Rule 14-409(a)(2),
48 provided such CLE credit does not exceed six (6) hours for a reporting period.

49 (c)(3) Lawyers who serve on an elected or appointed public policy making body may
50 receive one hour of self-study credit for each hour spent serving in such capacity, as
51 provided in Rule 14-409(a)(3), provided such CLE credit does not exceed six (6) hours
52 for a reporting period.

53 (c)(3) No more than 12 hours of self-study credit may be obtained through lecturing,
54 community outreach lecturing, part-time teaching and public service, under Rules 14-
55 409(a)(1), (2) or (3).

56 (d) Credit will be allowed for lecturing and teaching by full-time law school faculty
57 members in accordance with the following.

58 (d)(1) Full-time law school faculty members may receive credit for lecturing and
59 teaching but only for lecturing and teaching accredited CLE courses.

60 (d)(2) No lecturing or teaching credit is available for participation in panel discussions.

61 (d)(3) No more than 12 hours of credit may be obtained through lecturing and teaching
62 by full-time law school faculty members.

63 (e) Credit will be allowed for attendance at an accredited CLE program in accordance
64 with the following.

65 (e)(1) Credit is allowed for attendance at an accredited CLE program in accordance with
66 Rule 14-408(a).

67 (e)(2) A minimum of 12 CLE hours, with no maximum restriction, must be obtained
68 through attendance at live in-person CLE programs.

69 (f) The total of all hours allowable under paragraphs (a), (b) and (d) of this rule may not
70 exceed 12 hours during a reporting period.
